418 children murdered last year

Report finds significant increase in violence against children

Violence against children and the level of brutality, especially against girls, have increased significantly in recent years, worsening the state of child rights in the country, finds a non-government report.

In 2018, at least 418 children were murdered across the country, which is 23 percent higher than the previous year [around 339 murders in 2017], said the report.

Over 571 children of different ages were raped last year, while 812 were assaulted physically and sexually, it added.

Child Rights Advocacy Coalition in Bangladesh, a platform of 10 nongovernmental organisations, prepared the report based on published

The findings were unveiled yesterday at a press briefing held at Dhaka Reporters' Unity.

According to the report, most working children face both physical and verbal abuse at work. Besides, more than 55 percent and 49 percent children face physical punishment at home and educational institution respectively.

The report also found that incidents of children dying by suicide

and the number of their deaths in road accidents have increased National Human Rights remarkably.

the briefing identified dilly-dallying in ensuring justice, absence of a designated government institution for protection of child rights, and lack of public awareness as major reasons behind the worsening situation.

They suggested that the government form a separate department and commission for children, ensure speedy trial through establishing an individual tribunal and enforce ban on physical punishment at educational institutions.

Kazi Reazul Hoque, chairman of Commission, said children face Reviewing the findings, speakers at violence almost everywhere. They face physical punishment at school often, although it has been prohibited by the High Court.

"We are yet to have the mindset that we should remain sensitive towards women and children. It has to change," he said.

Abu Taleb, a joint secretary of Ministry of Women and Children Affairs; Shahnaz Rahman, an adviser of Plan International Bangladesh; and Abdullah Al Mamun, a director of Save the Children, also spoke.

CUMILLA MURDER CASE

Khaleda's bail stayed till April 7

The Supreme Court yesterday stayed a High Court order that granted six-month interim bail to BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia in the Cumilla murder case till April 7.

The case was filed on the charge of killing eight people and injuring 25-26 by torching a bus in Cumilla's Chouddagram during anti-government agitations by the BNP-led alliance on February 2, 2015.

Yesterday, Chamber Judge of the Appellate Division of the SC Justice Md Nuruzzaman passed the order following a leave to appeal petition filed by the government, challeng-

ing the HC order of bail. The apex court chamber judge also sent the petition to its full bench and set April 7 for further hearing of the same petition, Deputy Attorney General Dr Md Bashir Ullah told

The Daily Star. He also said Khaleda Zia cannot be released from jail following the SC chamber judge's order.

Attorney General Mahbubey Alam argued for the government while Advocate AJ Mohammad Ali, Barrister AM Mahbub Uddin Khokon and Barrister Kayser Kamal appeared for Khaleda Zia.

Following a bail petition filed by Khaleda, the HC on March 6 granted the six-month interim bail to her in the Cumilla murder case.

Switzerland-Bangladesh political consultations start tomorrow

The fourth edition of biennial bilateral political consultations between the foreign ministries of Switzerland and Bangladesh will be held in Dhaka tomorrow.

Stocktaking and further strengthening of bilateral relations in the areas of economy, development cooperation and humanitarian aid will get top priority during the discussions, said a press release from the Swiss Embassy yesterday.

Both countries will discuss a wide range of multilateral, regional and global topics of mutual interest during the consultations.

The Swiss delegation arrived in Dhaka yesterday for the four-day visit.

Ambassador Raphael Nägeli, assistant state secretary for Asia-Pacific of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs of Switzerland, and Ambassador Kamrul Ahsan, secretary (bilateral and consular) to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Bangladesh, will lead the respective delegations, added the press release.

The Swiss delegation, which also includes Ambassador Thomas Gass, assistant director general of Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation, will travel to Rohingya refugee camps in Cox's Bazar to obtain a first-hand experi-

ence on the ongoing humanitarian crisis. Ambassador Nägeli and the Swiss delegation will meet representatives of the civil society, business leaders, diplomatic community, international organisations and INGOs during their visit.

97pc Ctg high-rises at fire risk

Fire dept's 2018 survey raises alarm

Around 97 percent high-rise buildings in Chattogram city lack adequate fire safety measures, posing a serious risk of casualties in case of fire, reveals a survey conducted by the Fire Service and Civil Defence. The 2018 survey further revealed that 93

percent high-rises did not even take "no objection certificates" (NOC) from the fire service, said its officials. Only seven percent owners took NOCs

from the fire department and of those, three percent implemented fire safety measures, they added.

The buildings include commercial and residential establishments.

Reaz Uddin Bazar, Tamakumandi Lane Market, Jahur Hawkers' Market, Teri Bazar and Central Plaza, among others, were found "very risky", said Jasim Uddin, assistant director of Fire Service and Civil Defence, Chattogram.

None of them have sufficient fire safety equipment, including fire extinguishers.

According to Bangladesh National Building Code (BNBC) 2006 and Fire prevention Act 2003, a market will have to keep sufficient fire extinguishers (an extinguisher for every 550 square feet) and sufficient staircases.

A market should have sufficient reserve water, a diesel pump, an electrical pump and a jockey pump, arrangement for emergency lighting, smoke and heat detector, fire alarm system and sprinkler. Also, it must have fire safety and evacuation plan, and emergency exists with smoke-proof stairwells.

"We have divided the city into eight zones to conduct the survey and came up with the findings," Jasim Uddin said. During a recent visit to Jahur Hawkers'

Market and Tamakumandi Lane Market, this correspondent saw that the alleys were too narrow for fire fighting vehicles to enter in case of an emergency. Asked, Fazlul Amin, organising secretary

of Jahur Hawkers' Market Traders' Association, said they have received a notice from the fire service, and will hold an emergency meeting soon to discuss the matter. Contacted, Ahmed Kabir Dulal, general

secretary of Tamakumandi Lane Banik Samiti, said there are 110 markets in Tamakumandi Lane with over 40,000 shops. "The market buildings were constructed

without keeping enough space," he said.

"Now it has become difficult for us to implement fire safety measures in this vast area."

Asked, Abdul Kaium Chowdhury, vice president of Real Estate and Housing Association of Bangladesh, claimed that 80 percent of their members had complied with fire safety rules.

"The owners of most high-rises, who have been violating safety rules, are not our members," he said, adding that it is the duty of the fire department to monitor fire safety measures at the buildings.

A total of 663 fire incidents occurred in Chattogram in 2017 while the number was 577 in 2018, said assistant director of fire service.

As per Fire Prevention Act 2003, designs

Islam Khan, chief town planner of Chattogram Development Authority, evaded the question. He, however, told The Daily Star that when they approve design of any building

over six-storey, they impose a condition to receive NOC from the fire service. "It is the responsibility of fire service officials to inspect whether under-

construction buildings have provisions of fire safety," he said. According to Fire Prevention Rules 2014, if the number of residents remains between 50 and 500, there should be two emergency

staircases in the building; if the number

remains between 500 and 1,000, there should be three emergency staircases and if the number exceeds 1,000, there must be four emergency staircases. There is also a provision of three years'

imprisonment for violating the rules, said Abdul Mannan, deputy director of Fire Service and Civil Defence, Chattogram. Asked, whether anyone was jailed or

fined for violating the law, Mannan said they had issued notices to owners in this regard. "We also try to motivate them to install fire safety equipment," he said.
