

BGB ready to tackle polls violence: DG

Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) is ready to tackle any situation on the election day, Director General of the paramilitary force Maj Gen Shafeenul Islam said yesterday.

"We are ready to handle any untoward incident on December 30," he said. He, however hoped that a peaceful voting atmosphere will prevail on the day.

The BGB chief was briefing the media after visiting a makeshift BGB camp set up at Patiya High School ground.

Earlier, around 1,115 platoons from BGB have been deployed across the country following the directives of Election Commission.

Around 70 platoons of border guards have been deployed in Chattogram district ahead of election, according to the district administration officials.

Ctg-16 gears up for tough contest

Known as the stronghold of BNP and Jamaat-e-Islami, Banshkhali (Chattogram-16) is likely to see a hard-fought contest this time as all four heavyweight candidates have a strong presence in election campaign.

Posters and banners of all parties flooded every important intersection or thoroughfare of the upazila alongside those of Awami League candidate Mustafizur Rahaman Chowdhury.

Gulzar Ahmed, a resident of Jaliarghata village, said historically Banshkhali belongs to the anti-Awami League camp. "There is no exception this time."

He also said all parties including BNP, Jatiya Party, and Jamaat-e-Islami have a strong position in the constituency; so, AL will face strong resistance if it opts for rigging.

"This is not 2014," added grocer Jashim Uddin of Kaliur union. "Things will not be easy for the

Awami League this time."

'ATMOSPHERE OF FEAR'

The competitive atmosphere, however, raised fear of violence. Already, Awami League supporters attacked a rally of Jatiya Party candidate Mahmudul Islam Chowdhury on December 21, leaving 30 JP followers with bullet injuries.

Accusing the ruling party of creating fear, the JP leader said, "The Awami League candidate has lost his mind. Using the loud-speaker, he is asking his people in broad daylight to attack our election camp and home. But I will not bow down to any pressure."

There are also allegations of harassment by the ruling party men and police.

Talking to The Daily Star, BNP candidate Zafurul Islam Chowdhury said the Awami League men were trying to create an atmosphere of terror so that the people fear going to vote.

"They attacked me a few days

Election fever yet to grip Ctg 14, 15 constituencies

With less than a week left before the December 30 national election, the polls scenario in Chattogram 14 and 15 constituencies remains dull.

While supporters of Awami League-led alliance's candidates are campaigning in full swing, there is no sign of any other parties. In addition, BNP did not even nominate anyone from the party. It's supporting other candidates in the two constituencies.

Against that backdrop, voters are apprehensive that the election might be a one-sided one.

Among the heavyweights, AL candidate Nazrul Islam Chowdhury and LDP Chairman Oli Ahmed are contesting for Chattogram-14 (Chandanaish and parts of Satkania) while AL's Abu Reza Muhammad Nezamuddin and former Jamaat lawmaker and its central Nayeb-e-Ameer ANM Shamsul Islam are contesting for Chattogram-15 (Lohagara and parts of Satkania).

Shamsul, who is in jail now, filed his nomination paper as an independent candidate and later got BNP's support. He is contesting the polls with BNP's election symbol "sheaf of paddy".

This correspondent visited a number of unions under Chandanaish upazila including Barama, Kanchanabad, Barkal, Dohazari and Boiltoli on Saturday and spoke to locals.

Golam Nabi, a tea-stall owner in Gachhbaria College Gate area, said he was yet to see any enthusiasm among people. "Usually before the election day, sales in my stall used to increase manifold. People used to crowd the stall. It's different now," he said.

"These days, people do not even come out of home in the evening without necessity. A tense situation is prevailing everywhere," he said.

Abdur Rahim, a pharmacy owner in Moulvibazar area, said, "We're hoping for a peaceful atmosphere on the election day, otherwise many won't exercise

their franchise."

Walking around the neighbourhoods, this correspondent saw posters and banners of the AL candidate almost everywhere, while that of BNP-led component candidate was seen only in a few places.

In some areas, Oli Ahmed has set up election camps, though no one was there.

Contacted, Mahbub Alam Chowdhury, coordinator of one such camp in Barama union, alleged that their activists do not stay at the camps, fearing police raid.

"I went there in the morning but came back after seeing a police patrol van," he said. "Police are arresting our activists after implicating them in false cases," he alleged.

LDP activist Mohammad Manjur alleged that they are not being able to campaign freely. "Our posters and banners are being removed by AL men..." he alleged.

"Oli Ahmed is a five-time

RMG workers stage demos in Gazipur

Workers of several readymade garment factories in Gazipur Sadar upazila took to the streets yesterday, vandalising and setting fire to some vehicles and causing blockade on the Dhaka-Mymensingh highway before law enforcers intervened.

Police lobbed tear gas canisters and charged baton to disperse the workers, who were demanding increased wage.

Traffic movement at Gorgoria Master Bari area on Dhaka-Mymensingh highway remained suspended for about one hour from 3pm due to the workers' agitation.

The workers of NAZ Composite Ltd at Rajendrapur agitated intermittently from morning till 4pm, while workers of Golden Garments Ltd at Bhabanipur, and Jaber Jobaer and Hams Industrial group at Gorgoria Master Bari also demonstrated on the streets.

Workers at NAZ factory said the government recently announced increased wage and allowances for workers, but the authorities ignored it and paid wages as per previous rate, which caused discontent among 6,000 workers for the last one week.
