7 months on, no budget for BCC

Seven months into the current 2018-19 fiscal, Barishal City Corporation (BCC) authorities are yet to place the annual budget.

As a result, some of the activities and services may get hampered, feared officials.

The last budget of Tk 406.45 crore for 2017-18 fiscal was placed and approved on August 28, 2017 by Ahsan Habib Kamal, the then mayor.

The fourth city corporation election was held on July 30 last year, and new mayor Serniabat Sadiq Abdullah took charge of office on October 23, 2018.

Israil Hossain, secretary to the BCC, said the post of CEO was vacant for a long time, which might have caused the delay. Election to the BCC also added to it, he said.

Seeking anonymity, a BCC official said after taking charge, the newly-elected mayor made 13 officials -- including the accounts officer -- OSD for various reasons, which

may have also added to the problem. In addition, during the end of the

"I urge people to come forward to support us in this initiative, because as long as the river survives, the nation will survive with it," he added.

Power lines to go underground in Sylhet

Overhead electricity lines at some key roads of Sylhet city are going underground as Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) started a project yesterday afternoon.

Sylhet City Corporation Mayor Ariful Haque Chowdhury inaugurated a portion of a big project for sustainable distribution of electricity in Sylhet division.

Ruhul Alam, executive engineer of Sylhet City Corporation (SCC), said that overhead power lines from Electric Supply to Circuit House areas via Amberkhana, Chowhatta, Zindabazar, and Bandarbazar are going underground.

Additionally, electricity lines from Chowhatta to Osmani Medical College Hospital road are also going underground. MM Siddique, project director of BPDB, said, "BPDB is

now working for sustainable distribution of electricity in Sylhet division in a project worth Tk 1,900 crore." "We will be digging trenches beside the roads, and the

power lines of 33KV/11KV will go underground," he said, adding that several stations will be built if any further maintenance is required.

SCC Mayor Ariful Haque Chowdhury said that putting the wires underground will give the city a neater look, as well as provide a sustainable method of power distribution.

Acute teacher shortage hampers education

An acute shortage of teachers has been hampering academic and administrative activities at Khulna Medical College (KMC) for a long time, making life difficult for teachers and students alike.

Due to the crisis, theoretical and practical classes, tutorials and exams are not being taken on time, students alleged.

KMC started its academic journey with 50 students in 1992. At present, there are around 861 students (six batches) pursuing medical degrees at the institution.

Though the college is supposed to have 132 teachers under 32 departments, the number of available teachers is 76.

Against the required 23 professors, 35 associate professors, 43 assistant professors and 31 lecturers, KMC has

four, 16, 30 and 26 respectively. Some of the preliminary courses offered for students are anatomy and histology, physiology, biochemistry,

community medicine, forensic medicine and toxicology, pathology, pharmacology & therapeutics and microbi-

KMC is supposed to have 58 teachers to teach the abovementioned courses. But 20 of those posts are vacant. Moreover, none of the eight departments has any professors.

In addition, there is no associate professor in physiology, community medicine, forensic, pathology and microbiology departments.

Hepatology, pediatrics, nephrology, blood transfusion and physical medicine departments do not even have any teacher. At times, retired teachers take classes there. An assistant professor and two lec-

turers are teaching at the forensic department. Of them, Assistant Professor Dr AKM Shofiuzzaman is going to retire soon.

"I teach at least eight classes a week and I have to prepare forensic report of any murder or unnatural death at KMCH," said Dr Shofiuzzaman.
