Politician Mashrafe plays to merit

It was unlike the typical press conferences that have taken place at the Shere-Bangla National Stadium, where cricket has always remained at the forefront of all discussions.

There was no shortage of excitement and curiosity among the numerous reporters present at the home of cricket in Mirpur yesterday as they waited for Bangladesh ODI skipper Mashrafe Bin Mortaza to make good on a promise he made the day before to answer all questions regarding his involvement in politics. For Mashrafe, it must have seemed

like an intense batting session on a bouncy pitch during a Test where the inspirational cricketer tried to play according to merit. Asked whether it is now difficult to keep his focus on the game ahead of the ODI series against West Indies beginning on December 9, Mashrafe made his intentions clear.

"To me, not at all [difficult]. There is no chance for me to be distracted. At the moment I am not involved there [in politics] and my entire focus is on practice. Obviously I will concentrate on that after the 14th [the ODI series] but till the 14th, I want to keep my concentration on my game," he told reporters.

Soon after negotiating that length ball, Mashrafe had to deflect another one coming to the stumps when asked for the reason behind him joining politics.

"First of all, consider that the World

Cup it is still eight-nine months away. If my career ends after the World Cup, I don't know what will happen in the next four and half years. I have an opportunity to serve the people now,

which is something I always enjoyed.

nity for me to work for the people and only from that point I thought that there won't be an election after eight playing career. nine-months," he continued.

The 35-year-old further elaborated his reasons for joining politics at this point by informing that it is his passion to serve the people on a broader scale and only a politics could help him achieve that goal. In addition, he referenced how he is not Sachin

a childhood dream.

ally went on to work in the 'conventional way' and ended up as disappointments.

"Look I am not here to show dreams. If there is anything conventional I won't say anything like that which you are not going to relate in future. If you want to review my work after I'm elected, you can," Mashrafe assured.

Lastly, there was a well directed bouncer aimed at his silence during the quota reform and road safety demonstrations but Mashrafe managed to duck.

"What happened in the quota demonstration, I was never involved in such deep politics and I don't know about it. What I said clearly is that my intension is very simple and that I get the peace of mind by serving people.

"If you think of me as a deep level politician, that is not what I am as I am relatively inexperienced. But what I said is that I want to do good work," he added.

Politics in Bangladesh has always been uncertain and so Mashrafe opined that it is important to keep your intentions clear and not worry about the consequences.

Heading towards the end of an eventful session, Mashrafe was asked if he is ahead of his opponent in the upcoming election, he played a delightful cover drive for a boundary and said, "I have never said that I am better than him. I respect him, how could I disrespect him and say that I am better than him? Look I am a sportsman and there has to be that mentality there."

He may be a greenhorn in politics but Masharfe showed that he certainly has learned a few things already when asked why people would vote for him.

"Everyone has one vote each and if someone thinks I am capable he will vote for me," he said.

However, he concluded with: "At the moment, political campaigning is not allowed."

Icardi Serie A's best

Inter Milan's Argentina striker Mauro Icardi won the Serie A SERIE A Footballer of the Year award at the TIM Gran Gala del Calcio ceremony in Milan on Monday night.

The 25-year-old becomes the first player outside Juventus to win the Italian Players' Association award, voted for by his peers, since Zlatan Ibrahimovic with AC Milan in

Icardi was joint top scorer with Lazio's Ciro Immobile in Serie A last season with 29 goals.

The Argentine also won the best goal award for his spectacular backheel during a four-goal haul against Sampdoria last March.

Icardi disagreed with the choice, insisting his "one (goal) at AC Milan was more beautiful".

Juventus were voted top team with Massimiliano Allegri winning coach of the year after the Turin side won a league and

Cup double for the fourth consecutive year. "It's a group of great men, with a great club behind us," said Allegri, who has won

the award four times.

"I'm fortunate to have worked with so many marvellous players and tonight I see the maestro Andrea Pirlo too."

Allegri's side are on track for an eighth straight Serie A title, with Allegri hailing the impact of five-time Ballon d'Or winner Cristiano Ronaldo who arrived last summer.

"Ronaldo has brought professionalism, competitiveness and is a humble guy," said Allegri.

Portuguese star Ronaldo finished runner-up to Croatia's Luka Modric in this year's Ballon d'Or prize which was awarded in Paris on Monday. Fiorentina's Italian international


defender Alia Guagni won the Serie A women's Player of the Year award. Roma legend Francesco Totti and for-

mer AC Milan and Juventus great Pirlo both received Lifetime Achievement Awards. Meanwhile, Gianluca Rocchi won the

award for the best referee 24 hours after being whistled off the pitch at the Stadio Olimpico over his decision not to award Roma a penalty in a 2-2 draw against Inter Milan.

Super sub Milik lifts Napoli

Arkadiusz Milik came off the bench to snatch a late 2-1 win for Napoli over Atalanta on Monday that consolidated second place in Serie A and reduced the gap on leaders Juventus to eight points.

Polish forward Milik scored the winner five minutes from time shortly after coming on after Fabian Ruiz had put the visitors ahead just two minutes into the clash in Bergamo and former Napoli man Duvan Zapata had pulled Atalanta level 11 minutes after the break.

"It's a very, very important goal for all of us," said Napoli coach Ancelotti. "Milik went through a difficult period because he didn't play consistently, but he remained motivated and focused, so deserves this."

PSG game postponed by Paris police Paris Saint-Germain's home Ligue 1 game against Montpellier on Saturday has been postponed after a request from police in the French capital, the club said on Tuesday.

The match was due to be played at 4:00 pm (1500 GMT) at the Parc des Princes. No reason was given for the postponement but it is likely to be down to security concerns.
