## Federer cruises into last four Police, BGB

Roger Federer gained sweet revenge over Kevin Anderson at **TOUR** the ATP Finals on Thursday but is putting thoughts of his 100th title to the back of his mind after both players

reached the last four. The Swiss broke the giant South African's serve four times in a comprehensive 6-4, 6-3 victory even

though Anderson had not faced a single break point in his two earlier round-robin victories. Second seed Federer suffered a painful loss at the hands of Anderson in the Wimbledon quarterfinals

this year after leading by two sets, his only defeat against him in five meetings before Thursday's clash. The six-time champion started the week with an uncharacteristically ragged display in a straight-sets

defeat by Kei Nishikori but has beaten Dominic Thiem and Anderson in straight sets and is looking more like his old self as the tournament progresses. The victory over Anderson takes Federer through

to the semifinals for the 15th time in 16 attempts at the season-ending finale and means he will likely avoid a last-four meeting against Novak Djokovic.

"I'm happy that this is another week like this," said Federer. "Didn't look like it maybe 72 hours ago. But I was able to come back and play good tennis.

"Personally I'm still not thinking of the number 100. I won't let that get in my head, make me go crazy because it should be something I'm excited about and not something I should feel extra pressure.

"As long as I think Novak is in the draw anyhow, he's playing so good again, it's never going to be easy."

The first set was a topsy-turvy affair, with both players quickly into their groove on serve before a succession of breaks.

Federer, buoyed by his vocal support, broke to lead 4-3, only to lose his momentum as Anderson levelled. The Swiss broke the South African in the next game, sealing the break with a crisp backhand volley. The second set went with serve until the seventh

game, when Federer produced an immaculate sliced backhand that landed on the line to earn a break.

Now playing with freedom, the 37-year-old broke again to seal the victory and guarantee that he tops the group.

Bangladesh Police and Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) set up a final clash in the Exim Bank 28th Men's National Handball Championship after winning their respective semifinal matches at the Shaheed Captain M Mansur Ali Stadium in Paltan yesterday.

The winners led the first half by 12-11 goals while Mahbubul Alam scored highest 10 goals for them. Police goalkeeper Abdul Gafur was named the player-of-the-match for his brilliant performance between the sticks.

The final will be held at the same venue at 3:00pm today where Bangladesh Bank Association chairman Nazrul Islam and Exim Bank MD Dr. Mohammad Haider Ali will be present as dignitaries.

"Tonight was great, a great way to finish my international career, I thought the lads played great. Unfortunately I couldn't get a goal but I'll remember it for a long time," Rooney said.

"I've had my time, I can sit back and watch

them now and it's my opinion that England are in very safe hands from what I've seen." Bournemouth striker Callum Wilson,

making his England debut, made it 3-0 in the 77th minute to complete a fine night for the debut starters. England manager Gareth Southgate said

he was pleased with his team's display and with the send-off for Rooney.


