Ronaldo returns to Theatre of Dreams

Cristiano Ronaldo will always be fondly remembered at Old Trafford, but as the five-time Ballon d'Or winner rolls back into town this week, this former hero may be the last sight

Manchester United want to see. Ronaldo made his name in Manchester, scoring 118 goals, winning three Premier League titles and the first of his five Champions Leagues before a then world record move to Real Madrid.

On Tuesday he returns in the colours of luventus, eager to let his football do the talking with the cloud of a rape accusation in the United States dating back to just before he

made the move to Madrid in 2009 blighting his early days with the Italian giants.

Ronaldo strongly denies the allegation and has been backed by his club, but it remains to be seen if the hero worship afforded to the Portuguese on his last visit to Old Trafford in 2013 is dialled down a little by the United fans.

That night he broke United hearts, none more so than his old mentor Alex Ferguson in what proved to be his last European match in charge with the winning goal in a contentious tie. "It was an unbelievable night, a very emo-

tional night and what the supporters did for me was massive," he said of his reception. Ronaldo, though, has little room for sentiment when it comes to furnishing his

own legacy. Five years ago his mission to was to land Madrid's long-awaited 10th European Cup. It took an extra year, but he eventually did so, as well as an 11th, 12th, and 13th before departing this summer.

Maradona sings Messi's praises

Diego Maradona has reiterated his belief that countryman Lionel Messi is the best player in the world.

The Argentine seemed to take aim at the Barcelona star last weekend, when he appeared to question the way that the 31-year-old is deified.

Maradona, in particular, took aim at Messi's mentality, claiming that he is not a leader.

"Messi's a great player, but he's not a leader," the 1986 World Cup winner was quoted as having said by La Ultima Palabra Mexico. "Let's stop making a God out of Messi. Messi is just another player for Argentina."

Furthermore he was cited as having accused the Barca ace of "going to the bathroom 20 times before a game".

The Dorados head coach, however, has said that his comments were taken out of context and accused the media of driving a wedge between himself and the player he once led as Argentina coach.

"I know who Leo is, I know he's the best player in the world," he said on Sunday. "If I said a player goes to the toilet 20 times before a game, I never named Lionel Messi.

"They want to put me into confrontation with Messi but they cannot. The friendship I have with Lionel is bigger than anything they can write, and I'm saying that he's the greatest in the world."

Messi, however, will have to wait for several weeks to prove his qualities on the field, having sustained a fractured arm during Barcelona's 4-2 victory over Sevilla on Saturday.

It is expected that he will be sidelined for three weeks, and as a consequence he will certainly miss the forthcoming Clasico against Real Madrid. It will be the first time in over a decade that both he and Cristiano Ronaldo, now of Juventus, have both

missed the showpiece event. Messi will also be forced to sit out Barca's Champions League double header with Inter, the first match of which is on Wednesday, while he will also be sidelined for fixtures against Cultrual Leonesa in the Copa del Rey, Rayo Vallecano and potentially Real Betis on November 11.

Barca are top of La Liga by a single point, leading Espanyol and Alaves as the Primera Division has an unfamiliar make up to the podium after nine matches.

Evans to return for MSC?

Bayern buoyed by 'liberating' victory

Bayern Munich travel to Greece to face AEK Athens in the Champions League on Tuesday boosted by a Bundesliga win that "felt like a liberation" after their miserable run of form and a stormy week behind the scenes.

The pressure was mounting on the German champions and new coach Niko Kovac during a fourmatch winless run to the extent that senior club figures including Karl-Heinz Rummenigge and Uli Hoeness launched a stunning attack on the media.

But Saturday's 3-1 win over Wolfsburg, in which Robert Lewandowski scored twice to end a fivegame goal drought, is being hailed as a potential turning point for Bayern's season.

"That felt like a liberation," said centre-back Mats Hummels, while sporting director Hasan Salihamidzic was equally relieved, saying: "We have shown character in a difficult phase."

Rooney propels D.C. United into **MLS Cup playoffs**

Former Manchester United and England Star Wayne Rooney scored twice to push D.C. United to a 3-1 victory over New York City FC and into the MLS Cup playoffs on Sunday.

Rooney opened the scoring in the eighth minute, tapping in his team-leading 11th goal of the season after Luciano Acosta eluded three New York defenders to reach the end line and cut the ball back to Rooney.

Acosta doubled D.C.'s lead in the 24th minute, curling in a strong shot from outside the area. Rooney converted from the penalty spot in the 74th minute after Alex Ring handled the ball in the penalty box.

Ramos rages at Reguilon

Real Madrid youth player Sergio Reguilon probably did not expect such a hostile reaction when he accidentally knocked Sergio Ramos in training yesterday morning.

In a moment that has since been described as 'disgusting' and 'disappointing' the Spanish defender proceeded to take out his frustrations on Reguilon when he was caught on the nose. Footage shows Ramos booting the ball at the 21-year-old left-back not once but twice as teammate Luka Modric later approaches the Madrid captain.



Icardi grabs derby spoils

Captain Mauro Icardi struck a dramatic injury-time winner as Inter Milan stunned AC Milan 1-0 in the derby at the San Siro to retake third place in Serie A on Sunday.

The Argentinian pounced on a mistake by



goalkeeper Gianluigi Donnarumma to nod home in the second minute of added time after an otherwise forgettable match, leaving Gennaro Gattuso's Milan without a win in the last five league derbies.

But Inter continued their recent resurgence under Luciano Spalletti after finishing fourth last term to qualify for the Champions League for the first time since 2011-12, moving to within six

points of leaders Juventus. "I came here to win, not to just sit on a bench for a season and try to bring home a salary," former

Roma coach Spalletti told Sky Sport Italia. "I came here to organise the future of Inter and the players must do the same.

"I liked that after the final whistle, Icardi said we must find consistency and keep pushing. Inter chose us to bring this side back to the level that the fans deserve."

Modest target for boys

Bangladesh under-15 football team will leave for Nepal today to take part in the SAFF U-15 Championship with a

modest target of reaching the semifinals on the back of only 10 weeks of preparation. Bangladesh, who emerged champions

in the 2015 edition at home but finished third in the following edition in Nepal last year, have been pitted against the hosts and Maldives in Group A this time around. Group B features two-time champions India as well as Bhutan and Pakistan.

Bangladesh have qualified for the semifinals in all four previous editions, but managed to move into the final on only one occasion, which was at home in the third edition in Sylhet. This time they have set themselves a rather easy target of reaching the semifinals.

Though girls' teams at age-group can confidently say that their only target is winning the title when taking

part in regional tournaments, boys' teams cannot afford to do so simply because of their short-period training, unlike the round-the-year training provided to the girls.

"Having selected players from an open trial, we started the training camp in Nilphamari with 35 players from August 10. The boys have played a few practice matches among themselves.

We have made them understand how important this tournament is for us and they are aware of their duty. We want to beat Maldives in our first match to ensure the semifinals and then we can think further," head coach Mostafa Anwar Parvez said at a press conference at the BFF House yesterday.

In the last edition, Bangladesh beat

Sri Lanka 4-0 and Bhutan 3-0 in group stages before losing 4-2 against Nepal in the semifinals.

Teams like India, Nepal and Bhutan feature academy players in their squads in age-group tournaments, but Bangladesh still bank on open trials to form squads as there are no national academies or age-group national tournaments here.

"We have done everything that we needed to do for this team. Our technical director Paul Smalley went there [Nilphamari] four times to observe training. The BFF is thinking about keeping this group of boys together even after the completion of the SAFF championship," informed BFF general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag, who however believes there is no need to organsie age-group tournaments to form national age-group teams.

Even though the 32-member squad features four officials and five coaches, there is no room for a physio. The head coach believes he can play the role of a physio with his knowledge of sports science.
