

Five raped

hospital. The girl's mother filed a case later that night.

The boy was arrested later and he confessed before a court yesterday evening that he raped the girl, said police.

The court sent him to the juvenile correction centre in Gazipur, said Saleh Ahmed Pathan, officer-in-charge of Dagonbhuian Police Station.

In Noakhali, a mother of three was allegedly gang raped in Kabirhat upazila early yesterday.

The woman's husband, a BNP activist, is now in jail, police said, adding that a suspect was arrested.

The woman said seven men broke into her village home around 1:30am while she and her three children were asleep.

Holding the children hostage at knifepoint, the men tied her hands and legs and three of them raped her. The men also took away the valuables from her house, she told The Daily Star.

She recognised one of the alleged rapists and filed a case accusing him and several unnamed men, said Mirza Hasan, OC of Kabirhat Police Station.

Police yesterday arrested the accused Jahir Hossain, 29.

The woman has been admitted to Noakhali General Hospital.

On December 30 midnight, a mother of four was gang raped allegedly by Awami League men for voting for "sheaf of paddy", the BNP's electoral symbol, in Subarnachar upazila of the district.

On Friday night, a garment worker was allegedly abducted and gang raped in Birampur upazila of Dinajpur.

The 22-year-old woman was going to her grandfather's home around 5:00pm when she was abducted, police quoted her as saying.

When she did not reach the grandfather's home on time, the family started looking for her.

Her family members found her unconscious at a litchi orchard around 10:00pm.

After regaining consciousness at a hospital, the woman told police that she was abducted and raped by five men.

She recognised one of them and told police about him.

Mithun Sarkar, assistant superintendent of police in Dinajpur, said the victim filed a case accusing five and police were looking for them.

In Faridpur, a 14-year-old girl was allegedly raped by her neighbour in the town early yesterday.

The girl told police that she was forcibly taken to the roof of a two-storey building and raped by her neighbour Obaidullah, 20, around 1:00am.

"My daughter told me about it in the morning. Then I went to police," her mother told The Daily Star.

The girl is now undergoing treatment at Faridpur Medical College Hospital.

Also on Friday, a 13-year-old girl was allegedly raped by two young men in Barishal's Muladi upazila.

Her mother told The Daily Star that she was playing near their village home when she was abducted and raped by Saidul, 20, and another 15-year-old boy.

Ziaul Haasan, OC of Muladi Police Station, said the girl was sent to Barishal Sher-E-Bangla Medical College Hospital.

Rajshahi Medical College Hospital, said Rajshahi's Deputy Commissioner (DC) SM Abdul Kader.

Two other officials of the Land Office -- Rajib and Shamsul -- received minor injuries and were given first aid, he added.

Sanjay Kumar Pal, medical officer of Bagha Health Complex, said Imrul's injuries were severe.

"His face was bloodied when he was brought to us. He had a cut on his forehead and injury marks on his head, and around the eye, nose and other body parts," he said, adding that Imrul's driver needed a few stitches on his nose.

The attackers snatched the AC land's smartphone.

Locals said they face the problem of river erosion due to the illegal sand mining, adding that Nawshad Ali, brother-in-law of former Bagha municipality mayor and Awami League leader Akkas Ali, was involved in the illegal activity for several months.

Contacted, Bagha AL General Secretary Ashraful Islam said Nawshad had no connection with the AL.

"None of the attackers will be spared," DC Kader said, adding that police have deployed several teams to arrest the attackers.

The UNO said a case was filed with Bagha Police Station in this regard.

Hospital in Dhaka for the last two months.

On December 10 last year, he went to Singapore for treatment and returned on December 26, just three days before the 11th parliamentary election.

Ershad was elected as an MP from Rangpur 3, even though he could not carry out any election campaign.

The JP took part in the December 30 election as part of the ruling grand alliance and bagged 22 seats.

Ershad made his last public appearance on January 6 during the oath-taking ceremony of the lawmakers in the House.

In a statement on January 4, Ershad said his party men would sit on the opposition and he would act as the leader of the opposition, contradicting the JP Parliamentary Party (JPPP) decision.

JPPP on January 3, unanimously decided to join the government instead of sitting on the opposition bench.

Ershad's sudden decision surprised and aggrieved his party lawmakers.

Talking to The Daily Star, a number of JP lawmakers termed his decision as "funny and a violation of the party charter."

Some JP lawmakers also said that GM Quader's leadership in absence of Ershad might face challenge as a section of MPs were loyal to JP Senior Co-Chairperson Raushan Ershad.

Raushan was in favour of joining the government, they added.

Against this backdrop, Ershad in a statement on Friday said that GM Quader will act as the party chief in his absence.

The appointment already came into effect, the statement said.

funding following a Valentine's Day appeal last year to help find Romeo his Juliet.

"It is an incredible feeling to know that thanks to everyone who believes in true love and donated for Valentine's Day last year, we have already found a mate for Romeo and can establish a conservation breeding program with more than a single pair," said Teresa Camacho, the museum's chief of herpetology and the expedition leader.

Romeo had been found in that same cloud forest a decade ago and it was feared that he was the last survivor in his species.

With a lifespan of 15 years, time was running out to find Romeo a mate to ensure the survival of the species, although the frog himself never gave up hope, continuing to call out for a mate during his 10 years in captivity.

In a statement, GWC said "the bachelor's luck is about to change drastically."

"Now the real work begins: We know how to successfully care for this species in captivity, but now we will learn about its reproduction, while also getting back into the field to better understand if any more frogs may be left and if so, how many, where they are, and more about the threats they face," added Camacho.

"With this knowledge we can develop strategies to mitigate the threats to the species' habitat, while working on a long-term plan to return Romeo's future babies to their wild home, preventing the extinction of the Sehuencas water frog."

The group of frogs has been placed in quarantine at the museum's K'ayra Center for Research and Conservation of Threatened Amphibians of Bolivia to help them acclimate to an environment that replicates the conditions they would face in the wild.

"They will also be treated for the deadly infectious disease chytridiomycosis, which is partly responsible for the steep decline of this species and other amphibians in streams where they were once found," said GWC.

Only then will Romeo meet his Juliet.

The priority now is to ensure that Juliet, who measures 55 millimeters (2.2

inches), makes a good impression on her beau, who is brown with dark spots and slightly larger at 62 millimeters.

"We want to ensure the perfect conditions for his blind date," an excited Camacho told AFP.

Reproduction is the primary goal, but Camacho says the team is in no hurry.

"We hope it will be love at first sight, but if that doesn't happen, we'll eat ice cream, watch 'The Notebook,' and try again!"

Given the success of last year's Valentine's Day appeal, when \$25,000 was raised to help fund expeditions into the forests, conservationists have decided to make February 14 the day of Romeo's blind date with Juliet.

Canada PM renews calls for Saudi blogger's release

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau renewed calls for the release of Saudi blogger Raif Badawi after meeting his wife on Friday, calling the issue "a priority" for him and all Canadians.

Trudeau said Canadians' view of Saudi Arabia had been defined in part by its treatment of Badawi, who was jailed for 10 years for insulting Islam and has received 50 lashes of 1,000 to which he was sentenced.

Badawi's wife and three children have lived in Canada since being granted asylum in 2013, a year after his jailing.

"Freeing Raif Badawi is a priority not just for me and for his family but for all Canadians," Trudeau said.

"We continue to try to convince the Saudis and apply pressure on them both behind the scenes and in public to liberate Raif Badawi," including asking for a pardon, he said.

Trudeau said he had raised the case in conversation with Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, highlighting Badawi's status as the face of Canada-Saudi relations.

The two leaders met at the G20 summit in Buenos Aires in early December.

"It's the same message that I delivered a few months earlier to the King of Saudi Arabia when we spoke" by telephone, Trudeau added.

In tears and shock, Poland bids farewell to murdered mayor

Poles will gather on Saturday in the Baltic port city of Gdansk for the funeral of murdered liberal mayor Paweł Adamowicz, whose public stabbing has raised questions about hate speech in politics in the country.

Around 3,500 people, including Polish President Andrzej Duda and EU Council President Donald Tusk, a longtime friend of Adamowicz, are due to attend the ceremony.

Duda has announced a day of national mourning.

Adamowicz, 53, was stabbed in the heart in front of hundreds of people at a charity fundraiser last weekend by an ex-convict wielding a knife.

The 27-year-old attacker, who reportedly has a history of mental illness, had previously been sentenced to more than five years in jail for armed robbery.

Recently released, the man claimed he was wrongly imprisoned by the previous government -- led by the centrist Civic Platform (PO) party, to which Adamowicz once belonged.

For many Poles, the mayor's murder cannot be solely blamed on the knifeman but also the prevalence of online hate speech and toxic divisions between the main political parties.

Chaklader Service 35 times, Laboni Enterprise 15, Mazumdar Trade International 10 and M&K Trading Company 9 times.

The fraudulence included forging signatures of customs officials and duplication of bank and customs documents.

Information on consignments imported before 2013 is not available on the custom's server. "I think the number of forgery incidents will increase if we get the previous data," an NBR official said.

According to sources, the customs authorities suspended the licence of Mozumder Trade International Ltd on February 28, 2012 for using fake documents to release goods and evade revenue of Tk 53 lakh. The authorities, however, withdrew the suspension in June of that year.

The license of MR Trade International was suspended in June, 2016 for duplicating bank documents. The punishment lasted for only eight days.

Chaklader Service had its licence suspended in November, 2016 after the authorities found evidence that it forged signatures of an assistant commissioner and a CCH revenue officer to release goods from the port.

Although a probe committee recommended scrapping the agent's licence permanently, it got away with it by paying the fine. Mozumder Trade International previously ran its business under the name M/S Neptune Trading Agency. It changed the name after it was fined for forgery.

C&F companies are responsible for importing products as representatives

of the importers. The customs authorities have the jurisdiction to issue and cancel their licences under the Customs Act-1969.

Asked, CIID officials termed the punishment handed to the three firms "too lenient" and said their licences should have been cancelled right away and those involved should have been in jail. "If that had happened, they could not dare commit forgery [that has surfaced recently] again," a CIID official said, wishing not to be named.
