Five killed, three injured in road accidents

Five persons were killed in separate road accidents in Chattogram, Dinajpur, Pabna, Barishal and Dhaka districts in the last two

Sixty-year-old Kamal Uddin was critically injured after being hit by an unidentified vehicle on Chattogram-Dhaka highway in Mirsarai upazila of Chattogram yesterday morning, reports our correspondent.

He was rushed to Mirsarai Upazila Health Complex where doctors declared him dead around 9am, said Amit Dey, emergency medical officer at the health complex.

In another incident, college teacher Anwar Hossain, 32, was killed on the spot as a truck hit his bike on Dinajpur-Bogura road in Ghoraghat upazila yesterday, our correspondent reports quoting locals.

The deceased was a teacher of Raniganj Degree College in the upazila, said

Meanwhile in Pabna, school teacher Md Ariful Islam, 38, was killed after a bus ran him over in front of his residence in Diarpara village under Bhangura upazila yesterday, reports our correspondent.

The deceased was an assistant teacher of Sarutia Government Primary School, locals said.

The accident took place on Tebunia-Baghabari highway, said Masud Rana, officer-in-charge of Bhangura Police Station.

Ariful was rushed to Pabna Medical College Hospital, where he died around 1:30am, the OC added.

BRTA to scrap 5,400 unfit auto-rickshaws Abduction

Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA), Chattogram has taken an initiative to scrap 5,400 CNG-run auto-rickshaws that are at least 15 years old, and plying the port city roads.

BRTA already dismantled 107 threewheelers by Thursday. The drive began on Monday and the authorities plan to dismantle at least 100 vehicles per day.

But the turnout was low as only 26 percent vehicles, scheduled to be scrapped, showed up at BRTA office during the first four days till Thursday. On the first day, 33 vehicles were

scrapped while 19 and 22 were dis-

mantled on the next two days. Though the turnout increased on Thursday, the authorities could scrap 33 vehicles out of 55, as they were unable to verify the chassis and engine numbers due to their worn-out condi-

tions, informed Sohel Rana, BRTA

executive magistrate. He said the drive will continue till May.

BRTA Deputy Director Mohammad Shahidullah said new dates would be assigned if the stipulated number of vehicles could not be scrapped within schedule.

He said they were expecting to scrap 2,000 vehicles within first 20 days. As precaution, the authorities are keeping cylinders of scrapped vehicles, he said. Though they have declared to issue

registration numbers for new vehicles in no time, auto-rickshaw owners, whose vehicles had already been scrapped, are yet to apply for it, he added. Jalal Sheikh, an auto-rickshaw

driver, told The Daily Star that the company he works for had two vehicles but the owner was planning to buy one after those were scrapped. "New vehicles are faster and run on less gas. Why would the owner buy two vehicles?" said Jalal at BRTA.

Mentionable, around 150 owners did not apply for registration after BRTA conducted a similar drive last year. Besides, 101 vehicles, scheduled to

be dismantled in 2018, did not respond to the drive and are still on the road, informed BRTA officials. Last year, BRTA took an initiative to dismantle 2,885 three-wheelers. The authorities later ordered owners of those 101 vehicles to show


Rab and police in separate drives yesterday arrested three persons with phensedyl and yaba pills.



Bangladesh has made extraordinary progress in almost all indicators of women empowerment among Asian countries, and this progress will be further accelerated in future, speakers at a discussion said yesterday.

They also said women's participation in all sectors, especially in small and medium enterprises (SME) is satisfactory; however, social security needs to be ensured fully.

Marking International Women's Day,

Association of Grassroots Women Entrepreneurs Bangladesh (AGWEB) organised the discussion at CIRDAP auditorium. Some four lakh women entrepreneurs have received funds worth \$3.3 billion in

2010-17, said Dr Atiur Rahman, former governor of Bangladesh Bank. "Women are moving ahead in all sectors. Some 122 UNOs are women out of 470 in

the country. Women contribute in 17 steps of agriculture out of 21," he said. Lawmaker Aroma Dutta said, "There are

12,000 women working as union parishad members. This is definitely a positive step." Speakers also said the ratio of loan defaulters is quite low among female entre-

preneurs in comparison to men.

Only five to six percent of them are loan defaulters, and female entrepreneurs appoint around 85 percent women as employees in their industries, said Syed Mahbubur Rahman, chairman of Association of Bankers.
