### Rohingya girl killed in Teknaf

A teenage Rohingya girl, who was adopted by a Bangladeshi family, was killed at her house in Teknaf upazila on Friday night.

Asma Akhter, 16, and her father Sharif Uddin were residents of Balukhali Rohingya camp.

Locals said Saudi expatriate Syed Alam's wife Hasina Akhter was also seriously injured in the attack.

Hasina and her adopted daughter Asma lived in their house at

Chakmarkul under Hoaikkong union. Unidentified assailants entered the house around 9:00pm and stabbed the mother and daughter several

times before fleeing. Hearing their screams, their relative Shahina Akhter shouted for help. Locals came to the scene and rushed

the two to an NGO-run hospital in Goyalmara area in Ukhia upazila where doctors declared Asma dead. Critically injured Hasina is undergoing treatment at the hospital. Alam and Hasina's only child Asma was a student

at a residential madrasa in Cox's Bazar. On information, Additional Superintendent of Police (Ukhia Circle) Nahid Adnan Tahian along with other officials visited the spot.

Asma's body was sent to Cox's Bazar Sadar Hospital, police said. "We are investigating," he added.

gemologist, said there's been increasing interest in Zambia's emeralds, particularly from dealers in Europe. "We are experiencing strikingly

increased demand for high-quality Zambian emeralds from the major brands, particularly in Europe, all of whom admire the rich color and unique transparency of our gems -qualities that make them unique among emeralds," Basaglia said.

The gem is not the largest emerald stone to have been found in the company's mines. In 2010, miners at the Zambia-based operation found a 6,225-carat emerald they named the "elephant" due to its massive size.

Khashoggi's dismembered body was "dissolved" in the consulate as part of an effort to leave no trace of the killing.

"Over the course of the past month, Turkey has moved heaven and earth to shed light on all aspects of this case. As a result of our efforts, the world has learned that Khashoggi was killed in cold blood by a death squad, and it has been established that his murder was premeditated," Erdogan wrote in The Post.

"We know that the perpetrators are among the 18 suspects detained in Saudi Arabia. We also know that those individuals came to carry out their orders: Kill Khashoggi and leave. Finally, we know that the order to kill Khashoggi came from the highest levels of the Saudi government."

But he said his government would keep asking other questions "the Saudi authorities have refused to answer", such as the whereabouts of Khashoggi's body and who ordered his assassination.

The murder of the royal insiderturned-dissident has provoked widespread outrage and sharp criticism from Washington, usually the staunchest of allies.

While President Donald Trump has ruled out halting arms deal with Riyadh as a punishment, his administration has effectively withdrawn support for the Saudi-led coalition's war in Yemen in a stark illustration of the cooling of ties.

Addressing mourners at a memorial service in Washington on Friday, the murdered journalist's fiancee called on Trump to back Turkey's efforts to investigate his death.

"I would like to send this message to Mr Trump: I would like him to support Turkey's legal efforts in trying to bring light to the situation and to

discover the whereabouts of his body," Hatice Cengiz said in a recorded message. Turkey's chief prosecutor said this week

that Khashoggi was strangled as soon as he entered the consulate and also confirmed the body was dismembered.

Yasin Aktay, an advisor to Erdogan, hinted in an article published on Friday that the body may even have

been destroyed in acid. "We now see that it wasn't just cut

up, they got rid of the body by dissolving it," an official in Turkey's ruling party, he told the Hurriyet newspaper.

"According to the latest information we have, the reason they cut up

the body is it was easier to dissolve it.' A Turkish official has previously told The Post that "biological evidence" found in the consulate garden

indicated the body was likely disposed of near the murder scene. Saudi authorities have denied Turkish police permission to search a

well in the garden, but allowed them to take water samples for analysis, according to local reports. The murder has strained the

decades-old alliance between the United States and Saudi Arabia, with Trump calling it "one of the worst

cover-ups in history".

# Diver dies in search for Indonesia jet crash dead

An Indonesian diver died while recovering body parts from the ill-fated Lion Air plane which crashed into the sea killing 189 people, an official said yesterday.

Syachrul Anto, 48, who died on Friday, was part of the team searching for body parts and debris from the jet in the Java Sea. "He was a volunteer with the Search

and Rescue Agency," Isswarto, commander of the Indonesian navy's search and rescue division, told AFP.

It is believed he died from decompression. "He was found by the SAR team,

fainted. He was treated by our doctors, after he regained consciousness, we sent him to the chamber for decompression. "We have all the equipment, however God's will says differently,"

national search and rescue agency head Muhammad Syaugi said at a press conference. Anto had previously served in Palu

which suffered an earthquake and

tsunami in September and was also involved in recovering the bodies and debris from an Air Asia plane crash nearly four years ago.

The Lion Air plane which crashed Monday was en route from Jakarta to Pangkal Pinang city on Sumatra island.

It plunged into the water just minutes after takeoff, killing everyone on board. At least 73 bags containing body

parts have been retrieved from the waters so far but only four victims have been identified. Officials on Thursday retrieved the

flight data recorder but are still searching for the second black box, the cockpit voice recorder, which could answer the question as to why the brand new Boeing-737 MAX 8 crashed.

"We have heard a weak 'ping' ... the divers are still searching for it," Syaugi said.

Two days after the flight data recorder was recovered, investigators at Indonesia's national transportation safety committee have yet to download the key data due to salt residue on the memory card.

highest taxpayer in this category.

journalists were on the previous year's list. Late Samakal editor Golam Sarwar was among the five journalists. This time, he has been replaced by Naem Nizam. A National Board of Revenue notifi-

cation issued on Thursday revealed the names of 141 top taxpayers, including individuals and organisations, for fiscal 2017-18. The move was made as per the National Tax Card Policy, 2010 (amended). The NBR would honour them with

tax cards likely on November 12, said one of its officials.

Tax cards would be handed over to individuals in two categories -- "special category" and "source of income or profession", according to the notification. Senior citizens, gazetted warwounded freedom fighters and individuals under 40 are included in the "special category" while Businessmen, doctors, journalists, lawyers, engineers, architects, accountants, new taxpayers, players, actors, artists and others are included in "source of income or profession" category.

The NBR has been awarding tax

cards to top taxpayers in separate categories for the last three years. Four of the five highest taxpaying Mahfuz Anam and Matiur Rahman were among the top taxpayers in 2016 and 2017. Transcraft Ltd, Mediaworld Ltd and Mediastar were also highest taxpayers in print and electronic media category in those two years.

Meanwhile, Transcom Beverage of Transcom Group has been named as top taxpayer as a company in "Food and others" category. The other two companies who made it to the list are Nestlé Bangladesh and Olympic industries.

Like previous years, the NBR has published the names of top taxpayers at city corporation and district levels and those of the top female and young taxpayers. Latifur Rahman, chairman and chief executive officer of Transcom Group, has been named one of the highest taxpayers in Dhaka city corporation area.

Last year, the NBR honoured Latifur Rahman's family with the title of "Kar Bahadur Paribar" or tax icons family for paying big amounts of tax with exemplary compliance for a long time. This time, no new family, however, was given the title.

"We will send a letter to the prime minister tomorrow morning [this morning], requesting her to hold a small-scale dialogue with us," BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir said after emerging from a meeting at Kamal's chamber in the capital's Motijheel.

However, Awami League General Secretary Obaidul Quader has ruled out the possibility of holding talks with political parties after November

"We would not hold any talks after November 7. It would not be possible to hold dialogues for long as the election schedule will have been announced by then," Quader told reporters at Dhanmondi 32 yesterday.

As many as 85 political parties wrote to the prime minister seeking time to hold talks about the 11th parliamentary election, he said, adding that it may not be possible to sit with all the parties.

EC Secretary Helaluddin Ahmed said Oikyafront's letter would be placed at the Commission meeting today.

"We are hopeful about announcing the election schedule within this week. The Election Commission wants to hold the election by December," he told reporters after a meeting on polls

preparation at the Nirbachon Bhaban. CEC KM Nurul Huda, the four other election commissioners and high officials of the EC were present at the meeting.

The ongoing talks with political parties began after Kamal, also president of the Gonoforum, wrote to the PM for holding a dialogue, to which the PM responded positively. Later, other political parties began requesting the PM to sit with them as well.

So far, the 14-party ruling alliance sat with the Oikyafront, which includes the BNP and several other parties; and the Juktafront, led by former president Prof AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury.

The ruling alliance leaders will sit for talks among themselves at the Gono Bhaban tonight, while they will hold talks with the Jatiya Party tomorrow at the same venue.

The 14-party will also sit with Islamist and leftist parties, Quader said.

After the much-hyped dialogue

with the Oikyafront on November 1, Quader had assured the opposition alliance of holding further talks to find

a solution to the political crisis over the upcoming national election. At the talks, the Oikyafront had placed a seven-point demand, including formation of a polls-time govern-

ment, dissolution of parliament

before the announcement of the election schedule, reconstitution of the Election Commission and deployment of army during election with magistracy power.

Although the talks were held in a congenial atmosphere, the PM gave no assurance that the government would meet Oikyafront's demands except for the one for holding rallies without police obstruction.

Asked about BNP's dissatisfaction at the outcome, Quader yesterday said, "It is not possible to make everyone happy. The BNP may have expressed dissatisfaction, but the leader of their alliance [Dr Kamal] has termed it fruitful."

Meanwhile, Nagorik Oikya Convener Mahmudur Rahman Manna blasted the government for its decision to hold talks with the components of the 14-party.

"They are your advisers. You talk to them daily. They are the opposition leaders. You meet them at parliament and talk with them outside parliament. Then why do you need to hold dialogues with them?" said Manna, also a leader of the Oikyafront.

In another development, Mirza Fakhrul has been made spokesperson of the Oikyafront while Gonoforum General Secretary Mustafa Mohsin Montu its coordinator.

LETTER TO CEC

Rafiqul Islam Pathik, Gonoforum training affairs secretary, handed the letter to an EC official at the Commission around 4:45pm.

The CEC and other election commissioners were holding a closed-door meeting at the time.

In the letter, Kamal Hossain mentioned Obaidul Quader's remarks that the PM would consider sitting with the Oikyafront again after November 8.

"The Jatiya Oikyafront is willing to sit for talks with the honourable prime minister again." It added: "You [EC] are aware of the

dialogue with the prime minister.... Under the circumstances, we think it is better for you not to make the decision about the announcement of the election schedule until the ongoing political process, especially the talks with

the prime minister, is over." The eminent jurist also noted that political parties and candidates were key stakeholders in any election and that it was a fundamental responsibility of the EC to take their activities into

consideration. "We firmly believe that the trust of the political parties and the people on the Election Commission will increase if the Election Commission waits a little more before announcing the election schedule," it added.
