

### 'Biography of NAZRUL



"Trishal was the first turning point of Nazrul's life. Police officer Rafiqulla of Simla village took 'Dukhu Miah' away from the Asansol bakery, and admitted him in the Darirampur School of Trishal. The National Poet began to study again," said Ferdous Khan. "If this had not happened in Nazrul's life, it could have been different. So, considering the importance of this event, I chose Trishal as the starting point of Biography of Nazrul. After

that we will start shooting at Asansol." The inauguration programme was held at the Nazrul Center of Nampara, Trishal. Former Executive Director of Nazrul Institute, Ikram Uddin Ahmed, and family members of Bichutia Bepari, the foster family of Kazi Nazrul Islam, were present among many others.
