Tension spirals

Islamabad, New Delhi claim downing each other's warplanes; Indian pilot held; Pak PM warns against war, offers talks; world powers renew call to defuse Kashmir tensions

India and Pakistan both said they shot down each other's fighter jets yesterday, with Pakistan capturing an Indian pilot a day after Indian warplanes struck inside Pakistan for the first time since 1971, prompting world powers to urge restraint.

Calling for talks with India to defuse the situation, Pakistan Prime

Minister Imran Khan warned of the potentially catastrophic consequences should "better sense" not prevail. "Can we afford any miscalculation with the kind of weapons that we have and

you have? If this escalates, things will no longer be in my control or in Modi's," he said in a televised statement referring to the Indian prime minister. While both sides have sought to play down the threat of war, the rare aerial engagement over the divided and disputed territory of Kashmir sig-

nificantly raises the stakes in a standoff sparked by a suicide attack on the Indian-controlled side earlier this month. Pakistan initially said it downed two Indian jets in its airspace and cap-

tured two pilots, but later its military spokesman tweeted that there was "only one pilot" in Pakistani custody. India's foreign ministry demanded the "immediate and safe return" of

the pilot, calling on Pakistan to ensure no harm comes to him. New Delhi confirmed the loss of one of its planes and said it had shot

down a Pakistani fighter jet. In a sign of the deepening crisis, Pakistan closed its airspace "until further

notice". India shut several airports in the northern part of the country temporarily, leading to dozens of domestic flight cancellations. Operations at the Indian airports have now resumed.

"We do not want to go towards war," Pakistan's military spokesman Major General Asif Ghafoor told a press conference.

What's at stake as Indo-Pak tensions rise?

Pakistan and India said yesterday they had shot down each other's warplanes, in a dramatically escalating confrontation that has fuelled concerns of an all-out conflict between the nuclear-armed rivals. But how did the relations between these two Asian nations become so bad and what's at stake in this rapidly worsening conflict that both sides say they want to deescalate?

WHAT STARTED THIS LATEST TENSION?

On February 14, a suicide car bomber attacked a paramilitary convoy on the Indian-controlled side of Kashmir in the Himalayas, killing more than 40 troops. The militant group Jaish-e-Mohammed, which is based in Pakistan, claimed responsibility for the attack. The suicide bomber was from Indian Kashmir. New Delhi long has accused Pakistan of cultivating such groups, something denied by Islamabad. India launched

A rare lack of festivity

DNCC goes to polls today, but voters show little enthusiasm; many say they won't vote

The Dhaka North City Corporation mayoral by-election takes place today but it lacks enthusiasm and festivity.

Many city dwellers said they did not even know whether they were among the voters. Others said they would not go to the polling centres as the election was likely to be one-sided.

"As you can see, there is no poster of any mayor candidates. None of them came to our area to seek vote either. don't know who are running for the [mayor] post," Mohammad Faruk, a grocer in Mohammadpur, told The Daily Star yesterday.

Zahed Mia, a rickshaw puller living in Badda, said there was hardly any electioneering in his area as well. "It does not look like an election," he said.

Many in other DNCC areas echoed their remarks, adding that they had no idea where their polling centres were.

Relocation begins in 15 days

4,000 chemical units to be shifted from old town

The industries ministry will start relocating nearly 4,000 chemical warehouses and factories from Old Dhaka within the next 15 days as it selected two temporary sites in the capital and Tongi for this purpose.

The decision came at a meeting between the industries secretary and acid and chemical traders at the former's city office yesterday, a week after the fatal Chawkbazar blaze which killed 69 people and injured many others.

Different quarters have been critical of the delay in the relocation as nine years have passed since the Nimtoli tragedy in 2010, which had claimed 124 lives. The government at that time had instructed
