

Fire kills elderly woman, destroys 6 houses

An elderly woman was burned to death and six houses were destroyed in a fire in Faridpur's Nagarkanda upazila yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Trishna Begum, 70, wife of late Fayz Uddin, from Binokdia Bazar in the upazila.

The fire originated from Tota Bapari's kitchen around 2:00pm at a slum in Binokdia Bazar area and it soon spread to adjacent houses including that of Trishna Begum's, said Atiqul Rahman, station officer of Nagarkanda Fire Service and Civil Defence.

On information, a fire unit from the station rushed to the spot and extinguished the fire with the help of locals, he said, adding that Trishna Begum however died before they rescued her from her house.

The value of properties damaged by the fire was estimated at Tk 10 lakh, he added.

FEUD OVER LAND One to die, four get life terms for murder

A court here yesterday sentenced a man to death and four others to life term imprisonment for killing a neighbour in 2013.

Additional District and Session's Judge Shawkat Ali also jailed three other accused for two years and acquitted 12 more, as charges brought against them were not proved.

The court also fined the death row convict, Rabiul Islam alias Rabu, 25, son of Abul Kalam Azad of Purbo Jagot village in Gomostapur upazila, Tk 1 lakh.

While the lifers, Kader, 27, Shamsul, 30, Sham Mohammad, 57, and Apple, 20, of Mangoltara village in Niamotpur upazila of Naogaon, were fined Tk 50,000 each.

Meanwhile, three other accused in the murder case-- Enamul Haque, 46, and Sharif, 25, of Mangoltara village, and Aynal Haque, 35, of Purbo Jagot village-- were jailed for two years and fined Tk 5,000 each.

According to the prosecution, there had been a land dispute between the convicts and Shamsuddin Tagor, 48, of Purbo Jagot village for long.

As a sequel to the enmity, a group of men, equipped with sticks and sharp weapons attacked Shamsuddin near his house while he was returning from Enayetpur Bazar by a motorcycle on January 22, 2013, leaving him injured.

The following morning, Shamsuddin succumbed to his injuries while undergoing treatment at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital.

Victim's elder brother Jamshed Ali filed a murder case with Gomostapur Police Station accusing 22 people the same day.

After investigation, Sub Inspector Nur Mohammad submitted the charge sheet against 21 people on April 30 the same year.

50 hurt in Habiganj clash

The mayhem occurred over a land dispute

At least 50 people were injured in a clash between two rival groups over a disputed land at Jirunda village in Habiganj's Lakhai upazila yesterday.

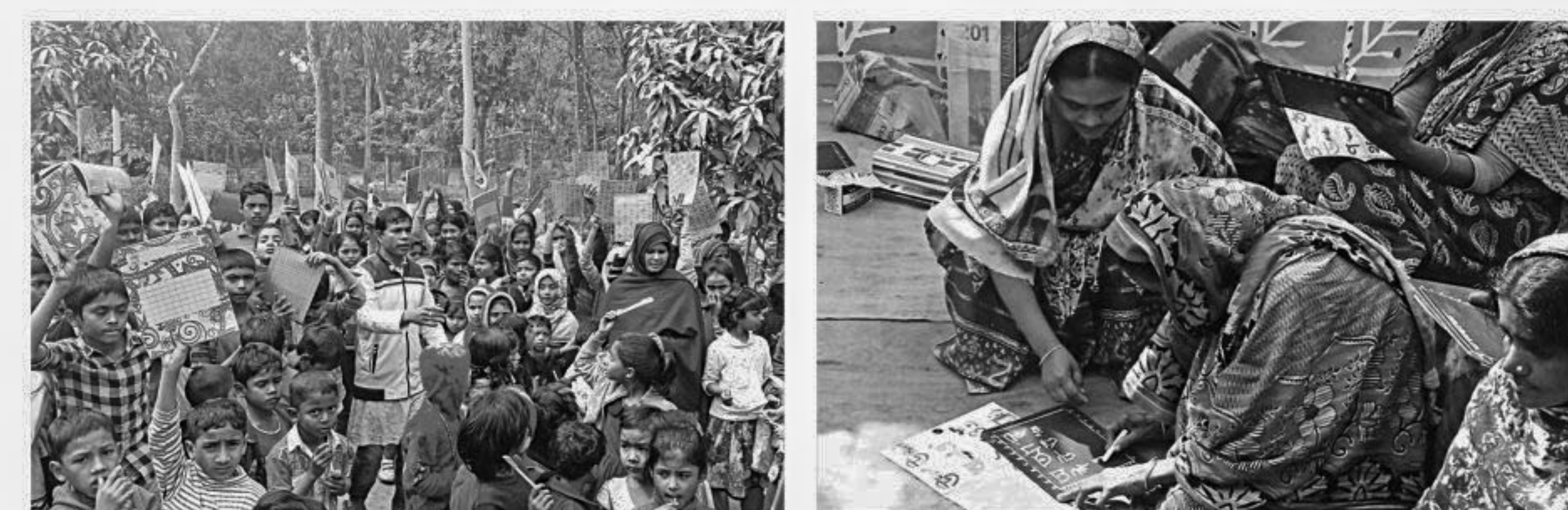
Of the injured, 10 were admitted to Habiganj Sadar Hospital and 15 to Lakhai Upazila Health Complex while the rest given first aid.

Police and locals said there was a longstanding conflict between Abu Mia and Kislul Mia of the village over the land.

When Abu Mia and his men were working on the land around 10:30am yesterday, the supporters of Kislul attacked them, triggering a clash. Over 50 people from both sides were injured during the incident.

On information, police rushed to the spot and fired teargas shells to bring the situation under control.

Additional police personnel have been deployed in the area to avert any further trouble, said Emran Hossain, officer in charge of Lakhai Police Station.

A couple dedicated to education

Trucker's assistant, his wife work for kids' dropout prevention and adult literacy

Otherwise an ordinary couple, Faruk Hossain and Sabera Akter have been doing a laudable job, working to prevent dropout at schools and to provide literacy to elderly people for the last 10 years.

Faruk Hossain, hailing from Kashimpur (Malipukur) village under Dinajpur Sadar upazila, received "Best Social Worker" award under 'Education Enthusiast' category, from Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on March 13, for his role in preventing dropout of primary school children.

Faruk distributes education materials including notebooks, pen and pencils among the students while his wife Sabera Akter teaches elderly people at her home.

Faruk, who studied up to Class VIII, got a job as assistant of a truck driver at Bangladesh Agriculture Development Corporation (BADC) in 2017, after the death of his father, who was a driver of

the government-run organisation.

He is now posted in Rangpur.

Due to family hardship, Faruk dropped out of school in 2002 when he was a student of Class VIII and took job at a jute bag shop in Dinajpur town.

"In 2007, I started distributing learning materials among underprivileged school students at different places of Dinajpur and other districts so that the poor children don't have to face dropout like me," said Faruk while talking to this correspondent a few days ago.

"I spend one-fourth of my earning to encourage poor children to continue schooling," he said.

His wife Sabera Akter runs an informal school at their home, where elderly people, both male and female, are taught basic literacy.

"The class starts at 2:30pm and continues till evening every day. Now 40 people are attending my school," said Sabera.

"The school of Sabera gave me the opportunity to learn how to read and

write at this age. She gives lessons and provides books and other learning materials for free," said 65-year-old Aklima, a resident of the village.

Sabera, who passed HSC after her marriage, is now doing Bachelor of Agricultural Education under Bangladesh Open University.

"During school hours in April, 2017, Faruk came to this school and distributed 110 notebooks among the students. He again distributed notebooks at the school in 2018," said Jalal Uddin, headmaster of Kashimpur Government Primary School in Dinajpur Sadar upazila.

Md Minhaz Reza Shuvo, a Class V student of the school, said he got notebooks from Faruk twice.

"I have so far visited around 200 schools and gave learning materials to poor students, after need assessment by the headmasters and other teachers. My efforts to prevent dropout of students will continue," said Faruk.
