MEDICAL EXAM OF RAPE VICTIMS

Police not following HC directives

Shaila, 14, came out of the garment factory she works for in the capital's Mohammadpur Beri Bandh area and saw her ex-boyfriend Billal, employed at the same RMG unit, waiting outside.

Following repeated requests for chitchat, Shaila walked along with him into the Rayerbazar graveyard as evening descended. She had recently broken up with him after finding out that he was already married.

Surrounded by the eeriness of the graveyard, Billal then threatened to kill her if she made any sound.

Frightened to the core, Shaila did not try to flee, while Billal called in five to six other men over the phone.

They raped her near a ditch. It was Muharram that day, September 21, 2018, recalled Shaila, as she spoke to The Daily Star during her lunch break outside the garment factory in mid-December.

Although the 23-year-old Billal is in hiding, six other alleged rapists have been arrested in this connection.

Later that day, Billal himself dropped her at her home by a rickshaw. Numb with shock, Shaila took two days to gather courage and tell her mother what had happened.

Her mother immediately took her to Mohammadpur Police Station and filed a case.

Shaila, not her real name, was in police custody for two days before being taken to the Tejgaon Victim Support Centre. Spending four more days at the support centre, she got admitted to the One-stop Crisis Centre (OCC) at Dhaka

HOLEY ARTISAN ATTACK

Last accused arrested in C'nawabganj

The Rapid Action Battalion yesterday claimed to have arrested a charge-sheeted accused in the Holey Artisan attack case in Chapainawabganj's Nachole upazila.

Shariful Islam alias Khaled, 27, was picked up from Haripur area around 3:00pm. With him, all the eight charge-sheeted accused in the case have been arrested, said Rab.

Khaled was being brought to Dhaka for interrogation, Mufti Mahmud Khan, director (legal and media) of Rab, told The Daily Star.

The elite force would hold a press briefing in this regard today, he added.

Earlier on January 20, the Rab arrested another fugitive militant Mamunur Rashid alias Ripon in Gazipur.

Like Ripon, Khaled also took part in a meeting of top JMB leaders in Gaibandha in February 2016 when the attack was planned, law enforcers dealing with militancy said.

UN names panel for int'l inquiry

Three-member team set to visit Turkey from Jan 28-Feb 3

The United Nations' human rights office said yesterday a three-member team of international experts would conduct an inquiry into the murder of Saudi journalist Jamal Khashoggi, confirming a Reuters report.

Agnes Callamard, UN special rapporteur on extrajudicial, summary or arbitrary executions, told Reuters on Thursday she would travel to Turkey next week to head an "independent international inquiry" into Khashoggi's murder at the Saudi consulate in Istanbul on October 2.

The UN rights office said in a statement that the independent panel would seek to establish "the nature and extent of States' and individuals' responsibilities for the killing".

The other two panel members are British barrister Helena Kennedy and Duarte Nuno Vieira, a pathology expert and professor at the department of legal and forensic medicine and ethics and medical law at Coimbra University, Portugal.

The trio will visit Turkey from January 28-February 3 and plan to report to the UN Human Rights Council in June, it said.

Youth killed by lorry plying wrong side

Jahangirnagar University graduate Shehabul Munir, who joined demonstrations for safe roads last year, died yesterday after being hit by a lorry driving on the wrong side of the road.

Munir, 28, was going across the Nabinagar-Chandra highway in Palli Bidyut area of Savar on Thursday morning when he was hit and suffered serious injuries to his head, police said.


Locals rushed Munir, an environmental science graduate, to a local clinic first.

He was later taken to Enam Medical College Hospital where he died yesterday afternoon.

Earth's oldest rock found on the moon

When the Apollo 14 astronauts returned samples from the moon's surface, they probably didn't realise that they were reuniting Earth with a bit of its early history.

The "moon rock" probably collided with the moon after an impact sent it hurtling from Earth 4 billion years ago, according to research published Thursday in the journal Earth and Planetary Science Letters.

The researchers believe that a large comet or asteroid hit Earth and sent the rock up through the atmosphere and into space. The rock was able to make this serendipitous collision with the

Posing as snake charmer, yaba peddler hides 5,500 pills inside snake basket; gets caught in Ctg

Amid ongoing drives against yaba, drug peddlers are coming up with new techniques to carry the crazy pills.

In the latest incident, an alleged peddler was arrested in Chattogram's Maijjartek area when he was carrying 5,500 yaba pills in a snake basket, police said.

The arrestee is Abul Hossain, 37, from Savar.

Acting on a tip-off, police caught Abul and found the pills. He was on the way to Dhaka from Teknaf, claimed Alamgir Mahmud, officer-in-charge of Karnaphuli Police Station.

Monirul Islam, sub-inspector of the police station, claimed that they recovered snake skin, skeletons and oil from the arrestee's possession.
