The Jatiya Oikyafront and the BNP-led 20party alliance will initially field multiple candidates all the 300 constituencies to avoid the risk of going to the polls without their contenders in some seats.

They have decided to employ this tactic keeping in mind that the Returning Officers (RO) might cancel some nomination papers during scrutiny on legal or technical grounds.

Sources in the Oikyafront, a combine of the BNP and several other parties, and the 20-party said they would nominate a panel of three to five candidates in each constituency for filing nomination papers.

The alliances will then pick a single candidate for each constituency on or before December 9, the last date for withdrawal of candidacies, and inform the RO of their decision in writing.

UN condemns rights abuses in Myanmar

New report says 669 Rohingya children killed, 39 maimed since August last year

A key United Nations committee endorsed a resolution on Friday expressing "grave concern" and "strongly condemning" all violations and abuses of human rights against Rohingyas in Myanmar.

It also reiterated "deep distress" at reports of unarmed Rohingyas were still being subjected to excessive use of force and rights violations by Myanmar's military and security forces, including killings and rapes.

The UN Committee measured urgent calls on Myanmar government to end discrimination and provide a path to citizenship for the Rohingyas.

Shakib back for Windies Tests

Ending all speculation and controversies about his finger injury, Bangladesh Test captain Shakib Al Hasan is all set to return to action after selectors included him in the 13-member Test squad for the first Test against the West Indies.

The match will be held in Chattogram from November 22.

There was a lot of confusion about the gravity of his injury as he was forced to return home from the UAE midway through the Asia Cup in September.

However, Shakib returned from Australia last month following treatment with a big smile and had then informed that he expected to be back on the field within three months. He added that he wanted to test whether cricketing activities would cause pain to the finger that he had initially injured in January this year.

The controversy had mainly surrounded a possible surgery, but the 31-year-old informed after his return from Australia that there was no possibility of undergoing the knife over the next six to 12 months, adding that the best outcome would be to be able to play without surgery.
