

campaign in South Africa that saw the board

form a two-member inquiry committee.

The body of Commodore (retd) Mujibur Rahman and Syed Shamim Ahsan in its findings said: "There were complaints of his [Khaled Mashud's arrogance, his behaviour, and there were complaints of him using foul language with his teammates as well as the senior management of the team, but above all, there were complaints about his total lack of self-discipline. He had fought with the manager on the issue of tickets, and there are instances where he spent nights out of the hotel."

However, Hassan expressed optimism saying that "hopefully there won't be any trouble". "He [Mashud] has been with us for a while now. He has not done anything which would render us unable to include him. Naturally

Rangpur riding high

Mashrafe Bin Mortaza's Rangpur Riders look to have hit top gear when it matters most, confirming first place in the Bangladesh Premier

League (BPL) with a whopping nine-wicket victory over Comilla Victorians in their last league match at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium yesterday. Rangpur's climb to the summit was quite unex-

pected as they had started the tournament with just two wins from their first six games before exploding into life with six straight wins and skipper Mashrafe hailed his team's turnaround when speaking at the post-match press conference yesterday. "We were really in a bad position at one point,

winning just two matches out of six. We were in a situation where we were not sure if we could even make it to the semifinals. I think to come from that position to here is a very positive and good thing for the team. But still I think the matches ahead are very important," Mashrafe said.

Mashrafe and Co. dominated yesterday's game from the word go as they bundled out Comilla for a meagre 72 runs -- their second lowest total in BPL history -- after Comilla had elected to bat. Ziaur Rahman added crucial 21 runs to help Comilla avert the humiliation of being bundled

out for their lowest-ever BPL total before falling prey to all-rounder Ravi Bopara. On a day that saw Rangpur bowlers dictate terms, Bopara was the pick of the bunch, ending with figures of three

wickets for just seven runs in three overs. Interestingly, Comilla's lowest-ever total in the history of this tournament -- 63 all out in

the BPL against the same opposition. Rangpur also won that game by the same margin when the two sides had met early on in the tournament at the same venue.

After the exchange, Rangpur batsmen Chris Gayle and AB de Villiers remained unbeaten for 35 and 34 runs respectively and wrapped up the chase in just 9.3 overs.

Although both Comilla and Rangpur went into the match yesterday having already confirmed their spot in the last four, the massive win will surely give Rangpur a momentum boost going into a Qualifier against the same opponents tomorrow.

However, Rangpur will be missing the likes of Alex Hales and de Villiers. The former has already returned to England after suffering an injury against Rajshahi Kings while de Villiers will be unavailable as yesterday's was the final of his six-match commitment.

Mashrafe, however, said that they were prepared for such events.

"I think Gayle and de Villiers are different from others, especially in this format. Hales was also in form but he will be leaving. About de Villiers, we knew that he would leave after playing six matches, so we were mentally prepared. And the thing is that in this type of tournament, such things happen. Anyone could have been injured."

The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) president Nazmul Hassan informed yesterday that the centrally-contracted players' list was extended by four players from last year to 17.

The contracts were divided into A+, A, B+, B and rookie categories with the Big Five of Mashrafe Bin Mortaza -- who was elected a member of parliament in the recent elections -- Tamim Iqbal, Shakib Al Hasan, Mushfiqur Rahim and Mahmudullah Riyad all handed A+ contracts.

Liton Das, who made inroads into the ODI side and also pushed for a place in the Test team with his performances last year, was promoted to category B contract after being handed a rookie contract last year.

Young left-hander Nazmul Hossain, who impressed in last season's Dhaka Premier League but did not make the most of

last season's rookie list to be excluded. The other of last year's rookies, Abu Hider, was retained under the same category. Imrul Kayes, who has been excluded from the squad for the

upcoming tour of New Zealand and had not been awarded a central contract last year, was awarded a category A contract alongside Mustafizur Rahman and Rubel Hossain.

Soumya Sarkar, Taskin Ahmed and Sabbir Rahman -- part of Bangladesh's ODI squad for the New Zealand tour -- also missed out on central contracts along with Mosaddek Hossain and Kamrul Islam Rabbi. All five were excluded from last year's list as well.

There were many new faces in the rookie list, with 18year old Nayeem Hasan -- who impressed with his performances during the Test series at home against the West Indies -- joining all-rounder Mohammad Saifuddin and pacers Abu Jayed and Khaled Ahmed in that category.

Taskin out of NZ tour?

Taskin Ahmed's injury misery has continued as the right-arm pacer's New Zealand tour is all but over after he suffered an ankle

injury on Friday during the Sylhet Sixers' last group match against Chittagong Vikings at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur.

The 23-year-old returned to the national fold for the upcoming tour after suffering lengthy spells on the sidelines due to injury but chief selector Minhajul Abedin informed yesterday that the selectors were set to announce Taskin's replacement today as the latest injury might set Taskin

back quite a bit. "He [Taskin] has a very slim chance to be fit for the New Zealand series, so hopefully we will announce his replacement tomorrow [Sunday]," said Minhajul yesterday.

Bangladesh Cricket Board chief physician Debashish Chowdhury added: "The scans were done today and we will get the report tomorrow [Sunday] and only then can we tell you about the exact gravity of the injury and how much recovery time he will need. But the initial idea we have is that his recovery will take a considerable amount of time as his condition is not good at all," he informed.

Taskin, who had hobbled out of the ground on Friday after twisting his ankle while attempting a catch, was in a good vein of form recently, becoming the highest wicket-taker in the BPL with 22 wickets even as Sylhet were unable to make the playoffs.

Pacers Shafiul Islam and Ebadat Hossain are likely candidates to be included in the squad for the New Zealand tour if Taskin is unable to make it. Bangladesh begin their series against New Zealand with the first ODI on Feb 13.
