DEFAMATION CASE Police arrest Mainul from city's Uttara

Barrister Mainul Hosein was arrested last night from JSD (Rab)

chief ASM Abdur Rab's Uttara residence in a defamation case filed with a Rangpur court.

After arresting Mainul, whose recent comment on a female journalist triggered outrage, officials took him to the Detective Branch office on Mintoo Road in the capital.

"There was an arrest warrant against him in a defamation case filed in Rangpur. He was arrested from ASM Abdur Rab's home in Uttara as per the warrant," Mahbub Alam, joint commissioner of DB, told The Daily Star.

DB officials said he will be produced before a Dhaka court today.

They were 'picked up' a day before

Allege families of three of the four whose bullet-hit bodies were found in N'ganj

Three of the four youths found shot dead in Narayanganj on Sunday morning were picked up by detectives from the district's Gausia the previous day, family members claimed after identifying them at a local hospital yesterday.

The dead are Jahirul Islam, 24, Faruk Hossain, 35, and Sabuj Sarder, 24, from Dharmagram village in Pabna Sadar upazila.

Some people identifying themselves as detectives picked up the three along with Jahirul's cousin Liton

Hossain from Faruk's house in Gausia of Bhulta, alleged Faruk's step father Jamal Pramanik.

Liton, who also is from Dharmagram, is still traceless, Jamal told The Daily Star.

Their families, however, have no idea about their links with the other dead, Lutfor Molla, 42, said to be a microbus driver from the capital's Rampura Power House area.

Lutfor's wife Reshma Akter, who identified his body at Narayanganj General Hospital on Sunday, said her husband had been missing since 1:00am SEE PAGE 2 COL 2

'BNP-may-win' AL wary over too hope spurs race for nomination many contenders

The hope that the party may win the election if it is held in a free and fair manner has spurred a large number of BNP leaders to emerge as MP aspirants.

A senior leader close to BNP acting chairman Tarique Rahman said the party had, on an average, about five aspirants in many of the constituencies across the country.

The picture is different in only a few constituencies where BNP bigwigs are likely to run, the leader said wishing anonymity.

"The aspirants believe that this election would be like the one of January 5, 2014 and that if one could manage the party's blessings, one is sure to become a lawmaker," a senior AL leader told The Daily Star on condition of anonymity.


