Japan's government yesterday rejected calls from a UN rights expert to halt the return of women and children to areas affected by the Fukushima nuclear disaster over radiation fears.

UN special rapporteur Baskut Tuncak on Thursday warned that people felt they were "being forced to return to areas that are unsafe, including those with radiation levels above what the government previously

considered safe." In the wake of the Fukushima disaster, Japan's government lifted its standard for the acceptable level of radiation to 20 millisieverts per year

# French court orders new probe in Paris bombing case

A French court yesterday ordered a new probe into evidence allegedly linking a Lebanese-Canadian academic to the 1980 deadly bombing of a Paris synagogue before deciding whether to put him on

The October 3, 1980, bombing of a synagogue on 24 Rue Copernic in Paris, which killed four people and injured 46, was the first fatal attack against Jews in France since the Nazi occupation in World War II. Yesterday, the appeals court said it

The form was filled out in the name of Alexander Panadriyu who, investigators believe, was a false identity used by Diab who is currently living in Canada. "The court still has a doubt (...) and it

wants to close all loopholes before reaching a decision," Diab's lawyer William Bourdon said. Diab has always denied involvement,

saying he was taking exams in Beirut at the time of the bombing.

Diab, a former professor of sociology at Ottawa University, was accused of planting the bomb inside the saddle bag of a motorbike parked outside the packed synagogue close to the Champs-Elysees, where hundreds of people had gathered for Sabbath prayers.

Evidence presented against him also included a sketch of the bomber which resembles Diab and the discovery of a passport in his name with entry and exit stamps from Spain, where the bomber is believed to have fled.

There were also testimonies from witnesses that Diab was a member of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP) at the time of the bomb-

### Powerful quake strikes off Greece

A powerful 6.8-magnitude earthquake struck off Greece yesterday and was felt strongly in the tourist hotspot island of Zante, monitoring agencies said.

Electricity in the main town, also called Zante, was down while the fire service reported damage to the road network caused by landslides.

It hit off the southern part of the island also known as Zakynthos, in the Ionian Sea at 1.50 am (2250 GMT Thursday), according to the US Geological Survey (USGS).

"There has been no damage to houses, according to the first reports," a spokesperson for the fire service told AFP. A 12th century Byzantine monument on

a small island near Zante has been severely damaged, local media reported. The earthquake was also felt on main-

land Greece, including in the western town of Pyrgos. USGS said the quake, which struck at a depth of 16.6 kilometres (10 miles), was

preceded by a shake of 5.0 and followed by a series of smaller aftershocks. It said there was a low likelihood of

The Athens earthquake observatory said the tremor was felt strongly in Zante, a popular holiday destination with its

own international airport. Greece lies on major fault lines and is regularly hit by earthquakes, but they rarely

cause casualties. However, in July 2017 a magnitude 6.7 earthquake killed two people on the island of Kos in the Aegean sea, causing significant damage.

Zante island experienced a major earthquake in 1953 of 6.4, killing hundreds of victims and injuring thousands, leaving the island in ruins.

arrested and five senior government officials have been sacked as part of the investigation. Prince Mohammed, Riyadh's de facto ruler who casts himself as a reformer, has said the killers will be brought to justice. Erdogan said he had spoken with

Prince Mohammed. "I also told the crown prince. I said, 'You know how to make people talk. Whatever happened between these 18 people, this dodgy business is among them. If you are determined to lift suspicion, then the key point of our cooperation is these 18 people."

#### WEST MULLS REPERCUSSIONS

How Western allies deal with Riyadh will hinge on the extent to which they believe responsibility for Khashoggi's death lies directly with Prince Mohammed and the Saudi authorities.

The stakes are high. Saudi Arabia is the lynchpin of a US-backed regional alliance against Iran but the outcry over the murder has strained Riyadh's relations with the West. Dozens of Western officials, bankers and executives boycotted a major investment conference in Riyadh this week.

Erdogan also said Saudi Arabia's public prosecutor was due in Istanbul on Sunday to meets its regional chief prosecutor.

"Of course, we have other information; documents, but there is no need to be too hasty," said Erdogan, who previously described Khashoggi's demise as a "savage killing" and demanded Riyadh punish those responsible, no matter

how highly placed.

On Thursday, Saudi state television quoted the Saudi public prosecutor as saying the killing had been planned in advance and that suspects were being interrogated on the basis of information provided by a joint Saudi-Turkish task force.

Turkish officials suspect Saudi security agents killed Khashoggi, 59, inside the consulate and dismembered his body. Turkish sources say authorities have an audio recording purportedly documenting the murder.

Pro-government Turkish newspaper Yeni Safak, citing the audio, reported that Saudi agents cut off his fingers during an interrogation and later

beheaded him. CIA DIRECTOR BRIEFS TRUMP

US CIA Director Gina Haspel heard an audio of the killing during a visit to Turkey this week, sources told Reuters, and she briefed President Donald Trump about Turkey's findings and her discussions after her return to Washington on Thursday.

It remains unclear what can be heard in the audio. Officials from the CIA and Turkish intelligence declined to com-

### Floods kill six in southern Russia

Six people died in floods in southern Russia which also damaged regional infrastructure including an oil pipeline, authorities said yesterday, as emergency workers were struggling to provide food and water to the victims.

said it had recovered the bodies of six people while clearing rubble and two people were hospitalised. Kremlin spokesman Dmitry

Peskov told journalists that all the government services are "working in emergency mode" to battle the "ruthless elements." The emergencies ministry said over 2,300 houses were

flooded in the region.

Flash floods frequently cause devastating damage in the area wedged between the Black Sea and the Caucasus mountain range as mountain rivers swell and destroy settlements below. Similar floods in 2012 killed

over 150 people around Krymsk, another town in the region. A regional subsidiary of Russian oil transport company Transneft said Friday that the

flash floods and resulting landslides "damaged a pipeline" in the region's Tuapse district causing "a spill of five cubic metres of oil." The company is working to keep the oil from getting into the Tuapse river, a major source

of water for the town of Tuapse, home to over 60,000 people. The floods also damaged a major railway line and roads, authorities said. Russian

Railways, the country's rail monopoly, said Thursday that 31 passenger trains were stopped due to the damage, and passengers were being bussed to the nearest stations to continue their journeys.
