Climate change may cause shortfall in food production

Adaptation must, says Prof Ainun Nishat

Unless adaptation is initiated, climate change is going to cause shortfall in the country's food production in near future, said climate expert Prof Ainun Nishat at a conference in the capital yesterday.

The foremost challenge in the climate change process is that it is going to turn the weather pattern erratic, said Nishat, professor emeritus at Centre for Climate Change and Environmental Research of Brac University.

Citing the incident of shortfall in the country's monsoon paddy production due to floods mid last year, Prof Nishat said that despite Bangladesh's self-sufficiency in food production, the government had to import rice due to last year's deficit.

Trucker responsible for injuring actress Ahona arrested

Police yesterday arrested the trucker responsible for injuring television and film actress Ahona Rahman Lucky following a scuffle with her at Uttara-7 in Dhaka on Wednesday.

The driver, Sumon Mia, 27, was arrested in Ashulia around 4:30am, on information from his 16-year-old helper, who was held in Uttara on Friday night, Abdur Razzak, inspector (investigation) of Uttara West Police Station, told The Daily Star.

"We have sent the helper to court where he gave confessional statement under section-164, accepting that they tried to drive the truck over Ahona," said Razzak. He said the trucker will be produced before court today.

Truck hit by two trains at Moghbazar level crossing

Rail communication disrupted for 2 hours

A truck was hit by two trains, one after another, at a level crossing in the capital's Moghbazar area yesterday, disrupting rail communication for more than two hours.

The incident happened at Wireless Gate area around 5am, said railway police.

The vehicle came to a halt right on a railway track due to mechanical reasons and the driver could not restart it even after repeated attempts, said Yasin Faroque, officer-in-charge of Dhaka Railway Police Station.

By that time, a train was approaching the

spot, prompting the driver and his helper to get off the truck, said Yasin.

Eventually, the Dhaka-bound train "Upakul Express" from Sylhet passed through the level crossing hitting the vehicle, said the OC.

Then, the truck was pushed to another rail track, said the police officer.

Minutes later, another train bound for Mymensingh from the capital's Kamalapur station hit it, said OC Yasin.

The rail communication remained suspended until the authorities removed the wreckage of the truck around 7:30am, he said.

The driver and helper were not found on the spot.
