BFF academy from March!

Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) yesterday announced that its football academy will start operation in March following the completion of a talent-hunt programme across the country.

The game's local governing body selected 70 footballers - 35 each for under-15 and under-18 level --from some 275 budding footballers, who were initially selected from 16,000 hopefuls at district level.

"The players have been selected through a month-long talent-hunt programme. Now the selected ones will undergo medical tests before being selected finally. Before taking them to the academy in March, we will also talk to their parents," said BFF president Kazi Salahuddin at a press conference yesterday.

The BFF had earlier run a FIFA-funded academy for only nine months in 2015. It had also announced to bring the winning team of 2018 SAFF U-16 Championship into a three-year contract and sent them to Sylhet BKSP in November last year, but it has not materialised in the last three months.

There is a whisper in football fraternity that the BFF has taken this recent initiative ahead of next year's BFF polls after Bangladesh District and Divisional Football Associations (BDDFA), a platform opposing incumbent president Kazi Salahuddin, took a similar initiative of talent hunt at under-20 level in the latter part of last year.

"I am not conducting this programme for the elections rather we have a good opportunity to produce good results at international level if we can groom them properly at academy. I don't have any problem if I do not stay at the federation," defended Salahuddin.

Klopp backs Ole for MU manager

Abahani fall to Sk Russel

Holders Abahani tasted their second defeat in the Bangladesh Premier League when they lost 2-0 against title contenders Sheikh Russel KC at the Sylhet District Stadium last night.

Nigerian marksman Raphael Odoyin opened the account in the 24th minute before Brazilian Alex Rafael Antonio wrapped up the victory in the 85th minute after availing a defensive fumble to shoot Sheikh Russel to second position with 17 points from seven matches. This was Abahani's second defeat of the campaign following five consecutive wins. They had lost against Bashundhara Kings in Nilphamari in their second match. Despite the defeat, Abahani are still on top with 18 points from eight matches while Bashundhara Kings have 16 points from six matches.

secured their second successive draw in the Bangladesh Premier League as they held Sheikh Jamal DC 1-1 at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

Sheikh Jamal defender Monir Hossain scored an own goal to give Mohammedan the lead in the 24th minute before Gambian forward Solomon King levelled the margin in the 62nd minute with a dipping shot. The draw helped Sheikh Jamal raise their tally to 12 points from eight matches while Mohammedan leapfrogged to ninth position of the 13-team table with five points from seven outings.

Sheikh Jamal, who only conceded one defeat against Mohammedan in the history of professional league, got off to a fine start by creating two scoring chances within the first 10 minutes. But Kyrgyz forward David Tetteh's feeble header in the third minute went straight to the hands of Mohammedan goalkeeper Sarwar Jahan while Shakhawat Hossain Rony's glancing header in the seventh minute went wide after kissing the farpost.

Mohammedan looked a bit better compared to their previous matches as they chased the ball from the outset before Habibur Rahman Shohag tried from distance in the 19th minute, with Sheikh Jamal goalkeeper Mohammad Nayeem parrying it away for a corner.

The Motijheel-based outfit took

the lead against the run of play when Monir headed the ball into his own net while attempting to clear a long ball from Mohammedan midfielder Anik Ghosh.

Sheikh Jamal came close to equalising in the 37th minute but Gambian striker Sainey Bojang incredibly drove wide of open net despite beating goalkeeper Sarwar.

After resumption, both sides fought equally and created a few chances but Sheikh Jamal succeeded in the 62nd minute when Solomon mustered a dipping shot from 25 yards to find the back of the net.

In the latter part, Mohammedan put some pressure on Sheikh Jamal and created two penalty situations, but those were not deemed bookable offence by referee Bhuban

Mohan Tarafder. Mohammedan manager Amirul Islam Babu signalled his players to come off the pitch while senior players like Zahid Hasan Emily and Mithun Chowdhury threw water bottles inside the pitch from the dugout.

However, the match ended in a peaceful manner as both sides seemed satisfied with a point apiece.

"Like the previous match, our strategy was to defend first to make sure we get at least one point and then go for counter-attack and the boys were successful," Mohammedan's assistant coach Shahidul Islam Jewel said. "We are not getting proper service from our foreign players. The local players are also not giving their full supports to the foreign players."

FIFA hands Chelsea transfer ban

Premier League club Chelsea have been banned from signing new players in the next two transfer windows as punishment for breaking rules on registering under-age players, FIFA said on Friday.

It means the club -- who immediately said they would appeal the decision -- will be unable to make signings until the end of January next year.

"The disciplinary committee sanctioned Chelsea with a ban on registering new players at both national and international level for the next two complete and consecutive registration periods," FIFA said in a statement.

In addition, Chelsea were fined 600,000 Swiss francs (\$600,000, 530,000 euros) and given a period of 90 days to regularise the situation of the minor players concerned.

The ban does not prevent players being released by the club and it does not apply to Chelsea's women's and futsal teams.

"Chelsea FC categorically refutes the findings of the FIFA disciplinary committee and will therefore be appealing the decision," said a statement on the club's website.

Arsenal, Chelsea cruise

Arsenal and Chelsea reached the last 16 of the Europa League on Thursday after the Gunners comfortably saw off BATE Borisov 3-0 and Maurizio Sarri's troubled side relieved some of the pressure on him with the same scoreline against mediocre Malmo.

After falling 1-0 in Belarus, Arsenal were level on aggregate after just three minutes when Zakhar Volkov sliced Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang's low cross past Denis Scherbitski in his own goal.

Unai Emery's side deservedly went through thanks to two thumping headers from Shkodran Mustafi and Sokratis either side of the break which put them into Friday's draw.

"We wanted this result but also we wanted to play for our supporters here. We did our best to come back (in the tie) and the team worked very well," Emery told BT Sport.

Ahead 2-1 from the first leg in Sweden, Chelsea had to wait until 10 minutes after the break for the first sign of excitement, Olivier Giroud

tapping in the decisive goal of a hum-drum encounter at Stamford Bridge.

Ross Barkley made sure of the win with a super free-kick in the 74th minute, just after Malmo's Rasmus Bengtsson was sent off for his second bookable offence, before 18-year-old Callum Hudson-Odoi made the most of a rare start by crashing home the third.

"The boys really played well today. We worked hard throughout the game," said highly-rated Hudson Odoi, a Bayern Munich target in January.

"The goal that came at the end was definitely a bonus for the way that we played."

Carlo Ancelotti's Napoli breezed to a 2-0 win over FC Zurich that saw them win 5-1 on aggregate, while Inter Milan went through 5-0 after sweeping four goals past Rapid Vienna without reply at the San Siro.

French side Rennes are into the last 16 of a major European tournament for the first time after winning possibly the most entertaining tie of the round 6-4 on aggregate following a barnstorming 3-1 win at Real Betis.

Goals from Ramy Bensebaini and Adrien Hunou fired Rennes into a two-goal lead within the opening half-hour but the tie was put back in

the balance when Giovanni Lo Celso pulled one back four minutes before half-time.

With Betis pushing to equalise and go through on away goals, M'Baye Niang finished off an injury time break to see the mid-table Ligue 1 side through.

RB Salzburg, Dinamo Zagreb and Zenit Saint Petersburg all overturned first-leg deficits, with Austrians Salzburg hammering Club Brugge 4-0 to go through 5-2 and Croatian champions Dinamo 4-2 winners on aggregate after a storming 3-0 victory over Viktoria Plzen.

Zenit overcame Fenerbahce 3-1 in Russia, Magomed Ozdоеv and Sardar Azmoun giving the hosts an aggregate lead before Mehmet Topal put the Turks ahead on away goals just before the break.

However, on his home debut for Zenit, Iranian international Azmoun struck again 14 minutes from the end to see Sergei Semak's side through.

Pablo Fornals snuck Villarreal past Sporting Lisbon with a fine curling strike that gave the La Liga side a 1-1 draw on the night and a 2-1 win overall, while Benfica eased past Galatasaray 2-1 after a goalless draw in Portugal.
