Klopp says after last-gasp Liverpool climb back to top

Jurgen Klopp admitted he Premier couldn't care less that League Liverpool's dramatic 2-1 win against Tottenham was an "ugly" way to return to the top of the

Premier League. Klopp's side took the lead through Roberto Firmino's first half opener, only to be pegged back

by Lucas Moura's equaliser after the interval. Tottenham dominated but wasted several chances before Liverpool stole the points in

stoppage-time. Mohamed Salah's header was spilled by Tottenham goalkeeper Hugo Lloris before

rebounding off Toby Alderweireld for an own goal. It was a lucky break that Liverpool arguably didn't deserve, but Reds boss Klopp wasn't com-

plaining about a result that took them two points clear of second placed Manchester City. "In the first half we had fantastic chances and

scored a wonderful goal. In the second half we

looked heavy and couldn't really play," Klopp said.

"Tottenham changed a little bit. We didn't adapt well. I was not happy we conceded, but

after Spurs' goal we started playing again more. "We can play better football but in the first half we had a lot of good moments. In the second not that many but we scored -- 2-1, brilliant!

"I saw the header and nothing else. I had no clue how the ball went in.

"It is only positive. I said there are 500 ways to win a football game and today was slightly ugly. Who cares?"

Liverpool's crucial win keeps the pressure on City, but the champions can return to the top if they beat struggling Cardiff at home on Wednesday.

That would leave City one point clear of Liverpool, with both sides having six games remaining after the Cardiff match.

Klopp, trying to Liverpool to their first English title since 1990, acknowledged the race is likely to go down to the wire as City show no signs of surrendering the trophy easily

"We compete with the best team in the world

[Manchester City] and play against one of best in the world in Tottenham -- it is a tough task. It is all good," he said.

"City last year were champions and are still pretty good. We have to fight like crazy. The crowd was outstanding. They were really here to push us and at the end it helped.

"I am really happy we don't have any breaks now. We compete with the best team in world for one position and that is really hard."

Tottenham's defeat left their top four bid in peril after a fourth loss in five games.

"We were a little bit unlucky to concede the second goal when we should have been ahead because we dominated Liverpool, who are a very good team," Tottenham boss Mauricio Pochettino said. "No one wants to lose but it's a different defeat than the ones we suffered against Southampton or Burnley."

Tottenham could drop to fourth if Arsenal beat Newcastle on Monday, but Pochettino is still confident they will qualify for the Champions League.

Federer cruises to 101st career title



Roger Federer lifted the 101st title of his remarkable career on Sunday, beating ATP Miami Open defending champion John Isner 6-1, 6-4 in just 63 minutes.

Federer has been the form player in South Florida and his performance against bigserving Isner proved it as the 33-year-old home-nation hero was overwhelmed by the Swiss star's incredible consistency.

An opening break sapped Isner's confidence and allowed 37-year-old Federer to gain control of a match which he never looked like losing, especially after Isner was injured near the end of the second set. "Getting a break so early was like a dream

Napoli ripped AS Roma's defence to shreds as they handed the hosts an embarrassing 4-1 defeat at the Stadio Olimpico in Serie A on Sunday and piled on the problems for coach Claudio Ranieri.

Arkadiusz Milik put Napoli ahead after two minutes, cleverly controlling Simone Verdi's chipped pass with his heel and then swiveling to fire past Robin Olsen.

Having dominated the first half, Napoli were pegged back in stoppage time when Patrik Schick was fouled by goalkeeper Alex Meret and Diego Perotti slotted home the penalty. Yet Roma were left reeling by two quick goals after the break.

Jose Callejon's low cross slipped under Olsen's hand to leave Dries Mertens with a tapin at the far post in the 50th minute, then Fabian Ruiz burst down the left and set up Verdi for the third five minutes later.

Substitute Amin Younes added the fourth as secondplaced Napoli stayed 15 points behind runaway leaders Juventus while Roma dropped to sixth with 47 points.

"We deserved the win and it's just a pity we didn't score more goals in the first half too," Mertens told Sky Sport Italia. "It was a step forward and we are continuing to develop as a team. I am certainly happy to have found the net and hope to carry on like this. The season isn't over yet and we'll see what happens."
