

# Two Barishal girls rescued in Dhaka

## Their abductors arrested

Four days after going missing, two sixth-grade girls, classmates at a school in Barishal, were found early yesterday in their abductors' house in the capital's Sipahibagh area.

The girls were most likely raped since they were abducted on November 15 and brought to Dhaka, Barishal Metropolitan Police (BMP) yesterday said at a press conference, adding that police also arrested the abductors -- Ripon Howlader, 30, and Miraj Sheikh, 42.

Ripon is an auto-rickshaw driver and Miraj is a rickshaw-van puller in Najirpur upazila of Pirojpur, said Abdur Rahman Mukur, officer-in-charge (OC) of BMP's Airport Police Station.

BMP Commissioner Mosharraf Hossain said police tracked down the abductors and located their rental house near Sipahibagh tempo stand in Khilgaon, after one of them called a victim's family on November 17, demanding Tk 5,000 ransom for the girls' release.

A guardian of one of the victims filed a

# Victims of OSSEP scam demand justice

Demanding justice, several hundred people of low-income group, who lost their hard-earned money due to an alleged fraud by an NGO, demonstrated in front of Chattogram Press Club yesterday.

Since 2011, Organisation of Social Service and Elimination of Poverty (OSSEP) had been promising people with high interest on their savings.

People from marginal-income group deposited portions of their income with OSSEP as they would get a good return, in cases double their savings.

But the organisation suddenly shut down and its officials disappeared. Many claimed that about 30,000 people had money with OSSEP and the amount added up to around Tk 50 crore.

Officials, socio-political leaders paid tribute to him by placing wreaths at his coffin before burial.

# Policeman, 5 others killed in road crashes

Six people were killed and eight others injured in road accidents in three districts in the last two days, report our correspondents.

In Rangpur, three passengers of a battery-run three-wheeler were killed and three others injured as the vehicle and a truck collided head-on in Lahirirhat area of Sadar upazila yesterday.

One of the deceased is Badsha Mia, son of Yousuf Ali from Boikunthapur area in the upazila.

The identities of the other deceased could not be ascertained immediately, said Sajedur Rahman, officer-in-charge of Sadar Police Station.

In Chattogram, an on-duty traffic police constable died as a CNG-run auto-rickshaw hit him on Dhaka-Chattogram highway in Baraiyarhat area of Mirsarai upazila on Saturday night.

Nurul Amin, 52, from Feni, was posted in Chattogram district police, said Joranganj Police Station Sub-Inspector Abed Ali.

He was declared dead at Mirsarai Upazila Health Complex.

In Sirajganj, two people were killed and five others injured as a pickup hit them while they were waiting for a vehicle at Saydabad point near the Bangabandhu bridge yesterday.

The deceased -- Jahangir Hossain, 30, and Shamim Hossain, 32 -- were from Jarila Porabari in Sirajganj Sadar upazila.

# GRAFT CHARGES Three Wasa officials transferred

Three Inspectors of Dhaka Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (Wasa) were transferred after the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) found their involvement in corruption and irregularities.

ACC conducted the drive at Wasa's Fakirapool office after the graft allegation surfaced. It found inspectors Shafiqul Islam and Shah Miran Bhuiyan involved in lowering Wasa bill in exchange for money while inspector Golam Rabbani was preparing bills without seeing meters.

"Public sufferings have increased due to such field-level corruption. ACC is committed to reduce such corruption," said its Director (admin) Munir Chowdhury.

# Cops among 20 injured in Narayanganj clash

## Four-hour gridlock on Dhaka-Ctg highway

A violent clash broke out between two groups of locals on Dhaka-Chattogram highway in Narayanganj yesterday, which resulted in traffic deadlock on the highway for four hours, vehicles and shops being vandalised and at least 20 people, including policemen, injured.

The clash ensued between the supporters of Khalilur Rahman, a union parishad (UP) member, and supporters of one Amir Hossain, after Khalil was hacked by a group of miscreants near Madanpur bus stand around 12:30pm, said Officer-in-Charge of Bandar Police Station Azharul Islam.

The two groups blockaded the highway, took position on either side of it and threw brickbats at each other.

Sohel Mia, a passenger of a Dhaka-bound bus said their bus was hit by brick chips from both sides of the road when it reached Madanpur bus stand. Many passengers had to get down from the bus and move to safety.

Mohsin Mia, driver of a lorry, said he was going to Chattogram carrying readymade garments, when it came under attack. "I've been stuck in traffic jam for over four hours," he said.

Police said supporters of Amir Hossain, a local influential, attacked Khalil with sharp weapons when he was at his shop, leaving him and Shamim, owner of a nearby shop, injured. Khalil's supporters retaliated and blocked the highway resulting in a 10-15km tailback on both sides of the highway, OC Azharul said.

A large contingent of police, along with an armoured truck, as well as members of Rapid Action Battalion were deployed in the area. They brought the situation under control after 5:00pm.

Agitators vandalised 12 vehicles and a few shops. Eight policemen including an assistant sub-inspector were injured, he said. Locals said another 10 to 12 people were hurt in the incident.

Khalil and Shamim were sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital, while the other injured were treated at local hospitals.

Local UP Chairman MA Salam told journalists that Khalil was a member of his parishad, and demanded that his attackers be arrested within 24 hours.

Amir Hossain could not be reached for comments.

# Two held with Tk 13.50 lakh stolen money

Police yesterday arrested two persons with Tk 13.50 lakh which were stolen from a steel almirah (cabinet) of a private service holder on October 27 from Kotwali area in Chattogram city.

The two arrestees are Md Dulal, 33, and Amir Hossain, 30, said police.

Kotwali Police Station's Officer-in-Charge (OC) Mohammed Mohsin said Md Didar, 40, a private service holder, had contacted Dulal to paint his almirah at his residence in Kotwali area on October 27.

While painting the furniture at Didar's home, Dulal spotted a secret chamber inside it where Tk 14 lakh were kept, said the OC, adding that Dulal and his associates later took the almirah away to one Mohsin Steel House in Baliyar Dighi in the name of renovation, without the consent of Didar.

When Didar came to know of the matter, he went to the shop but found his secret locker broken and the money stolen on October 28, said the OC.

"Didar's sister, who lives abroad, sent Tk 14 lakh to buy land in Chattogram. Didar kept the money inside the almirah for security," said the OC.

After receiving the allegation, police started investigation and arrested Dulal and Amin from city's Bahaddarhat and Mia Khan areas early yesterday and later recovered Tk 8.60 lakh from their residence in Bakalia area, said the OC. Later, based on their confession, police recovered Tk 4.90 lakh from the house of Dulal's sister, in Cumilla.

OC Mohsin said Dulal gave confessional statement before a Chattogram court in the case after their arrest.
