US govt in partial shutdown

BORDER WALL ROW

An air of chaos enveloped Washington yesterday as the US government kicked off the holidays by partially shutting down, following the failure of leaders to pass a federal spending bill as negotiations stalled over Donald Trump's demand for money to build a US-Mexico border wall.

Operations for several key agencies ceased at 12:01am yesterday (0501 GMT), despite last-ditch talks that continued on Capitol Hill between White House officials and congressional leaders in both parties.

Most critical security functions remain operational but 800,000 federal workers are impacted, with many furloughed just days before Christmas while others deemed essential are working unpaid.

21 sued over arson attack on Hindu family

At least 21 people, including a former union parishad chairman, were sued over the arson attack on a Hindu family in Takhurgaon Sadar on Friday.

One of the victims, Krisna Ghosh, filed the case with Thakurgaon Police Station accusing nine named and 12 unnamed people.

According to the case statement, a group of criminals, including former Jagannath union parishad chairman Mostafizur Rahman Liton, was trying to create panic among the local Hindu community so that they do not vote on December 30.

The attack, carried out between 4:30am and 5:00am Friday in Singia Shahapara village, killed seven goats, destroyed sixty maunds of paddy and all furniture of eight houses. The attackers first set a house on

Media failing to play its role

Speakers tell seminar on JS polls

Although the role of mass media is very crucial in national elections, the mainstream media in Bangladesh are failing to play their part, speakers said at a seminar yesterday.

Expressing concern over the prevailing situation ahead of the coming polls, they emphasised on creating a congenial environment so that people can vote freely on December 30.

They were speaking at the seminar titled 'Media Engagement for Fair Elections" organised by the Centre for Governance Studies at the capital's BIISS auditorium.

In his keynote speech, Nurul Kabir, editor of New Age, said, "While the government's prime focus of control remains on the electronic media due to its greater reach and influence on a larger number of the country's population, the print media is also not spared..."

Kabir said it was clear that the media engagement was very much there in the coming election, "but it is predominantly a partisan engagement devoid of broader public interests".

He said independent media outlets and even individual journalists were trying to serve the people, "but that is quite inadequate in terms of the huge responsibilities that the democratic media are expected to discharge during SEE PAGE 10 COL 5


A police OC in Satkhira has been withdrawn for allegedly seeking vote for Awami League.

The SP withdrew Maruf Ahmed, officer-in-charge of Kalaroa Police Station, yesterday following an order by the Election Commission. He was attached to the district police lines, said Merina Akhter, additional superintendent of police (sadar circle) in the district.

The development came two days after Maruf allegedly violated the electoral code of conduct by seeking vote for "boat" - the AL's electoral symbol. A video

Ice-filler crater on Mars discovered

A massive ice-filled hole on the surface of Mars has been revealed in images beamed back from a spacecraft orbiting the red planet.

The Korolev crater measures 51 miles across and is located in the northern lowlands of Mars, just south of the pole.

At a depth of 1.2 miles, scientists think the chasm traps a layer of cold air that ensures its icy core remains in place all year round.

As air moves over the surface of the crater it sinks and creates a low temperature zone that preserves the ice by shielding it from the surrounding atmosphere. SEE PAGE 10 COL 4


