Tobacco causes over 1 lakh deaths in Bangladesh every year: study

What is the extent of health hazard and economic loss caused by tobacco? Findings of a recent study are quite alarming.

Tobacco users' risk of developing three major types of cancer -- lung, larynx and mouth -- is 109 percent higher than non-users', according to the study. Their risk of developing seven life-threating diseases -- including stroke, heart-disease and tuberculosis -is 57 percent higher than non-users'.

The economic loss caused due to the health hazards [from both direct tobacco usage and second-hand smoke] is about Tk 30,570 crore per year, the study said. Bangladesh Cancer Society in associ-

ation with Dhaka University, American

Cancer Society and Cancer Research UK conducted the study on 10,000 families in all districts of the country in between July 2017 and April 2018. Findings of the study, titled "Economic Cost of Tobacco Use in

were unveiled at a conference at Dhaka Club yesterday. According to the study, tobacco usage causes 1,00,961 deaths every year in Bangladesh, and second-hand

ment. At the same time, the government's expenses in the health sector have gone up, resulting in a big economic loss. In addition, loss of productivity and untimely deaths further extend economic loss, said the study.

That tobacco has a significant contribution to the country's economy is "only a misconception", the study said.

The government in 2017-2018 fiscal year earned Tk 22,810 crore as revenue from the tobacco sector. In the meantime, economic loss caused by tobacco usage and second-hand smoke was worth Tk 30,570 crore. Environmental hazards of tobacco cultivation and smoking were not even measured, it said.

To overcome the current situation and make Bangladesh a tobacco-free country by 2040, the study suggested that the government increase the price of tobacco products through imposing higher tax.

It also suggested implementing the existing tobacco control and usage act

strictly and making timely amendments. The study gave a special emphasis on demotivating tobacco farmers and helping to bacco users quit the habit.

Reviewing the study findings at the programme, Syed Mahfuzul Huq, national professional officer of World Health Organization (WHO), urged the government to strictly address tobacco usage.

"The government must take tough decisions now through strengthening the law and ensuring its implementation. And it should not be influenced by the tobacco industry," said Mahfuzul. Another study, titled "Global Adult

Tobacco Survey (GATS) 2018", found that tobacco usage among those aged 15 and above in Bangladesh dropped by 18.5 percent in the last eight years, till 2017. Asked why the health hazard and economic loss were still on the rise,

Prof Golam Mohiuddin Faruque,

leader of the research team, said the percentage decreases as it was compared to the country's population, which is growing. "But the overall number of tobacco users did not reduce that much. Besides,

people are now more aware and their tendency to get diagnosed has increased," Faruque, also a noted cancer specialist, told The Daily Star. Speaking as the chief guest at the

programme, State Minister for Health Murad Hasan said the government will soon take initiative to disassociate itself from the tobacco industry.

Says Obaidul Quader about removing chemical establishments from Old Dhaka

Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader yesterday said there is a "standing directive" from the prime minister to remove all chemical establishments immediately from Old Dhaka.

"The process is on. Initially, the risky and ille-

gal chemical warehouses and establishments will be removed from Chawkbazar and nearby areas. There will be no compromise in this regard," he said. The minister was briefing journalists in front of

Hazi Wahed Mansion, where a devastating fire broke out Wednesday night and claimed lives of at least 67 people. Replying to a query on why chemical establish-

ments were not removed despite recommendations after the 2010 Nimtoli blaze, he said, "This time the government has taken all necessary measures to address the lack of [previous] coordination. A new journey starts through learning lessons from previous mistakes."

About the danger of CNG-run vehicles, he said, ately," he added. "The Bangladesh Road Transport Authority chair-

man has already been directed to take steps in this regard."

'BNP POLITICISING TRAGEDY'

Information Minister Hasan Mahmud yesterday at a book launching event in Chattogram said the comment of BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir over the Chawkbazar fire in Dhaka indicates "the party could have connection with the incident".

"He [Fakhrul] said the fire broke out due to the absence of democracy in the country -- this is an irresponsible remark. We should investigate if they had any link to the incident," the minister said, reports our Chattogram correspondent.

Hasan said it was inappropriate for BNP leaders to bring politics in every issue.

"The entire nation is mourning the loss of lives. As a conscious political party, BNP should have demonstrated solidarity. They are politicising the incident inappropri-

70.4pc public transport drivers have eye problems

Manabik Shahajya Sangstha survey says

About 70.4 percent public transport drivers have eye problems, says a survey conducted by Manabik Shahajya Sangstha (MSS) among 500 bus, mini bus, truck, and lorry drivers in eight bus stands in Dhaka. Of this 70.4 percent, 73.29 percent

has problem in both eyes, 14.49 in left eyes and 12.22 in right eyes.

January 1, 2019 among public transportation drivers under an eye care project titled "Healthy Eyes for Road Safety". had a problem with eyes watering. They revealed the results of this

survey at a press conference yesterday at MSS Head office in Dhaka. They performed a preliminary scan

to assess the drivers' ophthalmic condition, and to determine their interest in obtaining eye care services at cheapest rates, said Feroz M Hassan, president of MSS.

Hassan also said, "Healthy eyes are necessary to ensure safe driving. Many drivers have eye problems but they They conducted the survey on cannot realise it, or they simply overlook it. It was found that 31.53 percent had pain in their eyes, 32.24 percent had experienced itching, and 57.95

Most of the drivers in this survey were 31-40 years old who have more than 10 years of experience in driving and never checked up their eyes." Most notably, around 109 drivers

said that they have faced problems seeing road signs, he further added. Hassan said they are planning to

provide eye treatment to the drivers from today morning. Swapna Reza, assistant director of

Commission to be formed to identify

Accurate history will be written after the conspirators are found, he said.

The minister made the comments while speaking as chief guest at a felicitation programme at the Supreme Court Bar Association auditorium.

The lawyers' clerk associ-

ation accorded felicitation to the law minister, Railways Minister Nurul Islam Sujan, Housing and Public Works Minister SM Rezaul Karim and State Minister for Civil Aviation and Tourism Mahboob Ali -- who are all lawyers by profession.

The law minister said **BNP** Chairperson Khaleda Zia had tried to initiate a movement through "fire terrorism" but did not succeed. People like Khaleda Zia and Dr Kamal Hossain want to bring the country down, he alleged. He urged people to

remain cautious about the conspiracy.
