As per the rules, the educational institutions first come under MPO facilities and then the government enlists the teachers in the payroll.

in Dhaka, demanding enlistment under the government's Monthly Pay Order scheme.

According to leaders of the federation, the number of non-MPO educational institutions is 5,242, where around 80,000 teachers are working without any pay, some for more than a decade.

This is because the institutions do not have the ability to pay the teachers while the government stopped bringing these institutions under its payroll for, what they said, a fund crunch.

After a suspension of six years by the then BNP-led alliance government, the Awami League-led government revived the MPO facility in 2010 as per its electoral pledge, enlisting 1,624 private secondary and higher secondary schools and colleges in the MPO scheme.

The rest of the non-MPO teachers have been organising various protest programmes since then.

Currently, more than four lakh teachers and employees of over 26,340 secondary schools, colleges, madrasas and technical institutes are receiving MPO facilities.

Over 35cr free textbooks distributed this year

In March 2018, the centre published report on mass killings, mass graves, mass graveyards and torture centres in 10 districts -- Nilphamari, Bogura, Natore, Kurigram, Pabna, Rajshahi, Satkhira, Narayanganj, Bhola and Khulna. They found 1,749 incidents of mass killings in those districts. This year, they published report on Gaibandha,

Jamalpur, Narail, Panchagar, Moulvibazar, Jashore, Lalmonirhat, Brahmanbaria, Cox's Bazar and Barishal where 4,180 incidents of and information on mass killings, mass graves, mass graveyards and torture centres are found.

"There is politics behind mass killings. In 1971, Pakistan did it to suppress us and turn us into their colony permanently," he said.

The noted historian said the governments, after the murder of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in 1975, attempted to erase the incidents of mass killings from his-

Muntassir said they will gradually incorporate all locations of 64 districts on the map.

"If we can publish it on Google, more people will know the truth about Bangladesh. We need more financial support for that," he said, seeking support from the government.

State Minister for Cultural Affairs KM Khalid termed it a good initiative and said they will continue their support to the Centre.
