Now in 'cop custody', now found dead

Families claim plainclothes men picked up the 4 victims from home

SANAD SAHA, Narayanganj

Taslima Begum, wife of one of the four found shot dead in Narayanganj, claimed that her husband Faruk Hossain was in the district's Bhulta Police Camp where she had even given him juice, water and a piece of cake on Saturday night.

The next morning, four bodies, including Faruk's, were found. Police, however, maintain that they never picked up any of them.

Contradicting this claim, Taslima said that around noon on Saturday a bus owner, whose name she did not disclose, informed her that Faruk was at the camp.

After she went there, police did not allow her to talk to her husband. "When I wanted to talk to him, the police asked me what I wanted to talk about and that they would shoot if we tried to talk," Taslima told The Daily Star yesterday.

they finally allowed it. I bought cake, and bottles of water and juice around 9:30pm which he took in front of the police. He then asked me to go back home saying nothing will happen to him since he is not accused in any case."

According to her, she went to visit him again the next morning but found nobody there. Worried, she asked a man about Faruk and was told that police had taken five people out of the camp around 3:00am saying they would be taken to court.

Erdogan asks; rejects Saudi account of Khashoggi's killing

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan yesterday said that the "savage murder" of journalist Jamal Khashoggi at the Saudi consulate in Istanbul was meticulously planned, demanding that all those linked to the killing face punishment.

Erdogan had promised that his speech in Ankara would give the "naked truth" about the killing and he gave a host of new details while still saying Turkey wanted answers to key questions, including who gave the orders.

DU finds proof of question leak

Decides to retake the exam, but only for those who passed; date to be announced later

The Dhaka University authorities yesterday decided to retake tests of around 18,500 students who cleared the "Gha" unit admission tests, citing they found proof that the questions were leaked.

The move came 10 days after the authorities had denied the leak following the exam.

The decision was made at a meeting of Deans' Committee held at the vicechancellor's office around noon, DU VC Prof Akhtaruzzaman said at a press conference at his residence later in the day.

World's oldest intact shipwreck found

An ancient Greek trading ship dating back more than 2,400 years has been found virtually intact at the bottom of the Black Sea, the world's oldest known shipwreck, researchers said yesterday.

The vessel is one of more than 60 shipwrecks identified by the Black Sea Maritime Archaeology Project including Roman ships and a 17th-century Cossack raiding fleet.

During the three-year project, researchers used specialist remote deep-water camera systems previously used in offshore oil and gas exploration to map the sea floor.

"A small piece of the vessel has been carbon dated and it is confirmed as the oldest intact shipwreck known to mankind," the project said in a statement. SEE PAGE 10 COL 6
