




Tell us about Pizza Bhai. What is the film about? Pizza Bhai is the story about a pizza boy, who slowly etches his name in the world of crime to become a drug lord. It is essentially an action-comedy with bits of dark humor instilled in it, and we've given it our all to make it an enjoyable watch. It releases on Bioscope Prime today.

Rahat Rahman plays the titular character in the

film. What made you choose him as the lead? Even in my previous project, 700 Taka, Pritom Hasan was the lead despite having no prior acting experience. Even though Rahat is a director, his understanding of this particular genre was a huge bonus for us. I've spent a lot of time with him previously, and we essentially are doing the same kinds of projects and I feel like we're on the same psychological plane, which made him a perfect fit

for the film.

VOD platforms have steadily gained popularity among the audience, why do you think this is happening?

It feels great to be a part of the 'online revolution' of sorts. Even though sign-up, and subscription might seem like a barrier, it is good content that makes it worthwhile. People's attention spans have decreased over the years, and these platforms often cater to them with short films and relatable content of this kind.



Bangladeshi artist Laila Sharmeen will exhibit her mixed media works in December at Spectrum Miami and at the annual international exhibition Salon des Beaux Arts in Paris.

Spectrum Miami, to be held at the Wynwood Arts District in Miami, begins on December 5 and curtains open on Salon des Beaux Arts on December 13 at the prestigious Carrousel Du Louvre.

Sharmeen has 11 solo exhibitions and over 60 international group shows to her credit. In 2011, she won a Purchase Prize at the 16th Space International Print Biennial, held in Seoul.

Sharmeen's artistic concern is mainly based on peace. Her quest for peace is reinforced by her readings of the ancient philosophical text, Brihadaranyaka Upanishad, containing Hindu and Buddhist concepts particularly the ones regarding three duties that each individual must perform. These duties are Datta Dayadvam Damyata, meaning giving, compassion and control.
