Saudi to invest in 30 big projects

High-profile delegation due next month to finalise multi-billion-dollar investment in Bangladesh

Saudi Arabia plans to invest several billion dollars in more than 30 projects in Bangladesh, including setting up an aircraft repair and maintenance facility in Lalmonirhat.

The plan is part of Saudi efforts to boost bilateral and economic ties between the countries, said government officials in Dhaka. A large Saudi delegation, including two senior ministers,

is expected to arrive here next month. The team will discuss the multi-billon dollar investment with officials of the Prime Minister's Office and ministries concerned, they said. The development comes after Prime Minister Sheikh

Hasina's visit to the Kingdom in October last year.

Shajahan-led body sparks anger in JS


An opposition lawmaker yesterday questioned the government decision to appoint Shajahan Khan as the chief of a 15-member committee formed to recommend ways on curbing road accidents and bringing discipline to the road transport sector.

While raising a supplementary question, Jatiya Party MP Fakhrul Imam asked: "Will it be fruitful to control illegal drugs by ex-Awami League MP Abdur Rahman Bodi and ensure road safety by Shajahan Khan?"

Terming Shajahan an ill-advised choice to head the committee, Iman said his fellow MP was at the centre of controversies on different occasions for his comments and actions.

43 injured as BCL

factions clash BCL men beat up 6 journos in Sylhet, JNU

At least 43 people, including six journalists and two policemen, were injured as factions of Bangladesh Chhatra League activists clashed in the capital and Sylhet yesterday.

In the capital's Jagannath University (JnU), clashes over establishing supremacy between two groups of BCL left 39, including two reporters and two police officers, injured.

In Sylhet, four photographers were

beaten up by alleged BCL activists when they attempted to take pictures of a clash between two BCL groups on the campus of Murari Chand College.

The JnU's clash started around noon. Armed with iron rods, sharp weapons and sticks, around 250 BCL men, mostly wearing helmets, swooped on each other. The pitched battle continued until police intervened around 10 minutes later, witnesses said.

Why it could in South Asia

Once again, geopolitical tensions are rising on the Indian subcontinent. And the · AFP, Srinagar timing, just ahead of India's general elections, could drive the mercury even higher in the coming days and weeks.

The trigger: a deadly car bomb attack on a convoy of Indian paramilitaries in the section of Kashmir controlled by New Delhi. The blast ripped through the convoy, killing at least 40 people and injuring five more -- the worst attack on Indian forces since the beginning of an insurgency in the region in the late 1980s, according to analysts.

The tragedy shook India, which says archrival Pakistan had a "direct hand" in yesterday as Indian troops suffered new

India suffers new drive tensions losses in Kashmir

Gun battle with militants kills 4 soldiers, cop, civilian; 3 masterminds of Thursday's bombing also dead

 Indian troops yesterday suffered new losses in a battle with Kashmir militants that left at least nine dead, officials said, just days after a major suicide bomb attack escalated tensions with neighbouring Pakistan.

The confrontation piled more pressure on the Indian government, · which has blamed Pakistan for last Thursday's suicide attack on a convoy : that killed at least 40 paramilitaries.

Several hours of shooting rocked the Pulwama district, south of · Kashmir's main city of Srinagar, after officials said four soldiers, a police-· man, three militants and a civilian were killed in the latest clash.

An army major was among the dead, along with three militants from the Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) group which claimed last week's attack, military and police officials said. Six senior army men including a brigadier and a lieutenant colonel were

the incident. The situation took a new turn: injured in the hours-long gun battle, a police official told AFP. "A police deputy inspector general has also suffered injuries," the official said.
