Mandzukic fiddles as Rome burns

Mario Mandzukic scored the only goal for Juventus to dump further hurt on crisis club Roma and keep the champions unbeaten and on track for an eighth straight Italian league title.

The World Cup runner-up headed in the winner 34 minutes into the match in Turin to put Juventus back eight points clear of Napoli.

The defeat could have been harsher but for Roma goalkeeper Robin Olsen denying Cristiano Ronaldo, with Douglas Costa having a late goal ruled out following a video assistant referee check because of a foul in the build-up.

"We are doing good things, we have reached the Champions League last sixteen and we're winter champions," said coach Massimiliano Allegri, referring to the name given to teams top before Christmas.

Serie A is however holding a round of fixtures on December 26 and 29, before pausing for three weeks.

"We haven't won anything yet," added Allegri. "The important thing is to be a few ahead of Napoli on the 29th of December."

Roma, after finishing third last season, are now 25 points behind Juventus and drop to 10th after their eighth defeat in as many trips to the Allianz Stadium. They have won just twice in the league since the end of September.

Napoli are way behind Juve but consolidated second place when Raul Albiol headed his first goal of the season from a Dries Mertens corner against to beat struggling SPAL.

"Thinking of Juventus is likely to demotivate us," said coach Carlo Ancelotti.

"We have to think about ourselves because this team can do more, we have room for improvement and I say it after today's match, which was not amazing."

Inter Milan were held 1-1 at bottom club Chievo to fall eight points behind Napoli. Meanwhile, the pressure is on Milan coach Gennaro Gattuso after Federico Chiesa's second-half scorcher pushed AC Milan out of the Champions League places at the expense of Lazio.

"There's no use looking at who's to blame. The team is going through a bad moment," said Gattuso, whose side have take just two points from their last three games.

Rangpur win U-17 Gold Cup

Rangpur Division emerged champions in the inaugural Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman National Gold Cup (U-17) Football tournament with a 2-1 win over Rajshahi Division in an entertaining final at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

The match was witnessed by President Abdul Hamid, who distributed prizes among the teams after the final.

The previous finals of similar tournaments have rarely been impressive due to the lack of technique, tactic and skill of the players, but the final of this newly introduced tournament turned out to be different – there was entertaining display of football from the players including good passing, nice build-up, good understanding and good fitness. And all three goals scored were spectacular, with the scorers showing intelligence in their finishing. It would not be an overstatement if yesterday's final can be termed better than the final of the Premier League Clubs' Youth U-18 tournament.

And the performance is not surprising at all since most of these booters have been playing at different levels in and outside the capital with

the dream of flourishing at the top level.

The Youth and Sports Ministry felt the need to introduce this tournament in a bid to giving a platform to the youth, who once played the Bangabandhu Gold Cup Primary School football tournament, filling the void left by the absence of the Suhrawardi Cup Youth tournament, which was held for the last time in 2006, with the participation of district youth teams.

The introduction of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Gold Cup seems to have compensated for the lack of youth football as well as built a footballing bridge between the primary school and high school students.

Payers like Bimal Roy of Rangpur and Jogen Lakra of Rajshahi started playing football through the Bangabandhu Gold Cup Primary School football tournament and they are now part of the Bangabandhu Gold Cup (U-17), which started from union level in September this year before graduating to upazila, district, divisional and the final round in Dhaka, with the participation of some 125,000 players from 5,508 teams.

"There are a lot of talented players at grass-roots level as I played from the union level before coming to the final match. If the players are given proper training and facilities, they can go to the top level," opined Bimal from Kursha union of

Taraganj under Rangpur district.

"I trained these boys for only seven days before coming to Dhaka. The game plan worked nicely because they are matured players who are playing at different level in Dhaka and some of them are even part of premier league youth squads such as that of Saif SC," said Rajshahi Division coach Jahir Iqbal, adding that they have fielded players from all eight districts of Rajshahi.

"If the U-17 Gold Cup is held regularly, I believe the shortage of footballers will end and it will inspire budding footballers," said champions Rangpur Division's coach Shamim Khan Miskin.

Former national footballer Rakibul Islam, who was part of the organising committee, was amazed to see the big turnout of spectators at union and upazila levels. He was also encouraged by the deep involvement of upazila chairmen, UNOs and DCs.

"The name of the tournament has had a huge impact in regards to the involvement of teams and government officials. Besides, there was joyous presence of spectators at union and upazila level. If the government can continue this tournament, I think a football environment will come back all over the country," said Rakibul.

Barca 3 clear going into new year

Barcelona held off Atletico Madrid to ensure they will be three points clear at the top of La liga going into the winter break after beating a spirited Espanyol 2-0 at the Camp Nou on Saturday.

First-half goals from Ousmane Dembele and Lionel Messi were enough to move Ernesto Valverde's side up to 37 points and keep them ahead of Atletico, who earlier drew level with Barca with a 1-0 win over Espanyol thanks to an Antoine Griezmann penalty.

"In the first half we got behind their defence well, we saw that with any play, playing with the space [left behind] we could score," said Valverde.

Dembele put the hosts into the lead after just nine minutes when he lashed home on the rebound after Messi's first-time shot was pushed into his path by Celta keeper Ruben Blanco.

Messi doubled his side's advantage just before half-time, bursting through completely unmarked to meet the excellent Jordi Alba's through ball and wrong-foot Blanco as he slotted in his 15th league goal of the season.

The Argentine and Alba linked up nicely throughout, with the left-back providing the pass for the Messi shot that led to Dembele's opener.

"They [Messi and Alba] are a duo that have been together for some time, they understand each other perfectly," added Valverde.

Earlier, Griezmann smashed home from the spot 10 minutes after the break to earn Atletico three points from a match with mid-table Espanyol.

Solskjaer awakens vintage Man Utd

Ole Gunnar Solskjaer insisted having "good players" was the key to his instant impact as Manchester United caretaker manager in a 5-1 thumping of Cardiff on Saturday.

Not since Alex Ferguson's final game in charge in 2013 had United scored five goals in a single Premier League game and the Red Devils looked a side transformed from the turgid football of Jose Mourinho's final days in charge.

"One of the things I talked about is that a Manchester United team should never ever be outworked," Solskjaer said, after his team outran the opposition by 5km. "It doesn't matter what team you play: you should run more than them and then your skills will give you a chance of winning again."

"They are very good players, talented players, they've approached the game properly and worked hard."

The Norwegian has been put in charge until the end of the season after Mourinho was sacked on Tuesday and could not have asked for a better start.

As well as getting Solskjaer off to a flying start, victory also sees United close the gap on the Premier League top four to eight points thanks to Chelsea's 1-0 home defeat by Leicester earlier in the day.

"We're eight points behind, so our job is to take one game at a time," added Solskjaer. "We always play well in the second half of the season."

He also credited some messages from the club's all-time leading goalscorer Wayne Rooney.

"I arrived Thursday night and I think maybe all the texts and advice from Wazza [Rooney] helped today. He just told us to make them enjoy football, smile, go forward, be Man United. That's what I asked for because it's been a tough week for them. They've responded fantastically."

Paul Pogba was forced to watch the full 90 minutes from the bench last weekend as Liverpool inflicted the final blow to Mourinho's time in charge with a 3-1 win that left United 19 points off the top after just 17 games.

The French World Cup-winner was restored from the start for the first time in four league games and looked far more like the player United splashed a then world-record £89 million on in 2016 than the one that clashed with his former boss off the field and disappointed on

it for much of the past two seasons.

"The performance of the team was great and we are happy that the first game of the manager starts like this," said Pogba. "It's important now to carry on like that. We cannot play like this and win with five goals and then the next game lose."

The visiting fans enthusiastically chanted Solskjaer's name throughout and were enjoying their side moving the ball around with a speed and accuracy more reminiscent of his days as a player when United dominated English football.

Pogba was at the heart of United's best work, earning a free-kick that led to Marcus Rashford's opener, before his intelligent pass picked out Ander Herrera, whose shot flicked off Greg Cunningham to loop over the helpless Neil Etheridge to make it 2-0 inside half an hour.

Cardiff got a penalty and Victor Camarasa's perfectly-taken spot-kick could have sparked a collapse for a team short on confidence in recent times. Instead, United responded resoundingly with a fantastic sequence that saw Anthony Martial score his ninth goal of the season. Lingard then scored another from the spot, before wrapping things up following another defence-splitting pass from Pogba a minute from time.

Thiago Silva's home ransacked

Thiago Silva became the latest Paris Saint-Germain player to have his property robbed during a match, police confirmed on Sunday.

Robbers broke into the Brazilian's home in the upmarket 16th arrondissement of Paris while he was playing in PSG's Ligue 1 match against Nantes at the nearby Parc des Princes.

The thieves are believed to have got away with items worth hundreds of thousands of euros.

Last month, burglars broke into the apartment of striker Eric Maxim Choupo-Moting while he was in action for PSG against Liverpool in the Champions League. On that occasion, a police source said thieves escaped with loot worth around 600,000 euros. In December 2017, the Paris apartment of then PSG coach Unai Emery was burgled as his team played Strasbourg in the French Cup.-- AFP
