Abahani captain Shahidul Alam Shohel said, "We were excited because it was a big match with both teams wanting to win the final. During the interval, the coach told us not to hurry, rather keeping cool as we have the ability to reimburse the goal and score more.

"Sunday is one of best foreign players I have seen in my career. Today he had a great contribution but all the players and club management gave a great effort to make our dream true," explained Sohel.

Bashundhara Kings coach Oscar Bruzon explained his side's defeat by saying, "We failed to keep momentum in the second half where Abahani were better side, however, some of the decisions by the referee went against us. Abahani seal hattrick title

Sunday double denies Bashundhara Kings in tempestuous final

hattrick title as well as a record 11th Federation Cup trophy, keeping intact the practice of not allowing newcomers to become champions in debut appearances. Sunday cancelled out a 21st-mimute strike from Colindres five minutes into the second half

with a tap-in before giving Abahani the lead in the 79th minute with a clinical finish. Belfort then wrapped up the victory in the 81st minute of the final, which was however marred by an ugly brawl between the two sets of players during the final moments after an entertaining 90 minutes of football.

Referee Mizanur Rahman was forced to send off Bashundhara Kings' Sushanta Tripura, Towhidul Alam Sabuz and Abahani's Mamun Mia and Nabib Newaj Jibon -- the latter three substitutes -- as they got engaged in an ugly scuf-

Bashundhara Kings, playing with a compact midfield and defence by deploying Colindres as the lone striker, got rid of the initial pressure to launch attacks. Colindres did not disappoint the crowd as he gave his side the lead with a grounder from inside the box after Abahani goalkeeper Shahidul Alam Sohel made a feeble clearance.

After conceding the lead, Abahani players lost temperament before regrouping in the second half to bounce back with Sunday tapping in a long throw-in from Raihan in the 50th minute before the Nigerian gave his side the lead with a side-volley on Sohel Rana's forward pass in the 69th minute. Belfort, who had a trial with Bashundhara Kings before being signed by Abahani, wrapped up the victory, heading home


