

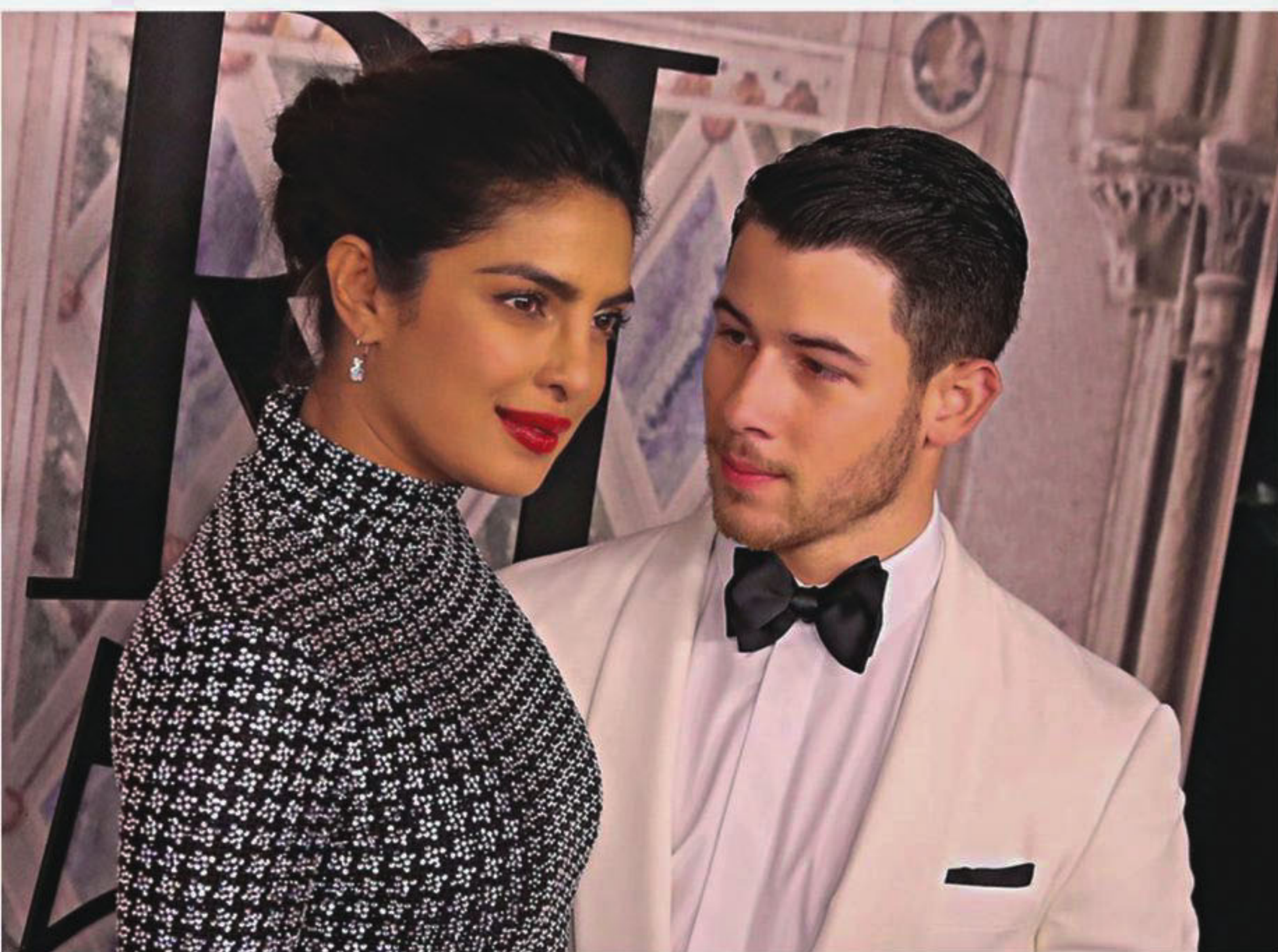


GOODBYE CAPTAIN SPARROW
