Screenwriter and director Animesh Aich has many notable projects to his credit. He has also impressed the audience with his acting talent. The artiste will be seen in the role of Ranu's husband, Anis, in the muchanticipated film, 'Debi', which is set to hit theatres tomorrow. Aich looks to celebrate Durga Puja alongside the release of the film.

How did you come about the script of Debi?

I was brought into the film on a really short notice. A day or two before the shooting of Debi started, I received a phone call from Jaya Ahsan. She and director Anam Biswas asked me to be a part of the film. I was quite nervous about playing the role of Ranu's husband. There is a sense of immense responsibility that comes with being a part of the film adaptation of a Humayun Ahmed novel, one that I was not ready for. But Jaya Ahsan really believed in my abilities.

Tell us about the first scene that you shot for Debi. I had a haircut and I shaved off my beard before the first day of shooting. I made no preparations as such for the first scene, but everything went pretty smoothly and it was a good experience.

Celebrating Tahsan with five melodious tracks


