Shitol gives Abahani winning start

Young forward Faisal Ahmed Shitol came off the bench to rescue Abahani once again as the defending champions' bid for a hattrick of titles began with a 2-1 win over new-

comers NoFel SC in the opening match of the 11th Bangladesh Premier League at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

Shitol -- who also gave Abahani a winning start in the Independence Cup by coming off the bench and scoring a brace against Muktijoddha Sangsad -- was deployed up front with the match heading towards a 1-1 draw with eight minutes left.

And the 22-year-old repaid the faith, perfectly connecting with a Rubel Mia cross on the sixyard box, to seal victory three minutes from time. Although NoFel goalkeeper Appel Mahmud stopped the header with one hand, he did so from behind the goalline, prompting the referee to whistle for a goal.

Rubel had earlier put Abahani ahead in the

eighth minute before Kamrul Islam evened things in stoppage time of the first half thanks to a lapse from Abahani's defenders.

"I'm really happy to repay the faith the coach placed on me," said former BKSP student Shitol, who seems habituated to scoring goals. He struck 14 goals in the 3rd Division Football League for BKSP before netting seven for Victoria SC in the Bangladesh Championship

League. Before joining Abahani last season, Shitol played for now-relegated Feni Soccer and Uttar Baridhara Club.

"Playing in the starting eleven is the team management's decision. Every player dreams of starting games and I am no exception. If I get a chance in the playing eleven, I'll try to do something better because I will get more time on the field to show my potential," said Shitol, who

played just his third match for Abahani, all as a substitute, this season.

Abahani coach Mario Lemos lavished praise on Shitol after admitting that his charges were a bit rusty.

"It is a chance for a player and Shitol grabbed it for the second time. Honestly he has been better in practice sessions and that is the most important thing. He has a good sense of positioning in the box and he is really smart in the danger-zone. He got one change and scored the goal," said Lemos, adding that Abahani needed two or three more games to adjust to the pace.

In the day's second match, newcomers Bashudhara Kings also made a winning start by handing a 1-0 defeat to last season's runners-up Sheikh Jamal DC under lights.

Brazilian forward Marcos Vinicius separated the sides in the 69th minute by scoring from a cut-back from Costa Rican forward Daniel Colindres. It was a keenly contested affair where both teams created some good opportunities but in the end, it was Independence Cup champions Bashundhra who had the last laugh.

Sharapova stuns Wozniacki

Maria Sharapova stunned defending champion Caroline Wozniacki to sweep into the Australian Open last 16 Friday and join ice men Rafael Nadal and Roger Federer, who clinically disposed of their opponents.

The Russian five-time Grand Slam winner, who has struggled since returning from a drugs ban in 2017, was at full throttle in ending the Dane's dream of a second major title.

Sharapova won 6-4, 4-6, 6-3 with the roof closed on Rod Laver Arena and will next play in-form local hope Ashleigh Barty, who bounced Greece's Maria Sakkari, for a berth in the quarter-finals. "I thought the level was quite high. I knew

it would be a tough match," said the 2008 champion, who has been in sizzling form at the tournament as she chases her first Slam title since Roland Garros in 2014.

Australian Alex de Minaur "one of the best in the world" ahead of their evening clash, then proceeded to hand him a tennis lesson, dismantling the teenager 6-1, 6-2, 6-4. "I hit a good serve and played a solid

Slam crown. On a rain-affected day that delayed play on outside courts, the 37-year-old showed no mercy to the 21-year-old in his 100th match on the centre court in Melbourne.

"I had a really good feeling out here today against someone who can be dangerous," said Federer after reaching the Melbourne fourth round for the 17th time -- more than anyone else ever.

"Taylor played really well. He is going to have many more years on tour playing at this

The double defending champion is gunning for a record seventh Australian title. If he goes on to win the tournament, he will become the first man ever to claim seven or more crowns at two Slams, having already won eight Wimbledons.

Next up for him is fiery Greek 14th seed Stefanos Tsitsipas, who beat Georgia's 19th seed Nikoloz Basilashvili 6-3, 3-6, 7-6 (9/7), 6-4. The man who lost to Federer in the final

last year, Marin Cilic, battled back from two sets down, surviving two match points to beat Spain's Fernando Verdasco in a 4hr 18min epic. Germany's second seed Angelique Kerber,

the 2016 title winner, steamrolled Australian youngster Kimberley Birrell 6-1, 6-0 as the Wimbledon champions continued her under-the-radar progress. Meanwhile, unseeded American Amanda

Anisimova continued her dream run, ousting 11th seed Aryna Sabalenka in straight sets. The "These types of matches are what I train 17-year-old will play eighth seed Petra Kvitova for a place in the quarter-finals. Russia's Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova also

Gattuso was punished for "shouting at the referee in a threatening manner and challenging his decisions, as well as having subsequently, while waiting for the prize-giving ceremony, addressed further offensive words and insinuations towards the referee". -- AFP

Master finisher Mahendra Singh Dhoni eased India to a seven-wicket victory to clinch their one-day international series

against Australia in Melbourne on Friday. The unflappable veteran wicketkeeper hit his third half-century of the three-game series to again prove

the difference after his match-winning knock in the second game in Adelaide. The 37-year-old wicketkeeperbatsman kept his usual cool during an unbeaten 87 off 114 balls as India chased

down Australia's 230 with four balls to spare at the Melbourne Cricket Ground. It consummated a hugely-successful tour of Australia where Virat Kohli's team also claimed an historic first-ever

2-1 Test series win Down Under. "It's been an amazing tour for us. We drew the T20 series, won the Test

and the ODI series," Kohli said. "We are feeling confident and bal-

anced as a side with the World Cup in mind." Dhoni was given tremendous sup-

port from Kedar Jadhav with a belligerent unbeaten 61 from 57 balls in a match-winning 121-run stand. "I am happy to bat at any number,"

Girls to come under salary structure

The Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) is set to bring 36 female footballers under a salary structure starting this month after the game's governing body yesterday sat with the footballers' parents to reach an

agreement at the BFF House. 51 footballers from the U-15 to U-18 category and one senior player have been undergoing long-term training under the BFF's supervision and 36 are expected to put pen to paper on one-year contracts until December 2019. Dhaka Bank Ltd last year signed an agreement with the BFF to sponsor all

the women's national teams. "Today [Friday] we discussed the matter with the girls' parents. We are going to bring 36 players under a salary structure for one year. We will provide details about the salary range once we finalise the agreement with the players," said BFF women's committee chairman Mahfuza Akter Kiron.

She informed that the players would be paid in three categories on the basis of their performance and that wages may be revised based on a player's performance during renewal.

"We made the parents understand that not all players will get equal salary as they are being given contracts based on performance," said Kiran. BFF president Kazi

Salahuddin thanked the parents for providing support to their daughters as well as the game's governing body and sought the continuation of such support in the future.
