Bailout for big loan defaulters

BB to offer generous scheme for large loan scheduling; experts fear it would further weaken banking governance

Bangladesh Bank and a government committee have come up with a generous scheme to allow easy rescheduling of defaulted loans, which experts say will hurt the banking sector and the economy at large.

Once implemented, the scheme will also enable loan defaulters to obtain many other financial benefits.

Four years ago, a similar bailout offer was made to companies that had defaulted on large loans, allowing them to reschedule and repay loans on significantly relaxed terms.

But the special bailout scheme couldn't yield desired results as most of the large loan defaulters, who availed themselves of the scheme, did not make any serious effort to pay back their huge loans. According to the new proposal, loan defaulters will get 13 to 15 years,

with a grace period of up to two years, to pay back their loans. All they will need to do is make a down payment of maximum 2 percent

of their outstanding loans, instead of the current requirement of 10 to 15 percent, for regularising their loans. In some cases, they won't have to pay.

In case of the defaulters, who got loans from the BASIC Bank through irregularities between 2010 and 2014 when Sheikh Abdul Hye Bacchu was its chairman, will be allowed to regularise their loans by making a down SEE PAGE 2 COL 5



116 upazilas go to polls today

upazilas go to polls today amid a growing number of candidates being elected unopposed.

The local body elections, boycotted by the BNP and several other parties, kicked off on March 10 about two months after the December · 30 general polls.

This year, elections in 480 upazilas will be held in five phases.

Over 1.79 crore people are expected to cast votes at : 7,034 centres in the second phase.

The third-phase polls will be held on March 24 in 127 upazilas and the fourth in 122 upazilas on March 31.

2 killed as AL factions clash

12 others hurt in fight between polls rivals in Joypurhat

. Two people were killed and 12 others injured in a factional clash of ruling Awami League over upazila elections · in Joypurhat on Saturday night.

In Kalai upazila, a clash broke out between supporters of two AL leaders in Moslemganj village, killing two people and injuring 12 others.

The deceased are Aftab Hossain, 48, of Maddhyapara · village, and Ratan Kumar Mohanta, 43, of Mahishpara , village.

Police said election in Kalai upazila was held on March · 10. Two AL leaders -- Minfuzur Rahman Milon and ANM : Shawkat Habib Talukdar -- tried to get party's nomination for contesting in Kalai upazila chairman post. Finally, Milon secured party's nomination.

In the polls, Habib and local union parishad chairman : Wazed Ali, who is also an AL leader, supported JSD candidate Tarikul Islam. But Milon won the polls, said locals.

Following the rivalry, followers of Milon equipped · with sticks and sharp weapons attacked Moslemganj : village, which is a stronghold of Wazed, around 9:00pm SEE PAGE 2 COL 2
