Messi's 50th career hattrick downs Sevilla

Lionel Messi scored his 50th career hattrick to fire Barcelona to a 4-2 win at Sevilla on Saturday after the champions had twice fallen behind, giving the Catalans a 10-point lead at the top of La Liga.

Sevilla, who have only won once in the league in 2019, took the lead midway through the first half through veteran winger Jesus Navas but were soon pegged back by an unstoppable volley from Messi.

The home side capitalised on sleepy defending from Barca to re-take the lead before halftime as Gabriel Mercado pounced in the area.

After the break Ousmane Dembele laid the ball off to Messi just inside the area and the Argentine lashed it into the top corner. Messi completed his treble to put Barca ahead in the 85th minute, reacting quickly to a poor Sevilla clearance to dink the ball over goalkeeper Tomas Vaclik.

Luis Suarez made sure of the points by scoring deep in stoppage time, chipping Vaclik after being played through by a pass from Messi.

Bangladesh's Ummey Zakia Sultana finished 85th and Syeda Atkiya Hassan finished 99th among 101 competitors in the qualification round of the women's 10m air rifle event of the New Delhi World Cup yesterday.

Zakia scored a total of 615.3 points while Atkiya scored 609.7 points in the event, where India's Apurva Chandela eventually grabbed the gold medal, beating three Chinese com-

petitors. The New Delhi World Cup is the first shooting World Cup [Rifle and Pistol] of the calendar year, and it is also the first event to earn quota place for 2020 Tokyo

Olympics. 11 shooters from Bangladesh -- six men and five women -- are participating in the meet, which will end on February 28.



Zazai blazes Afghans to world record 278

22 sixes, 19 fours, a 42ball hundred and plenty of records under threat; Afghanistan put on an absolute show on way to posting a world record 278 for three in the second T20I against

Ireland in Dehradun on Saturday.

The record total proved too much for the Irish who managed to score 194 for six wickets to lose the match by 84 runs. Asghar Afghan won the toss, elected

to bat and then like many others enjoyed a spectacle unfold before his eyes at the Rajiv Gandhi International Cricket Stadium as Hazratullah Zazai and Usman Ghani tonked the ball, zoomed past many records. Zazai was in the form of his life as he

smashed his maiden T20I hundred off just 42 balls. The 20-year-old remained unbeaten on 162 that came off just 62 balls and at a colossal strike rate of 261.29. During his blitzkrieg, Zazai -- who

was dropped on 72 by George Dockrell -- smashed 11 boundaries and 16 sixes as he took over Aaron Finch's (14) record of most sixes by a batsman in a T20I innings. The opening duo of Zazai and August 2017.

Ghani also forged a T20I record for the highest partnership for any wicket, putting on a 236-run stand to go past Australia duo Aaron Finch and D'Arcy Short's previous record of 223. Afghanistan also surpassed Australia's 263, scored against Sri Lanka in Pallekele, to post the format's highest total in an innings.

Their 22 sixes were also the most in a T20I innings, overtaking the 21 that

Zazai's 162 was not quite enough to take him past Finch's record for most runs, 172, for a batsman in a T20I innings, the left-hander went past Finch's second-highest T20I score of 156 and Glenn Maxwell's 145 to jump to the second spot.

And while Ghani will not make the headlines like his compatriot's knock, his scintillating 73 off 48 studded with seven boundaries and three hits over

the fence, was vital. Their record partnership was brought to an end in the 105th delivery of the innings by Boyd Rankin, giving Mohammad Nabi a chance to play a little cameo, which he did by adding 17 off 5 deliveries before he was dismissed by Joshua Little. SCORES IN BRIEF:
