Prothom Alo-SCB coding contest crowns winners

Some 122 teams of school- and college-level computer programmers put their heads down yesterday at the University of Asia Pacific (UAP), in a battle for coding supremacy.

Eventually, team Too Slow, from BCIC College emerged victors in the school level, with Team CCS from Chittagong Collegiate School coming in second. At the college level, Notre Dame College squad NDC Night King became champions, ahead of Submit DC from Dhaka College.

With the slogan "Code Bhanga Jobab Dao", Bangla daily Prothom Alo and Standard Chartered Bank jointly organised the nationwide competition's final stage, with a view to increasing the interest of school and college students in computer programming and assessing their skills.

A total of 582 teams registered online from the competition.

Bangladeshi judge at the International Collegiate programming contest (ACM-ICPC), inaugurated the competition.

Speaking as chief guest at the closing ceremony, UAP Vice Chancellor and National Professor Jamilur Reza Choudhury said it was difficult to arrange computers for the 48 contestants when the first university-level programming competition was held in the country in 1998. He said it was heartening to see a large number of school and college teams at the event.

In his speech, Prothom Alo Editor Matiur Rahman said, "We want to see Bangaldesh's victory in every sector. Programming and coding can play a big role in this."

5 held with 18,000 yaba pills in capital

Detectives arrested five alleged drug traders and recovered 18,000 yaba pills from Mirpur area of the city on Thursday night.

The arrestees are Nurul Amin, 35; Abdul Aziz, 27; Md Rafique Uddin, 31, a truck driver; Md Giasuddin, 37; and Abdur Shukur, 32.

Based on a tip-off, a team of Detective Branch (DB) of Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) conducted a drive in Mazar Road area under Darus Salam Police Station around 10:30pm.

During the raid, the detectives searched a truck that was parked near Dhanshiri Restaurant, said DMP Deputy Commissioner (Media) Masudur Rahman yesterday.

They recovered 18,000 pills from the truck and arrested the five in connection with it, he

58 ARRESTED IN 24HRS

As part of the ongoing anti-narcotics drive in the capital, DMP arrested 58 people on charges of selling and consuming drugs in 24 hours till 6:00am yesterday.

DB, in association with local police stations, carried out the simultaneous drive starting at 6:00am on Thursday.

A total of 18,470 yaba tablets, 1,185 packets containing around 1.05kg heroin, 1.65kg marijuana, 90 bottles of phensidyl and 475 ampoules of sedative injections were recovered from the arrestees' possession, said DMP Deputy Commissioner (Media) Masudur Rahman.

Some 39 cases were filed with different police stations under the Narcotics Control Act over the arrests and drug recovery, he said.

RAJSHAHI-GOPALGANJ ROUTE Railway launches 'Tungipara Express'

The west zone of Bangladesh Railway has launched "Tungipara Express" on Rajshahi-Gopalganj route for convenience of passengers.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina inaugurated the service through a videoconference on Thursday.

For the first time, the intercity train left Rajshahi station at 3:00pm yesterday for Gopalganj. Rajshahi City Corporation Mayor AHM Khairuzzaman Liton and railway high officials were present at the station on the occasion.

Earlier at 1:30pm, the train reached Rajshahi via Ishwardi junction after it left Gobra Railway Station in Gopalganj at 6:45am, making a 256-kilometre journey in six hours.

Golam Mostofa, station superintendent, told the news agency that the train will run on the route every day except for Monday and Tuesday.

The zone has constructed a 55km new railway track from Kasiani to Tungipara via Gopalganj and renovated another 82km line from Kalukhali to Bhatiapara with a total cost of around Tk 1,101.33 crore. There are 14 stations and 120 bridges on the route, said Executive Engineer Mustafizur

Rahman. He said the west zone has been implementing four mega projects at a cost of around Tk 1,829.76 crore aiming at bringing dynamism in the railway transportation along

with boosting quality of services. At present, the zone, covering Rajshahi, Rangpur and Khulna divisions, has been operating 133 trains, including 42 intercity, on different routes including the capital.

Forty-seven local or shuttle and 46 commuter or mail trains are also being operated on various routes.
