US-led forces close in on IS in Syria

Syrian fighters backed up by artillery fire from a US-led coalition pressed their assault yesterday to retake a last morsel of territory from the Islamic State group, a war monitor said. More than four years after the extremists declared a "caliphate", several offensives have whittled that proto-state down to a tiny holdout.

Yemen food aid at risk of rotting: UN

Food aid in a warehouse on the frontlines of the Yemen war is at risk of rotting, the UN said yesterday. The Red Sea Mills silos, located in the western port city of Hodeida, are believed to contain enough grain to feed several million people for a month. But the granary has remained off-limits to aid organisations for months. Hodeida, and its food silos, have been in the hands of Yemen's Huthi rebels since 2014, when the insurgents staged a takeover of large swathes of Yemeni territories.

India toxic alcohol toll rises to 99

At least 99 people have died and scores have been hospitalised in northern India after drinking toxic alcohol, triggering a crackdown against bootleggers, officials said yesterday. News of the deaths in the states of Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand has trickled in over the past three days, with police suspecting the moonshine had been cut with methanol.

SECOND TRUMP-KIM SUMMIT A 'remarkable

breakthrough' for peace

Says S Korea's Moon AFP, Seoul

The agreement for a second summit between Donald Trump and Kim Jong Un was a "remarkable breakthrough" for peace negotiations on the Korean peninsula, President Moon Jae-in said yesterday, but he acknowledged doubts remained over denuclearisation.

The US President and North Korean leader are due to meet in Hanoi from February 27 to 28 following their landmark first summit in Singapore last June.

That meeting -- the firstever between the leaders of the US and North Korea -produced a vaguely-worded document in which Kim pledged to work towards



the Korean peninsula".

But progress has since stalled with the two sides disagreeing over it means and analysts say tangible progress on denuclearisation will be needed if the talks are to avoid being

dismissed as "reality TV". With the high-stakes summit now two weeks away, Pyongyang has yet to provide any official confirmation of the meeting in

the Vietnamese capital. "For us, the era of peace and prosperity on the peninsula has drawn closer," said Moon in his first comments since the summit was announced.



China rejects Turkey criticism on Uighurs

Denies renowned poet from the Muslim minority died in custody

China yesterday hit back at Turkish criticism over its treatment of Uighurs and denied Ankara's claim that a renowned poet from the Muslim minority had died in custody, calling it an "absurd lie".

Turkey's foreign ministry had released a statement on Saturday severely criticising China's mass detentions of its Turkic-speaking Uighurs, and claiming that poet Abdurehim Heyit had died serving an eight-year Chinese prison sentence imposed as punishment over "one of his songs".

But China on Sunday released a video showing a man who identified himself as Heyit and saying that he was alive and well.

"China has made solemn representations toward Turkey. We hope the relevant Turkish persons can distinguish between right and wrong and correct their mistakes," Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Hua Chunying said during a daily press briefing.

She called the Turkish statement "vile" and urged Ankara to withdraw its "false accusations".

"I saw his (Heyit's) video online yesterday, showing that he is not only alive but also very healthy," she said.

A UN panel of experts has said that nearly one million Uighurs and other Turkic-speaking minorities had been herded into "re-education camps" in China's northwestern Xinjiang region, where most of the country's more than 10 million Uighurs live.

Turkey had said China's treatment of Uighurs was "a great embarrassment for humanity" -- perhaps the strongest condemnation yet from a Muslim country.

Saudis don't know where Khashoggi's body is: FM

Pompeo says US 'not covering up' murder

Saudi authorities do not know where dissident Jamal Khashoggi's body is despite having in custody the Saudi team that murdered him, the kingdom's foreign minister said in an interview broadcast Sunday.

The dissident journalist was dismembered after his murder October 2 in the Saudi consulate in Istanbul but his remains have yet to be found.

Saudi Foreign Minister Adel al-Jubeir said the murder was carried out by Saudi officials "acting outside their scope of authority" and that 11 people have been charged with the crime.

But asked where Khashoggi's body is, he told CBS's "Face the Nation," "We don't know."

Jubeir said the public prosecutor responsible for the case had sought evidence from Turkey but had received no response.

Questioned why those in custody couldn't tell them where the body was, Jubeir

responded: "We are still investigating." "We have now a number of possibilities and we're asking them what they did with the body, and I think this investigation is ongoing, and I would expect that eventually we will find the truth," he said.

Jubeir was interviewed on Friday, the same day President Donald Trump ignored a congressional deadline for reporting on who assassinated Khashoggi, a columnist for the Washington Post who had been critical of Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman.

The CIA has concluded the Saudi operation was likely directed by the powerful crown prince, but the White House has sidestepped that finding amid strenuous denials by Riyadh, a key US ally.

> Jubeir also said Saudi Arabia does not need a United Nations-led probe or an international investigation into the murder because its "competent legal system" can handle the matter, reported Aljazeera Online.

Meanwhile, US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said yesterday US government will continue investigating the murder of Saudi journalist Jamal Khashoggi, reported Reuters.

"America is not covering up for a murder," he said during a visit to Hungary, adding that the United States would take more action to hold accountable all those responsible for Khashoggi's death.

Myanmar cops arrest French national

Myanmar police have arrested a French national in the capital, Naypyitaw, police and France's embassy said yesterday, after the man reportedly flew a drone near parliament.

Naypyitaw is not a common destination for foreign tourists, but some curious visitors are drawn to its oversized official buildings and largely empty, runwaylike roads. The junta constructed the city in secret and moved the country's administration there in the

mid-2000s. In 2017, two foreign journalists for Turkish state TV station TRT World and their interpreter spent two months in a Myanmar jail for flying a drone over the legislature. The three pleaded guilty to breaching the colonial-era Aircraft Act.

Acting US defence secretary Patrick Shanahan arrived in Afghanistan yesterday and said it was important the Afghan government is involved in talks, from which it has so far been excluded, to end the 17-year-old war. Shanahan, who will meet US troops and

Afghan President Ashraf Ghani on his first trip in his new role, said he had so far not received any direction to reduce the nearly 14,000 US troops in Afghanistan.

He also said the United States had important security interests in the region.

Ghani's government has been shut out of the evolving peace talks between Taliban negotiators and US

envoys, with the hardline Islamist movement branding his government a US puppet. Kabul is also concerned that a sharp drawdown of US forces could lead to chaos in the region.

"It is important that the Afghan government is involved in discussions regarding Afghanistan," Shanahan told a small group of reporters traveling with him on the unannounced trip.

"The Afghans have to decide what Afghanistan looks like in the future. It's not

about the US, it is about Afghanistan." Shanahan took over from Jim Mattis, who quit in December over policy differ-

ences with US President Donald Trump. He said he could not

make any guarantees TALIBAN-US PEACE TALKS because US peace envoy Zalmay Khalilzad was leading the talks.

> "The US military has strong security interests in the region. (The) presence will evolve out of those discussions," Shanahan said.

He also said his goal on the trip was to get an understanding of the situation on

the ground from commanders and then brief Trump on his findings.

Afghan President Ashraf Ghani on Sunday offered the Taliban the possibility of opening an office in Afghanistan but the proposal was swiftly spurned by the group that is determined to keep his government

out of accelerating peace talks.

Thai junta quashes coup rumour as 'fake news'

Election panel disqualifies princess as PM candidate

Thailand's junta chief yesterday dismissed rumours of an impending coup as "fake news", as speculation ricocheted across a kingdom unsettled by the ill-fated political union

between a princess and a party allied to the powerful Shinawatra clan.

Conjecture has coursed through Thailand since Friday when the Thai Raksa Chart party proposed Princess Ubolratana, King Maha Vajiralongkorn's elder sister, as a candidate for premier after the March 24 election.

Hours later, a royal command from the king appeared to put a pin

in her unprecedented political aspirations. It said the monarchy was above politics

and described his sister's candidacy as "highly inappropriate".
