In the first phase of upazila election, 78 of the local government bodies go to the polls today amid a lack of enthusiasm and festivity.

The series of battle of ballots -- boycotted by the BNP and several other parties -- kicks off only over two months after the December 30 parliamentary polls.

This year, election to 480 upazilas will take place in five phases. Over 1.42 crore people are expected to cast their

votes at 5,847 centres in the first phase today. Polls to 125 upazilas will be held in the second phase on March 18, while the third phase will be held on March 22 in
