Admission tests at public schools of Dhaka after polls

The government is set to reschedule admission tests of public schools of the capital, after the 11th parliamentary election to be held on December 23.

Directorate of Secondary and Higher Education (DSHE) officials preparing guidelines for the admission test said they are thinking about holding the admission tests between December 26 and 30.

Government secondary schools in Dhaka will be divided into three categories -- A, B and C -- on the basis of their locations.

Distribution of forms for admission in the government schools in the capital will begin on December 1 and will continue till December 13.

About 75,700 aspiring students applied for 10,230 seats in 35 government schools of the city last year.

The draft guideline for admission tests of 38 government schools had originally proposed exam dates of December 17, 18 and 19, said a DSHE director.

"We will need to reschedule the admission test due to the election," DSHE Director Prof Abdul Mannan told The Daily Star.

Public Health Facilities in Hard-to-Reach Areas

New study finds dismal state of nutritional services

A new study has found dismal state of nutritional services at public health facilities in the country's hard-toreach areas -- something that goes against the principle of inclusive development.

For example, no pregnant woman or children under five years had their weight or height measured at upazilaand union-level health facilities in haor (wetlands) areas of the country, though it is a must to assess nutritional status, says the study.

The study, titled "Situation analysis and needs assessment for nutrition services in hard-to-reach areas in Bangladesh" was conducted by the Department of Public Health and Informatics of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU)

between February and September this year. National Nutrition Services (NNS) commissioned the study that was presented at BSMMU yesterday.

Only 33 percent mothers of children under the age of five were provided calcium, iron and folic acid, while vitamin A was provided to only 18 percent children under five in the haor areas, the study said.

The study covered 15 upazila health complexes (UHC) and 14 union sub-centers (USC) in 11 districts -- Kurigram, Sirajganj, Bagerhat, Khulna, Kishoreganj, Sunamganj, Netrokona, Rangamati, Bhola, Cox's Bazar and Noakhali -- all of them localities on haor, char, hills, coast or

According to the study, 64 percent of the public health facilities of these areas have Integrated Management of

Childhood Illness and Nutrition; 52 percent have antenatal care corners; 38 percent have breastfeeding corners and only 14 percent of the facilities have adolescent corners.

"These facilities don't have skilled manpower or logistics. Whatever is available is not properly utilised," said Dr M Khalequzzaman, one of the researchers.

He said on an average, around 90 percent of the facilities have weighing scales to assess nutritional status of pregnant women, 77 percent of which are functional in the abovementioned areas.

However, only 50 percent of it is utilised, he said.

Passengers endure ordeal due to inadequate services

Participants tell public hearing on Dhaka airport

Passengers at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport (HSIA) endure ordeals due to inadequate services from authorities that tarnish the reputation of the airport, participants at a public hearing said yesterday.

They said incidents like mismanagement in baggage handling and unsatisfactory service to passengers in case of flight delay are frequent at the airport. They also blamed lack of coordination among different departments.

The Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB) organised the public hearing at its premise in the capital's Kurmitola. Mostly officials from CAAB and different private carriers spoke at the programme.

A participant alleged that one of his relatives lost luggage at the airport upon returning from abroad recently. Despite filing a written complaint to the authorities, no step has been taken to address the issue, he said.

Naim Hassan said they will take prompt action on specific allegations. Moderating the hearing, the CAAB chief

stressed on better management at HSIA and other airports across the country. CAAB has undertaken a number of pro-

jects. Once implemented, those will help

reduce passengers' sufferings and improve the quality of service, he claimed. A third terminal at HSIA will be built and space will be increased to accommodate more planes, he added.

The CAAB chief also said some domestic airlines have already increased number of flights to facilitate local passengers.

AKM Junaied, director of customer services of US-Bangla Airlines, said in case of flight delay their officials take prompt action and look after the requirements of passengers.

Officials from Novoair and Regent Airways also spoke at the programme.

Judiciary wasn't always free: Law minister

Law Minister Anisul Huq yesterday said the judiciary was not always independent as the provisions on independence of the judiciary in the constitution were amended several times in the past and used for personal and political gains.

"If the judiciary had always been independent, the trial of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman murder case would not start 21 years after the incident," he said.

He made the remark while speaking as the chief guest at the inaugural programme of an orientation course, organised for chief judicial magistrates and chief metropolitan magistrates, at Judicial Administration Training Institute (Jati) in Dhaka.

The judiciary was independent during the 2007 caretaker government, the law minister observed.

He also said if the government led by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina did not formulate relevant laws, the judges would be under the government's executive branch.

Jati Director General Justice Khondker Musa Khaled and Law Secretary ASSM Zahirul Haque Dulal, among others, spoke at the programme.

The High Court yesterday issued a rule asking the Election Commission (EC) to explain in 10 days why it should not be directed to register Ganasamhati Andolon

as a political party. The bench of Justice Moyeenul Islam Chowdhury and Justice Md Ashraful Kamal issued the rule following a writ petition filed by Ganasamhati Andolon's Chief Coordinator Zonayed Saki, challenging a decision of the EC

that rejected its application for registration. In the rule, the court also asked the EC to explain why its decision to reject the party's application for registration should not be

Petitioner's lawyer Barrister Jyotirmoy Barua told reporters that Ganasamhati Andolon submitted the application with the EC on December 31, 2017.

On April 8, 2018 the EC issued a notice to the party saying that its application was not prepared in line with the Representation of the People Order (RPO).

Saki later submitted another application that included necessary info and data in line with the RPO to the EC on April 22 this year.

However, the EC on June 19 again rejected the application saying that it was

not prepared properly, the barrister added. Zonayed Saki recently submitted the writ petition with the HC, challenging the EC's
