

## World leaders consider polls a success: CEC

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) KM Nurul Huda yesterday said the December 30 national election was recognised as successful by world leaders.

“No country or international organisation made any negative comment over the polls. It is our victory,” CEC claimed in a post polls views-exchange meeting with the commission’s top officials at the EC secretariat in Dhaka.

The CEC also praised EC officials including Secretary Helal Uddin Ahmed for his role in holding the 11th parliamentary election.

“The message that Bangladesh held a free and fair election has reached every nook and corner of the world and no one has rejected the polls,” CEC claimed.

During the meeting, CEC also called upon all the officials of the commission to prepare for the upcoming upazila election.

## Dr Mashiur passes away

His relatives, friends and well-wishers have been requested to attend his kulkhwani, to be held tomorrow (Saturday) after Asr prayers at Eastern Point Auditorium at Shantinagar.

Born in Porrah in Manikganj, Dr MR Khan retired as the director general of Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies (BIDS).

# Father, son killed in road accident

At least four persons, including three of the same family were killed in separate road accidents in Tangail and Faridpur districts yesterday.

In Faridpur, three persons were killed and another was injured on Majkandi-Bhatiapar road in Boalmari upazila, reports our local correspondent.

The deceased were identified as Kashim Mollah, his brother Aku Mollah, 40, and Kashim’s son Sohel Mollah, 15, said AKM Shamim, officer-in-charge of Boalmari Police Station.

The accident took place at Bonchaki intersection in the upazila, when a local bus collided head-on with the motorbike the trio was riding on, police said quoting locals.

The collision left the three men seriously injured. Locals rescued and rushed them to Boalmari Upazila Health Complex, where Aku and Sohel were declared dead on arrival.

However, Kashim was shifted to Faridpur Medical College Hospital for treatment, where he later succumbed to his injuries, said OC Shamim, adding, the bus has been seized.

**ONE KILLED, 10 HURT IN TANGAIL**

An unidentified woman was killed and 10 others were injured in Kalihati upazila on Dhaka-Tangail highway yesterday, reports our Tangail correspondent.

The accident took place at Elenga around 9am, when a Sirajganj-bound bus collided head on with a sand-laden truck, leaving the unidentified female bus passenger dead on spot and 10 others hurt, Pronab Kumar Sarkar, a sergeant of Elenga highway police told the Daily Star.

After the incident, police, fire service and civil defence personnel rushed to the spot, rescued the injured and took them to Tangail General Hospital.

No further details were known immediately.

## HC rejects petition

was the Jatiya Party candidate for the constituency, told The Daily Star that he would move the petition before another HC bench on Sunday.

In the petition filed on January 1, Advocate Eunus sought an HC directive upon the Election Commission (EC) to cancel the result of Dhaka-8, citing irregularities.

According to the petition, Eunus also prayed to the HC to order EC not to include Rashed Khan Menon as the elected candidate in the gazette notification.

Menon, the grand alliance candidate of Dhaka-8, won the December 30 general election from the constituency.

Citing the petition, Advocate Eunus said agents of all parties except Awami League were not allowed in the polling centres during the election. The voter turnout was very low, but the result said the opposite, he said.

He also said Rashed Khan Menon is the president of Bangladesh Workers Party and his party’s election symbol is “sickle”. But he ran the race with Awami League’s election symbol “boat”, breaching the Representation of People Order (RPO).

land spending Tk 41.36 lakh and another three-storey building on another 2.5-decimal land for Tk 22.66 lakh.

The ACC in its investigation found that Kamal’s father did not have the ability to make the “deed of gift” and the money spent on the property was earned by Kamal through “illegal means”.

In addition, to dodge the anti-graft body, Kamal in his wealth statement mentioned that he took a loan of Tk 28 lakh from Delta Brac Housing Finance Corporation for constructing a building.

But ACC found that the construction of the building was completed before 2003. He took the loan in two phases in 2011 and 2013 and paid it off in 2015.

“To bring his illegal wealth in a legal framework, he took those loans,” reads the FIR.

Kamal took another loan of Tk 45 lakh from the company in 2015 but did not mention it in the wealth statement submitted before the ACC.

Kamal’s total wealth stands at Tk 1.34 crore but his salary, bank interest and previous savings between 1986 and April 2016 would be Tk 17.26 lakh.

After deduction, his wealth would be Tk 1.17 crore, which he earned beyond the known source of income.

Meanwhile, ACC filed another case against one Monirul Islam Khan, assistant personal secretary of BNP leader and former mayor Sadeque Hossain Khoka, for amassing wealth worth Tk 1.52 crore beyond the known source of income and for giving false declaration of having a debt of Tk 36.21 lakh.

The case was filed with Ramna Police Station.

Both Kamal and Monirul could not be contacted over the phone for comments, despite repeated attempts.

Mission International College on Iqbal Road in Mohammadpur, was killed at their flat on March 30, 2015.

Sitangshu, their 14-year-old daughter Srabani Biswas Sruti and eight-year-old daughter Arti Biswas Adity were also injured in the attack.

According to the case statement, on the night of March 30, the killer entered the flat of Sitangshu to belatedly greet him on his birthday. He then hit Sitangshu’s head with a hammer after drugging him with contaminated juice.

As Krishna wanted to save her husband, the killer hacked her with a kitchen knife and later set her on fire. She died the following day.

Victim’s brother Sudhangshu filed a murder case against Palash with Mohammadpur Police Station.

On October 8, 2015, Palash was sent to jail after his surrender before a Dhaka court seeking bail. Palash later gave a confessional statement before a magistrate.

Detectives pressed charges against Palash on May 30, 2016 while charges were framed against him on April 20, 2017.

## Govt signs PPP contract

“This landmark transaction will pave the way for a pipeline of national expressways across Bangladesh,” he added.

Head of ADB’s Office of Public-Private Partnership (OPPP) Yoji Morishita said, “ADB aims to accelerate road development in Bangladesh while minimising the financing and operational burden and bringing in a diverse set of internationally renowned infrastructure developers, operators, and financial institutions.”

“The Government of Bangladesh establishes the objectives of the infrastructure as well as some credit supports to tackle the traffic challenge, while the private sector takes responsibility for meeting the objectives. The Dhaka Bypass is the first step in our strategy to bring Bangladesh roads to the global market based on the PPP model,” he added.

ADB’s OPPP also provided legal support for this transaction and helped develop a concession contract template for road PPPs through the Asia Pacific Project Preparation Facility (AP3F), a multi-donor trust fund managed by ADB.

The Government of Bangladesh will offer viability gap funding of Tk 3.1 billion and a minimum revenue guarantee to the consortium to optimise the cost of financing. The contract also provides the government with a share of revenues generated by the consortium over a certain threshold.

ADB has been working with the Government of Bangladesh for over five years to transform the country’s roads by making them a bankable asset class attractive to international investors, as has happened in other sectors such as the independent power producer sector.

ADB’s OPPP is also the transaction advisor to PPPA on the 13.5km Rampura-Amulia-Demra Expressway in Dhaka, and in December 2018 was appointed transaction advisor for the approximately 210km Dhaka Chattogram Expressway, the busiest road artery for passenger and freight in the country.

ADB has long supported PPPs and in 2014 established the OPPP to provide independent transactional advice and develop broader PPP knowledge and expertise in the region.

ADB has also pioneered the AP3F, a \$73 million trust fund supported by the governments of Japan, Canada and Australia, to provide project preparation, project definition, and capacity-building support to governments for PPP projects.

The USAID Feed the Future Livestock Production for Improved Nutrition project in Bangladesh is implemented by ACDI/VOCA. The five-year project aims to impact rural household nutrition, incomes, and livestock markets for male and female livestock farmers. The project's geographic focus is **USAID's Feed the Future Zone of influence (ZOI)**, which covers 20 districts of **Barishal, Dhaka, and Khulna divisions** as well as the Resilience **Focus Areas of Cox's Bazar and Bandarban** districts of the Chattogram Division.


The project works to increase livestock productivity among producers through increased access to better livestock management practices and healthcare services; improved access of rural households to high-quality food to enhance nutrition and health status, especially among women and children; and improved nutrition-related behaviors of rural households. The project also focuses on linking the value chain actors to ensure appropriate incentives in the market. The Livestock and Nutrition project shall address opportunities and constraints associated with the beef cattle, dairy, and livestock value chains described in Annex A in the RFA.

Qualified and capable Bangladeshi entities are invited to submit applications that (1) improve market actors' capacity to provide high-quality inputs and livestock extension services; (2) support input and output market actors develop innovative business models that increase sourcing and selling of livestock products; and (3) increase consumption of meat and dairy products, improving nutritional status of women and children through a social and behavior change communication (SBCC) campaign

ACDI/VOCA anticipates awarding approximately six to eight grants to fund successful applications submitted in response to this request for applications (RFA). The length of the projects under the grant is six months to a maximum of one year. The total amount of funding currently available for this RFA is approximately 300,000 USD.
