## SLAIN JOURNALIST HAILED AS NATIONAL HERO

Ghanaian journalist Ahmed Hussein-Suale, who helped expose corruption in African football, was hailed a "national hero" on Friday, as his friends and family gathered for his funeral. The 34-year-old reporter was gunned down as he returned to his home in the Madina area of the capital, Accra, on Wednesday night, in a killing that sparked outrage. Hussein-Suale was part of an investigative team that lifted the lid on graft in the sport last year, which led to the sanction of a string of top officials, coaches and referees. His body, wrapped in a white shroud, was brought from a central Accra mortuary to a mosque in Madina before prayers, followed by calls for those responsible to face justice. Ghana Journalist Association president Afiel Monney told AFP: "We have lost a national hero as far as investigative journalism is concerned."

## Sparse crowds sully contest

Saif Sporting Club registered a 2-1 victory over Rahmatganj MFS in a Bangladesh Premier League match at the Rafique Uddin Bhuiyan Stadium in Mymensingh yesterday.

However, due to the tournament's lack of publicity, the tightly contested encounter was played in front of a sparse crowd at a venue which traditionally does not see much action.

Midfielder Mohammad Jabed Khan opened the scoring for Saif Sporting in the 38th minute before Mehebub Hasan doubled the lead in the first minute of the second half. Midfielder Faysal Ahmed scored the solitary goal for Rahmatganj.

After the match, local Biplob Kumar told this correspondent that an onrush of spectators could not be expected as the tournament lacked proper advertising and that only a handful of local journalists were even aware of the event.

Meanwhile, another individual spoke of how local spectators are always enthusiastic for such competitions outside Dhaka.

"Such tournaments are very enjoyable outside Dhaka and we experienced a tough contest on the pitch", said Shamim Ahmed.

Afterwards, managing director of Saif Sporting Club Md Nasiruddin Chowdhury informed that they were unable to provide mass publicity due to time constraints.

## Magalan thwarts former club

Nigerian hitman Awala Magalan ensured that Chittagong Abahani made a winning-start to their Bangladesh Premier League campaign with a single-goal win over Muktijoddha Sangsad at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

Meanwhile, Saif Sporting Club also started the season well with a 2-1 win over Rahmatganj MFS at the Rafique Uddin Bhuiyan Stadium in Mymensingh.

In Dhaka, after helping Muktijoddha derail Chittagong Abahani from last season's title race with two goals, Magalan turned villain for his former club as he sealed yesterday's victory through a freekick in the 49th minute. It is also worth mentioning that the well-built marksman took injections to heal a hamstring injury before entering the pitch.

The port-city outfit may have now avenged last season's defeat but they are still far behind Muktijoddha in terms of overall results in the professional football league, where they beat the All Reds only four times while losing nine of their

18 outings.

"We could not field our full strength side following the absence of Kyrgyzstan's Daniel Nil Tagoe while Magalan is not fully fit following his hamstring injury. However, I had believed in Magalan, who could change the match and he did it just as he did last season for Muktijoddha," said Chittagong Abahani coach Julfikar

This is the first time I made this type of freekick goal in my career. It's wonderful because I wanted to give something special to Chittagong Abahani for being able to do what I am doing today. I don't know how many goals I can score in the league but I want to see my team among the first three.

Saif SC held the upper hand till the 70th minute but then it was minnows Rahmatganj who pressed hard to reimburse one goal in stoppage time with Faisal converting a penalty after Yeasin Arafat handled the ball inside the box.

#### Salah fires Liverpool, United extend winning run

Liverpool moved seven points clear at the top of the Premier League as Mohamed Salah's double inspired a dramatic 4-3 victory over Crystal Palace, while Manchester United stretched their winning streak to seven games as they beat Brighton 2-1 on Saturday.

Jurgen Klopp's side were pushed hard by Palace but

Salah's predatory instincts and a woeful mistake from Eagles keeper Julian Speroni ensured Liverpool improved their unbeaten home league run to 32 games.

At Old Trafford, Manchester United extended their superb form since interim manager Ole Gunnar Solskjær replaced the sacked Jose Mourinho.

After a minute's applause to mark the 25th anniversary of the death of United's legendary manager Matt Busby, Solskjær's side took the lead in the 27th minute.

Gaetan Bong conceded a penalty with a foul on Paul Pogba and the France midfielder stroked home the spot-kick for his 10th goal of the season.

United winger Marcus Rashford marked his 150th game for the club with his side's second goal in the 42nd minute. -- AFP

#### Casemiro wonder goal helps Real

Casemiro's stunning long-range strike and a late goal from Luka Modric earned Real Madrid a 2-0 win over Sevilla Saturday and a much-needed boost to their flailing title challenge in La Liga.

Madrid began the day 10 points adrift of leaders Barcelona, a gap that will be restored if the Catalans defeat Leganes on Sunday, but this victory should inject a timely shot of confidence.

Casemiro's brilliant strike in the 78th minute and Modric's injury-time finish settled a cagey contest of third against fourth but Madrid were dominant in the second half and deserved more than a draw. -- AFP

## Halep sets up Serena showdown

World number one Simona Halep set up a headline last 16 showdown with Serena Williams by beating her sister Venus Saturday as Novak Djokovic's relentless drive towards more Australian Open glory cranked up another gear.

On day six at Melbourne Park, the Romanian finally hit form to pull off her best win of the year and cruise past the veteran American 6-2, 6-3.

"I was super-motivated today," she said after being taken to three sets in both her opening two matches as she bounces back from a herniated disc that ended her 2018 season early.

"I have nothing to lose," she added, looking ahead to Monday's clash against 23-time Grand Slam winner Serena. "I am playing against a great champion. It's going to be a bigger challenge but I'm ready to face it."


Williams crushed Ukrainian Dayana Yastremska 6-2, 6-1 before consoling her at the net as the teenager burst into tears.

The ominous 37-year-old, seeded 16, has dropped just nine games in her three matches so far on her first return to the tournament since winning it in 2017 while pregnant.

"I just play each match at a time, play as hard as I can and do the best I can. That really is all you can do," she said as she zeroes in on an eighth Australian title and a record-equalling 24th Slam crown.

Fourteen-time Grand Slam winner and top seed Djokovic is gunning for a record seventh Australian title.

He dropped a set for the first time this year against fast-rising Canadian Denis Shapovalov, before demolishing
