

## 'Kingpins' safe in 'safe home'

63 yaba godfathers, dealers surrender to police in Cox's Bazar; more to follow

A two-storey training centre inside the secure compound of Cox's Bazar Police Lines is now the "safe home" for 63 alleged yaba godfathers and dealers in the district.

At least 24 of them are on the government list of 73 top drug dealers in the country, said a top police official in Cox's Bazar.

Wanted in 2-16 cases, each of them had been on the run since the anti-narcotics drive began in May last year. Now though, they seem relaxed since their surrender last week.

The "yaba kingpins" include elected public representatives of local bodies and three brothers of Awami League lawmaker Abdur Rahman Bodu, who topped multiple government lists of yaba traders in the country.

Around 6:15pm yesterday, a correspondent of The Daily Star managed to take a look inside the "safe home".

Some were gossiping, while others were loitering around. Yet others were having their evening snacks brought by their family members. Money does not seem to be a problem for them.

Two constables in plainclothes were guarding the entrance, with three others on the backyard. The 1,200-sqf building has 12 rooms in its two floors.

"We are passing really good times here. We are sharing plenty of food brought by our families. Police are also behaving very well with us," one of the "inmates" told The Daily Star.

All AL units to have their own office

The ruling Awami League has decided to have around 6,000 party offices with modern facilities at all city, district, upazila, thana and municipalities headquarters, and at union levels to strengthen its organisational structure.

The party, which secured a landslide victory in the December 30 national polls and assumed state power for a third consecutive term, will finance the purchase of land and construction of offices in places where it does not currently have one, said party sources.

The offices which are already there will be modernised and equipped with the latest facilities.

## Child murder up by a quarter

Some were killed over trivial matters, says Shishu Adhikar Forum report

As many as 418 children were murdered in the country last year, up by 23.30 percent from the previous year, says a report by Bangladesh Shishu Adhikar Forum.

In 2017, at least 339 children were killed, mentions the report titled "State of Child Rights in Bangladesh 2018" unveiled in the capital's Dhaka Reporters Unity yesterday.

Analysing the reasons behind the killings, it found that in most cases, children were murdered over trivial matters, family or conjugal dispute, dowry, extramarital affair and enmity.





## Tragedy rips apart family

7 including 6 of the family killed as auto-rickshaw collides with truck

Early yesterday, Shah Alam and his family members woke up to the news that his son was stabbed and being treated at a hospital.

Worried sick, the family started for the hospital in a CNG-run auto-rickshaw but fell victim to a tragic accident on the way.

Shah Alam, 38, five of his family members and the auto-rickshaw driver were killed as the vehicle collided head-on with a goods-laden truck on the Dhaka-Raipur regional road in Laxmipur Sadar's Mandaripur Ratanpur area.

The accident around 5:00am left all those in the auto-rickshaw dead on the spot, Mohammad Shahjahan, officer-in-charge of Chandraganj Highway Police, told The Daily Star.

The victims include Shah Alam's wife Nasima Akter, 32, their sons Rubel, 3, and Amit, 15, Shah Alam's sister Shamsun Nahar, 25, sister-in-law Rokeya Begum, 29, and the driver Nur, 35. They all were from Jagadishpur area of Noakhali's Begumganj upazila.

Quoting the victims' relatives, police said unidentified criminals stabbed Shah Alam's elder son Nadim Mahmud Antor, 20, around 1:00am in Chandraganj's Sadaghara area.
