Reliving horrors of '71

Meghna Guhathakurta shares experience with children

Around midnight of March 25, 1971, horrifying sound of gunshots filled the air around the three-storey residential building near the Central Shaheed Minar in Dhaka University, where Prof Jyotirmoy Guhathakurta, thethen provost of Jagannath Hall lived with his wife and teenage daughter Meghna

Guhathakurta. Prof Guhathakurta and his family mem-

bers hid under the bed. entered the flat on the ground floor, through the back door. One of the soldiers asked,

"Where is the professor?" They took him

[Prof Guhathakurta] outside and shot him in the neck and waist, leaving him critically injured.

As there was curfew across the city, it took his family two days to take him to the hospital 200 yards away. After two days with hardly any medical attention, Prof Guhathakurta died due to severe loss of blood.

His daughter Meghna Guhathakurta, now a professor at DU following her father's footsteps, narrated the harrowing events of the night yesterday at a Victory Day programme, Suddenly, three Pakistani Army soldiers organised by Central Kachi-Kanchar Mela, at

its headquarter in the capital.

3 DU journos say BCL men assaulted them

Three journalists of Dhaka University were allegedly assaulted by a group of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists of Bangladesh University of Engineering and

Technology (Buet) on Saturday night. BCL men of Sher-e-Bangla Hall unit of Buet -- including former deputy office secretary Asif Raihan Minar, former science and technology affairs secretary SM Mahmud Shetu, former joint secretary Nafiul Alam Fuji, former publicity secretary Niladri Niloy Das, former joint general secretary Iftekharul Haque Fahad and former vice-president Santur Rahman -- allegedly confined the journalists to the dorm for

nearly an hour and assaulted them. The victims -- Mehedi Hasan, Kabir Kanon and Muntasir Zihad -- are Dhaka University correspondents of Bangla

dailies Kaler Kantho, Ittefaq and Janakantha respectively. A Buet student and resident of the hall, wishing to be unnamed, said to have witnessed the incident. They

affirmed identities of the accused.

The journalists claimed that they went to Sher-e-Bangla Hall

Man dies of 'cardiac arrest' in police custody

A man died allegedly of cardiac arrest early yesterday after he

was arrested by Jatrabari police from Kajla area in the capital. The deceased was identified as Jamaluddin Ripon, 45, wanted in five separate cases. Ripon died at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) around 12:30am, said Kazi Wazed Ali, officer-in-charge of Jatrabari Police Station.

Ripon's wife Maya Chowdhury, however, claimed that police killed Ripon after taking him to custody.

"As far I know, Ripon had no serious health conditions which could lead to death," she said.

According to police, a team from Jatrabari Police Station arrested Ripon from Kajla's Shekdi Bazar area around 9:30pm on Saturday night and took him to the police station. After arrest, Ripon started complaining of chest pain, and police took him to nearby Islamia Hospital.

Later, Ripon was shifted to DMCH for better treatment where the doctors pronounced him dead, claimed police. OC Kazi Wazed said that Ripon was wanted in five SEE PAGE 4 COL 6
