Lesson Plan:

LISTENING

- 1** You will talk to the class about the things you do in your spare time. Tell the students to listen.

Here is an example:

I like a game of table tennis occasionally and I'm quite good at it – though I'm terrible at tennis! I don't like tennis at all. In the summer I love swimming, especially in the sea. I love playing badminton but I'm not very good at it, although I practise a lot. Apart from sport, my other main hobby is sewing – I really enjoy a quiet evening at my sewing machine. My sister is very interested in chess and she's always trying to get me to play, but I hate it.

- 2** Draw this chart on board and tell the students to copy it:

- 7** Read the complete dialogue with them, telling the As to repeat part A and the Bs to repeat part B.

- 8** Get the whole class to read the dialogue in chorus, with all the As taking the role of A and all the Bs taking the role of B.

- 9** Tell the students that it's Friday afternoon and, in their pairs, they are deciding what to do.

- 10** Then get them to practise the dialogue in their pairs.
