LEGITIMACY OF MOBILE COURTS

## SC decision stuck in limbo for 11 months

Nearly a year after it set a hearing date, the Supreme Court is yet to hear and settle the government's appeals against the High Court verdict that declared the rules under which executive magistrates run mobile courts to be unconstitutional.

The apex court was scheduled to hear on the petitions on February 13 last year. As the decision remains stuck in legal limbo for 11 months, mobile courts under executive magistrates are continuing to operate in the country.

The HC had on May 11, 2017 declared

unconstitutional the rules under which executive magistrates run mobile courts, after hearing on three writ petitions. In the verdict, the HC had observed that empowering executive magistrates with

judicial powers is "a frontal attack on the independence of the judiciary and is violative of the theory of separation of powers", and said mobile courts can be run by judicial or metropolitan magistrates.

It had declared unconstitutional 11 sections of the Mobile Court Act 2009 on empowerment of executive magistrates and process of running mobile courts, their powers to convict and sentence offenders, district magistrates' powers to run mobile courts, provision of

appeal against mobile court orders and government powers to amend schedule of the act.

Deputy Attorney General Motaher Hossain Sazu told The Daily Star last week that said the Appellate Division had earlier stayed the HC verdict, thus allowing executive magistrates to run mobile courts; the stay order would remain valid until the government's appeals were disposed of, he said.

Barrister Hassan MS Azim, who moved the writ petitions on which the HC delivered the verdict, told this paper that on January 16, 2018, the SC extended its stay order on the HC verdict until disposal of the appeals.

The same day, the SC had allowed the government to move three leave-to-appeal petitions challenging the HC verdict, and set February 13 for hearing on those.

A five-member bench of the Appellate Division headed by Justice Md Abdul Wahhab Miah, then performing as acting chief justice, passed the order after granting the petitions. Justice Wahhab Miah resigned from the

post of a judge of the Appellate Division, hours after Justice Syed Mahmud Hossain was appointed as chief justice on February 2.

The appeals were not heard on as they were not included in the Appellate Division's cause list, DAG Sazu told The Daily Star.

## Ensure no one is harassed: Shajahan to factory owners

Former Shipping Minister Shajahan Khan, convener of Garments Workers' Coordination Committee, yesterday urged readymade garments factory owners to accept and implement the revised wage structure for workers that came after eight days of unrest in the

"The problems in the RMG sector can be solved through dialogue," he said at a press conference arranged at Shadhinota Hall in Segunbagicha yesterday.

Shajahan called the press brief following the agitation across the RMG sector that started on January 6 over the

disparity in the wage structure. "Factory owners should try to find out the reasons behind the dissatisfaction among workers, instead of trying to dig

up local and foreign conspiracies behind this," he said at the press conference.

These problems can be solved through discussions with the trade union and participatory committee at the factory level, Shajahan said.

"We would like to call upon the garment factory owners to be considerate towards their workers and to ensure that no one is harassed," he added. He said there is a disagreement

between RMG workers and owners on the salary structure of the new wage board which was put into effect on December 1, 2018.

RMG workers rejected the pay structure in certain grades as the salaries were not consistent with current market prices.

After nearly one and a half months of protests, the government has revised the pay structure for the garments

industry workers, giving raises between Tk 15 to Tk 786.

WHAT WAS THE ISSUE?

The workers alleged that the monthly wage in the seventh grade increased to Tk 8,000 from Tk 5,300 as per the gazette published by the government last year but the salaries of workers in other grades did not increase at the same rate.

The salary hike for entry-level workers was more than that of their senior operators, who have been working for over seven to eight years. Major disparity in the salary hike was noticed for third and fourth grade workers, as they also received a smaller raise than that of entry-level workers.

In most of the grades other than the seventh, only Tk 500 was raised in the new salary structure, whereas an entrylevel worker's salary had increased by

## Prime accused Apu sent to jail

COURT CORRESPONDENT A Dhaka court yesterday sent Mia Nuruddin Ahmed Apu to jail in a case filed for allegedly instigating violence and distributing money to influence the December 30

national election. Metropolitan Magistrate Md Shahidul Islam passed the order after CID Inspector Ashraful Islam produced Apu before the court after expiration of the five-day remand.

The magistrate also rejected a petition filed by the defence counsel seeking bail for Apu.

In yesterday's forwarding report, Inspector Ashraful said Apu gave important information about the

allegations brought against him. Rab members arrested Apu on January 4 from United Hospital in the capital, where he had been

undergoing treatment since

December 24 last year. Earlier on January 10, the former assistant personal secretary to BNP acting chairman Tarique Rahman was placed on a five-day remand in connection with the

Four persons including Apu, a Jatiya Oikyafront candidate in Shariatpur-3, were accused in the case filed with Motijheel Police

Station. On December 25 last year, Rab detained three persons -- Joynal Abedin, Alamgir Hossain and Ali Haider -- in Dhaka with Tk 8 crore in cash and several cheques worth

around Tk 10 crore. On Apu's instructions, the trio was distributing money to influence the national election and instigate violence, Rab claimed.

### Biman cuts Hajj flight fare

Biman Bangladesh Airlines yesterday reduced the fare of Hajj flights by Tk 10,191.

Pilgrims willing to go to Makkah will have to pay Tk 1,28,000. Last year, the national flag carrier carried half of the pilgrims from Bangladesh.

State Minister for Religious Affairs Sheikh Md Abdullah made the price cut announcement after an inter-ministry meeting with Civil Aviation and Tourism Ministry in Dhaka. "The fare has been

reduced after considering the welfare of the pilgrims," he said, adding that Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is very sincere about it.

Sheikh Md Abdullah said his ministry would provide all sorts of assistance for proper Hajj management.

# Cause for heartburn for both govt and EC: Rizvi

BNP yesterday lauded the Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB) study over irregularities in the December 30 national election and said it was a "cause for heartburn" for both the government and the Election Commission.

"The government's ministers and the Election Commission have been failing to hide their faces in shame as TIB has unveiled the absolute truth about vote rigging," BNP's Senior Joint Secretary General Ruhul Kabir Rizvi Ahmed said yesterday.

Speaking at a press conference at the party's Nayapaltan central office in Dhaka, Rizvi said now their [the government and EC] efforts to conceal the truth has gone in vain as people are informed of everything that transpired the day before national election.

surveyed at random. Rizvi, also the spokesperson of BNP, said different international organisations have come up with reports on vote rigging in the December 30 national election while sev-

eral democratic countries termed the election questionable. "They did not recognise the fake election; they even demanded investigation into the allegation of vote rigging. World leaders have also described the election as the worst in history," the BNP

leader said. Mentioning that people sacrificed their lives for the country's independence, Rizvi said they [people] will do the same, if necessary, for the sake of their voting rights and TIB, in its study on Tuesday, said electoral democracy.
