BRIDGE LYING COLLAPSED

Who cares?

An iron bridge built around 30 years back over Bauria canal under Galachipa upazila collapsed one and a half months ago, but no steps have been taken till now to repair it and resume communication.

Villagers said the bridge was built on the canal around 30 years back to ease communication in the area, but it collapsed in the middle of October due to lack of renovation for a long time.

About one lakh people of Khontakhali, Kanchonbaria, Kismot Bauria, Bishkani Bauria, Ramanando and Tafalbaria villages under Patuakhali's Galachipa upazila and Sonakhali, Algee and Chalitabunia villages under Barguna's Amtali upazila are suffering due to lack of communication.

Villagers cannot go to local haats and bazars or to the upazila and district town due to collapse of the bridge. A good number of school goers are also suffering as there are two educational institutions -- Bauria Government Primary School and Bauria High School -- in the area.

Bauria High School Headmaster Md Abu Bakar said students of the institution are facing immense suffering after the bridge collapsed.

"We have requested the local union parishad (UP) chairman to take immediate steps to build a new bridge on the canal to resume communication," he said.

Bahadur Hawlader, a resident of Bauria village, said the bridge was built around 30 years back and villagers were getting its benefit, but it collapsed one and a half months back, which has created a problem in communication with other places.

Villagers voluntarily built a bamboo bridge (locally called sako) considering the interest of school goers, but they have to cross it at great risk, he said, adding that the authorities concerned should take immediate steps to build a new bridge on the canal.

Kamruzzaman Monir, chairman of Amkhola UP under Galachipa upazila, said it is a very important bridge and local people have been suffering since it collapsed.

"We have informed Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) about the matter and requested them to build a new bridge," he said.

Galachipa Upazila LGED Engineer Md Atiqur Rahman said they are taking steps to build a new bridge there.

Sonaimuri JCD man shot

Sonaimuri Upazila Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) President Shahidullah Liton was shot in his leg on Saturday night.

Local people rescued bullet-hit Liton, 26, around 12:00 midnight and rushed him to Noakhali 250-bed General Hospital.

Doctors at the hospital referred Liton to Dhaka for better treatment.

Liton, son of Md Hanif of Gobindapur village in Sonaimuri upazila, was forcibly taken into a microbus at Rampur on Noakhali-Cumilla around 9:00pm on Saturday.

Victim's father Hanif said the criminals forced this son Liton to get into the microbus after he got down from an auto-rickshaw.

Later, local people found Liton shot in his leg at Bipulsar near Noakhali-Cumilla border around 11:00pm, he added.

The criminals shot him in the leg and left him on the spot, said Sonaimuri Municipality Chairman Motahar Hossain Manik, also president of municipality BNP.

Tragic

A schoolboy met a tragic death when a rope he was playing with got coiled around his neck at his house in Sharsha upazila of Jashore on Saturday night.

The deceased, Yadul Islam, 10, a Class III student at Navaron Government Primary School, was son of Jamal Hossain of Navaron village in the upazila.

Yadul was playing with a rope tied to the ceiling when it suddenly got coiled around his neck, and he died of suffocation, said the deceased's father.

During the incident Yadul's parents were busy in household work.

Hearing no sound for quite sometime, Yadul's mother went inside the room and found the boy hanging with the rope.

With the help of neighbours, the body was down.

Yadul was buried without conducting autopsy yesterday morning as the parents did not want to file any complaint with the police station in this regard.

100 maunds of fish poisoned to death

Unknown criminals poisoned to death around 100 maunds of fish in Anwarpur village under Sadar upazila of Habiganj on Saturday night.

The criminals poured pesticide in the fish farm belonging to Joyal Abedin of the village in the dead of night, locals said, adding that all the fish died due to poisoning of the water.

The price of the fish would be around Tk 5 lakh. Most of the rotten fish have been buried under the ground to prevent spread of bad smell, said Joyal Abedin, owner of the fish farm.

Habiganj Police Station Assistant Sub-Inspector Mullah Lutfur Rahman said a case was filed with the police station in this regard.

None was arrested in connection with the incident, he added.

Implement CHT deal fully

Speakers reiterate at rallies on 21st anniversary of the agreement

Speakers at programmes in Rangamati and Bandarban marking the 21st anniversary of Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) peace accord yesterday demanded effective steps for full implementation of the accord.

Parbatya Chattagram Jana Samhati Samiti (PCJSS) organised a rally at Shilpakala Academy hall room in Rangamati town yesterday, reports our correspondent.

"The government claims that 48 of 72 clauses of CHT peace accord have been implemented, but the reality is that only 26 clauses have seen implementation," local lawmaker Uchaton Talukdar said at the programme.

Prakriti Ranjan Chakma, president of

Bangladesh Adibasi Forum's CHT region unit, Arun Kanti Chakma, chairman of Rangamati Sadar Upazila Parishad, Rina Chakma, president of Hill Women's Federation's Rangamati district unit, and cultural activist Shishir Chakma were present at the function with Notun Chakma, member of PCJSS central committee, in the chair.

Rangamati Hill District Council (RHDC) organised a discussion at RHDC hall room marking the CHT peace accord anniversary.

Lawmaker Firoza Begum Chinu was chief guest at the programme presided over by Brisho Ketu Chakma, chairman of RHDC.

Our Bandarban correspondent reports: The PCJSS leaders at a programme at Arun Sarki Town Hall in the district town yesterday blamed

the ruling party's lack of goodwill for not full implementation of the peace treaty.

Progress in implementation of the peace accord has been very slow and land dispute, one of the most important issues, still remains unresolved, speakers said at the programme.

A large number of indigenous people gathered at the event yesterday noon.

PCJSS leader KS Mong Marma attended there as chief guest while indigenous leaders Jumlian Amlai, Joli Mong Marma, and Aung Thoai Sing Marma spoke, among others.

PCJSS leaders said district and upazila administration did not allow the indigenous people to bring out procession marking the 21st anniversary of the peace treaty.

COLLEGE GIRL ITY MURDER IN TANGAIL

Police inaction condemned

Fellow students, teachers and employees of Gopalpur Government College yesterday demanded exemplary punishment of the culprits responsible for the mysterious death of Kamrunnahar Ity, 20.

At a human chain programme in front of the institution in Gopalpur upazila headquarters yesterday, they also alleged that despite getting specific complaint police did not take any action.

Police on Friday recovered the

body of Kamrunnahar Ity, a second-year honours student of the college, hanging from a tree at her in-laws' house at Bhattabari village in adjacent Madhupur upazila.

Ity, daughter of Abdul Quddus of Bolibhadra village in Dhanbari upazila, was married to Jalil Miah of Bhattabari village in May this year.

After the marriage, Ity continued her study staying at her in-laws' house while her husband Jalil serves at a private firm in the capital.

Quoting Ity's parents, speakers

at the human chain said Ity's in-laws' tortured her to death for dowry and later claimed that she had committed suicide by hanging herself from the tree.

They demanded immediate arrest of the killers and threatened to go for a tougher agitation, if their demand is not met.

Ity's father filed a case with Madhupur Police Station, Officer in Charge of the police station Shafiqul Islam said, adding that they will take necessary steps after getting the autopsy report.

Two charge-sheeted for raping girl

Police yesterday submitted charge sheet to a court in Jashore against two youths accused of raping a teenage girl near Sharsha border on October 26 in 2017.

Sharsha Police Station sub-inspector, also investigation officer of the case, Mamunur Rashid submitted the charge sheet.

The accused are Milon Sheikh, 35, son of Abdul Hamid Sheikh, and Jamai Ukil, son of Rafiq Sardar of Ramchandrapur village in Sharsha upazila of Jashore.

According to the charge sheet, Jamai Ukil and Milon took a teenage girl, 18, from Milon's house to Sharsha border area on October 25 last year, promising that they would give her a good job.

When they reached Sharsha border area the next day, the girl grew suspicious and refused to go with them.

Jamai Ukil and Milon then raped the girl there. A team of Border Guard Bangladesh, who happened to be there on patrol duty, became aware of the incident and rescued the girl. They also detained Jamia Ukil and Milon.

The girl filed a case with Sharsha Police Station on October 28, against Jamai Miah and Milon on charge of gang rape and attempting to traffic her.

The accused were handed over to police.
