Under pressure, BNP men's activities limited

With about two weeks left before the announcement of national polls schedule, the Awami League's election campaign in Rajshahi division goes on in full swing but the picture is quite the opposite for the BNP.

While the ruling AL absolutely dominates in all the eight districts of the division, the opposition party men conduct electioneering on a limited scale, mostly maintaining secrecy.

The curse of Agrabad

Residential area in Ctg experiences waterlogging for decades during high tide; thousands of sufferers still wait for remedy

Some locals now keep boats, not cars, in their garages. Before going out to work, people here always check the tide schedules. During the high tide, businesses come to a grinding halt while students attend classes sitting on high benches as the ground floors of schools go under kneedeep water.

The residents have to readjust their daily life keeping that obvious phenomenon in mind.

This is Agrabad, the port city's oldest residential area, established by Chattogram Development Authority in the early 1960s as an abode for the affluent.
