HOENESS REVEALS **PEP'S TECHNIQUE**

There is no doubt that the likes of Manchester City and PSG have incredible wealth behind them. But rarely is there a light shone on the injections of cash they receive for the world's best players. Uli Hoeness, the president of Bayern Munich, has pulled the curtain back on the world of these huge transfers, however, and outlines Pep Guardiola's dealings with the Sheikh of Abu Dhabi in a rather tongue-in-cheek manner. "My friend Pep told me what happens when he wants a player that costs more than €100 million," Hoeness said at a financial conference in Munich recently. "He puts some videos together of the player and goes to see the Sheikh. Once he is there, there is an opulent feast put on during which he teaches the videos to him and the money is transferred. The next day, the Sheikh raises the price of oil a little bit and recovers the money."

The five-man defence also gave Zico enough support while the woodwork came to Bangladesh's rescue once early in the second half. Bangladesh, buoyed by raucous expatriate support, had a few

attacking moves of their own too, but those moves -- in the form of either corner kicks or throw-ins -- failed to trouble the opposition goalkeeper. "I'm really pleased with the effort and the work rate. The boys

put in a fantastic shift," Bangladesh coach Day said in his postmatch press briefing. "Bahrain had the quality in the areas that mattered and we didn't. They created the better chances, while we lacked that bit of

quality to make it count when we had our chances," the coach opined. Meanwhile, group favourites Palestine thrashed Sri Lanka 9-0

in the opening fixture of the group earlier in the day. Bangladesh will play against Palestine in their second match

on Sunday.

Hazard lifts Belgium

Depay triggers Dutch rout of Belarus

Eden Hazard ensured Belgium kicked off their qualifying campaign for Euro 2020 in style on Thursday

with a brace in a home victory over Russia, while a Memphis Depayinspired Netherlands romped to a 4-0 win over Belarus.


World Cup semifinalists Belgium earned a battling 3-1 win over Russia in Brussels as Hazard struck twice for Roberto Martinez's side in their opening game in Group I.

Youri Tielemans rounded off a flowing move with a crisp low strike to fire Belgium ahead on 14 minutes at the King Baudouin Stadium, but Thibaut Courtois gifted Russia an immediate equaliser.

The Real Madrid goalkeeper, put under pressure by Artem Dzyuba, panicked and scuffed the ball straight to Denis Cheryshev who duly swept home into an empty net.

Michy Batshuayi had a shot cleared off the line, and later hit the post, but Hazard restored Belgium's lead just before half-time after drawing a foul from Yuri Zhirkov in the area.

The Chelsea playmaker sealed the three points two minutes from time with an alert finish, while Aleksandr Golovin was sent off for Russia just before the end.

magnificent season as he came off the bench to grab the only goal in a 1-0 win for Poland away to Austria in Group G. The AC Milan forward, already

with 19 goals in 27 Serie A appearances this term, has now scored twice in three outings for his country following his international debut in September.

"This was a first step in qualifying. It was a very important game and a very important win. We took three points and so we're very happy," said Poland striker Robert Lewandowski.

World Cup runners-up Croatia, relegated from the top tier of the Nations League last year, ground out an unconvincing 2-1 victory against Azerbaijan in Zagreb.

Rami Sheydaev put Azerbaijan on top on 19 minutes before Croatia hit back through Borna Barisic and a 79th-minute effort by Andrej Kramaric in Group E.

Slovakia top the section on goal difference following a 2-0 defeat of Hungary in Trnava, as Ondrej Duda and Albert Rusnak scored for the hosts.

Quagliarella back from the cold

At 36, Fabio Quagliarella has put his years of torment at the hands of a stalker behind him as he prepares to line up for Italy over eight years after his last cap thanks to the best season of his career in Serie A, where he is the top scorer ahead of Cristiano Ronaldo.

Even if Roberto Mancini is focusing on youth as he rebuilds the Azzurri after their failure to qualify for last year's World Cup, the Italy coach could not ignore Quagliarella's remarkable performance with Sampdoria where he has scored 21 goals in 28 games, two more than Ronaldo and Polish sensation Krzysztof Piatek.

The veteran could earn his 26th cap -- eight and a half years after his last -- in Italy's Euro 2020 Group J qualifiers against Finland on March 23 in Udine or Liechtenstein in Parma three days later.

"I may be the oldest of the group, but I'm living everything with great enthusiasm and serenity," Quagliarella told Rai Sport on Thursday. "I'm now at an age where you also know how to manage emotions.

"This is the Italian national team, there's no need to give caps away. If the coach calls up certain players, it's because he's convinced they can give a big hand and that's why I'm here," he said. "Being called up by the Azzurri is a great source of satisfaction. There are so many strong young players with great personalities and for me it's nice to be here, even if I'm playing it by ear.

Former Manchester City boss Mancini had already invited the Sampdoria striker to take part in a training camp in February. Before that the last time he had been at the national team's training centre at Coverciano was in 2015 under Antonio Conte.

"I know that at my age, things can change from one day to the next, but the national team has always been a goal, and being in the midst of all these young people gives energy,' said Quagliarella.
