Govt to recruit more teachers: Dipu Moni

Education Minister Dipu Moni yesterday said the government will recruit more teachers, ensuring transparency in its effort to reduce shortage of educators at educational institutions.

"One of the problems at educational institutions is shortage of teachers. Transparency will be ensured in recruiting new teachers," Dipu Moni said while addressing a programme on the occasion of 50th anniversary of Haimchar Government Boys High School in Chandpur.

The newly appointed education minister also said the government had resolved various problems plaguing educational institutions and developed relevant infrastructure.

Major improvements took place in the education sector in the last 10 years but there are still some issues, she said, adding that the government is addressing those issues one after another since it is impossible to resolve all of them at one go.

Deputy Inspector General Nibas Chandra Majhi, Chandpur Additional Deputy Commissioner Md Moinul Hossain, Additional Superintendent of Police Md Mizanur Rahman, among others, spoke at the programme.

# Innovation that empowers

Govt's a2i stall showcasing products for people with disabilities at Dhaka trade fair

At first glance, it looks like an ordinary auto-rickshaw with three wheels.

Upon closer inspection, it seems a bit different. The vehicle has only one handlebar and one seat instead of two behind it, which gives an impression that it's either defective or unfinished.

The lone handlebar also provides a mounting place for controls such as brake, throttle, clutch and horn. The vehicle runs on solar energy instead of battery.

This auto-rickshaw is specially designed for people with physical disabilities and it's being displayed at the month-long Dhaka International Trade Fair.

Amid the array of stalls, Access to Information (a2i) programme under the government's ICT divi-



sion is showcasing the vehicle called "Solar Powered Tri-Cycle".

A total of 10 items, designed and developed under the programme, are being exhibited at this year's trade fair. Not just for people with disabilities, some items can be used by all for everyday purposes.

The products are being

showcased to let people know of the government's initiative in this regard, according to the authorities concerned.

"If anyone wants to buy these, they can leave their contact information and we'll get in touch with them," said Zakir Hossain, a staffer at the stall. He said the government took this initiative to inspire youths in generating ideas that can contribute to the country's development.

There is an option on the a2i

website for people to pitch their ideas, he said. The stall is also displaying a

device that looks like a smart phone, developed for people with speech impairment. It uses touch screen technology and a user can avail various services through it.

The device has several preset directions (in text format) stored inside, which a user can choose upon need. For example, if a speech-impaired person needs to use bathroom or wants medical assistance, he or she can select an already built-in instruction from it.

The device would then read it aloud for others to listen and SEE PAGE 4 COL 6

Even a decade back, the around fivebigha pond in the capital's Gandaria was a source of fresh water for the residents, but the waterbody is in death throes now due to sheer negligence of the authorities con-

cerned. The pond used to provide a muchneeded respite to the residents from the jaded city life. It used to be surrounded by various trees. Over the last 20 years, locals planted many of those

fresh, dirty. "For the last seven years, due to the water's worsening quality, no one has been using the pond anymore," said Anisur Rahman, a local.

Jesmin Sultana, an elderly resident, said she and her sister used to swim in the waterbody around 25 years back. "We used to have so much fun swimming there during the warm summer days. Our children can't even imagine that nowadays. To them, it's just a dirty waterbody."

### Tk 2,000cr project for non-stop power supply to Dhaka, N'ganj mented, DPDC will be able to build

UNB, Dhaka

A move is underway to implement a Tk 2,000 crore project to ensure uninterrupted power supply to Dhaka's central and south-west zones and major parts of Narayanganj within the next three years.

According to official sources, Dhaka Power Distribution Company Ltd (DPDC) has undertaken the project to implement it during the 2019-2022 period as part of its development programme.

"Once the project is imple-

power distribution system to ensure non-stop electricity supply to consumers living in major parts of the two cities," DPDC Executive Director Ramiz Uddin told the news agency.

He said the project got the approval of the Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (Ecnec) on November 7 last year, which was its last meeting under the previous government.
