The 76th Golden Globes for films and television, chosen by the Hollywood Foreign Press Association, were presented at a grand event recently, hosted by actors Sandra Oh and Andy Samberg. In films, *Bohemian Rhapsody* took home the award for Best Drama, while *Green Book* won the top honour in the Comedy or Musical category. The star of *Bohemian Rhapsody*, Rami Malek, won the award for Best Actor (Drama) for bringing the aura and flamboyance of Freddie Mercury to life.

In the television arena, *The Americans* won the top honour as the Best Drama Series, while brilliantly in the Queen biopic, while Glen Close took home the award for Best Actress for her performance in *The Wife*. Christian Bale and Olivia Coleman won the awards for Best Actor and Actress (Comedy or Musical) for their performances in *Vice* and *The Favourite* respectively. Lady Gaga, who made her film debut with *A Star Is Born*, received the Best Original Song award, along with her co-lyricists, for the track, *Shallow*, from the same film.

In the television arena, *The Americans* won the top honour as the Best Drama Series,

while the Netflix series, *The Kominsky Method*, won the award for Best Comedy or Musical. Meanwhile, co-host Sandra Oh won the Best Actress (Drama) award for her performance in *Killing Eve*. Oh is the first female of Asian descent in 39 years to win a Golden Globe as best leading actor. She paid tribute to the slew of Golden Globe-nominated films and TV shows featuring black and Asian actors and directors, including *Crazy Rich Asians*, *Black Panther*, and *BlackKklansman*. In addition, Richard Madden received the award for Best Actor in a Drama Series for *Bodyguard*.

The troupe wrapped up the *jugalbandi* styled recital performing Ravi Shankar's piece from the Concert for Bangladesh, which was held at the Madison Square Garden, in USA during the Liberation War of Bangladesh. The *kirtan* inspired recital was embellished with a flute piece by Md Moniruzzaman.

The performance, weaving together folk and classical melodies, truly left an impression on music lovers from both Dhaka and Kolkata as Bickram Ghosh predicted prior to the performance.

Popular band Chandrabindu set off their performance with the songs *Bhindeshi Tara*, *Bondhu Chol* and *Bondhu Tomaye E Gaan Shonabo*.

Pandit Ajoy Chakrabarty wrapped up the festival starting off with Tagore's *Amar Matha Noto Kore Dao Hey*. The maestro later performed several ragabased classics including *Sobai Amra Tomar Bagane Eksathay Photo Phul*, *Ami Sur-e-Ogo Tomaye Chhaye Jai* and the famous composition, *Ghum Ashej Na*.

Bengal Group, Bandhan Bank, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry, and Nothing Beyond Cinema jointly organised the festival.

## 'Iti, Tomari Dhaka' to open Jaipur International Film Festival 2019

Bangladesh's first anthology film, *Iti, Tomari Dhaka*, is set to open the 11th edition of the Jaipur International Film Festival (JIFF) on January 18, in Jaipur, India. The film features an assortment of shorts by eleven exceptionally promising, young directors from the Bangladeshi film fraternity, with Dhaka as its central theme. The directors include Abdullah Al Noor, Golam Kibria Farooki, Krishnendu Chattopadhyay, Mahmudul Islam, Md Robiul Alam, Mir Mukarram Hossain, Nuhash Humayun, Rahat Rahman, Syed Ahmed Shawki, Syed Saleh Ahmed Sobhan and Tanvir Ahsan.

"Working on *Iti, Tomari Dhaka* was definitely a great learning experience for me as an individual filmmaker," said Syed Ahmed Shawki. "But I believe the collaborative effort amongst the entire team is what made the film deserve its world premiere at the 23rd Busan International Film Festival last year and the opening of the 11th Jaipur International Film Festival to be held next week."

At the moment, the film is awaiting censorship approval for its release in Bangladesh.

"There have been plenty of Bangladeshi films which made it to the international film scene in recent years, but what sets *Iti, Tomari Dhaka* apart is its main character – Dhaka city," said Nuhash Humayun. "The

film comprises all eleven directors' individual perspectives on our beloved Dhaka city, displaying a range of emotions including love, pain, joy, fear, anger and frustration. It is a grand honour to be placing Dhaka under the spotlight at the opening of the Jaipur International Film Festival 2019."
