

MOHIUDDIN MURDER
Four arrestees sent to jail

A Chattogram court yesterday sent four persons to jail in connection with former BCL leader Mohiuddin Sohel murder case. A metropolitan magistrate passed the order after police produced them before the court, said AC (Prosecution) Kazi Shahabuddin of Chattogram Metropolitan Police (CMP). So far, 18 persons, including a local Jatiya Party leader, have been arrested in connection with the case, said CMP's Assistant Commissioner of Double Mooring zone Ashikur Rahman. Police arrested Md Ramjan Ali Kiron, 30; Md Iqbal, 21; Md Lalon, 50; and his son Md Shakil Khan Shamim, 19; from Pahartali Bazar area in the

SUNDAY'S NOR'WESTER
Body recovered from Meghna

Death toll from Sunday's storm has risen to seven, as the body of a female Ansar member was recovered from the Meghna river yesterday. A nor'wester lashed Dhaka and some other districts across the country on Sunday evening, with wind speed of 74km per hour. The nor'wester began around 6:22pm and lasted over a minute, according to the Met office. Of six recovered bodies on Sunday, four died in Dhaka city. A team of Coast Guard recovered the body of female Ansar member Rita Aktar, 35, yesterday morning from Meghna near Ismanirchar area in Munshiganj, reports our correspondent in the district. A trawler carrying 19 persons, who were returning to Sonargaon of Narayanganj from Char Hogla area after election duty, capsized in the river near Char Hogla during the storm. The body was later taken to Coast Guard's Gazaria office. Station Commander Sub Lt MM Atiq said they informed Sonargaon upazila administration about the recovery. He said Coast Guard men were searching for two other missing persons -- presiding officer Borhan Uddin, 38, an official of UCB Bank; and Narayanganj Traffic Police's assistant town sub-inspector Md Selim, 40.

700 communist outlaws to surrender in Pabna

Around 700 outlaws from 15 districts of four divisions are set to surrender to police in Pabna on April 9, police officials in Rajshahi said yesterday. Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan is scheduled to attend the event to be held at Pabna's Shaheed Aminuddin Stadium where the outlaws will surrender, said Nisharul Arif, additional DIG of Rajshahi Range Police. He said many of them would turn in their firearms during the surrender in the presence of top-level police officials, including IGP Mohammad Javed Patwary. The surrendering outlaws belong to Purbo Banglar Communist Party (PBCP), Purbo Banglar Sorbohara Party (PBSP) and New Biplobi Communist Party (NBSP). They are from Rajshahi, Natore, Naogaon, Bogura, Joypurhat, Pabna and Sirajganj districts under Rajshahi division; Rangpur under Rangpur division; Tangail, Rajbari and Faridpur under Dhaka division; and Khulna, Satkhira, Jashore and Narail under Khulna division. A wing of the home ministry is organising the event, a senior police official seeking anonymity said, adding that the outlaws would

surrender on their own amid tight security. A police official in Rajshahi said the surrender would help them in maintaining law and order, as law enforcers had to dedicate substantial time to investigate their activities in the past. Among the listed outlaws, at least 41 are going to surrender from Bagmara upazila of Rajshahi. They include former PBCP regional commander Abdur Razzak alias Art Babu, who was accused in the case for murdering Chanchal Kumar Chondo, 42, vice president of Taherpur municipality unit of Jubo League, in December last year. The communist outlaws were inspired by the Indian Naxalite movement, but in the 1980s, they began killing politicians and businessmen for extortion, in the name of eliminating "class enemy". In 2004, when law enforcers failed to contain them and the outlaws went on killing people in Rajshahi region, Islamist outlaws took the opportunity and surfaced. Vowing to eliminate the communist outlaws, the banned militant outfit Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh first emerged in Rajshahi's Bagmara on April 1 that year and killed 22 people in one and a half months.

ADS ON FOREIGN CHANNELS
Info ministry show-causes 2 cable operators

The Information Ministry yesterday issued show cause notices to two cable operators for airing Bangladeshi advertisements in foreign channels. They are: Nationwide Media Limited and Jadu Vision Limited, said a press release. It said they are violating subsection-19 (13) of Cable Television Network Act, 2006 by airing advertisements of local product on foreign channels. Earlier, the ministry issued several notices urging all cable operators of the country to stop airing Bangladeshi advertisements in foreign channels from April 1. Besides, a platform of electronic media called for stopping the "illegal usage" of the downlink -- the transmission of a signal from a satellite to a receiving station. This practice has been affecting sustainability of Bangladeshi private channels and the media industry, they said. It has been hampering revenue of private channels of Bangladesh, the platform added.

Ctg Wasa to install another 200 fire hydrants

Chattogram Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (CWasa) is going to install 200 fire hydrants at different points in the city in addition to 30 already in place, in order to facilitate water supply during fire emergencies. The first set of fire hydrants have been set up early this year at different important points including Pahartali, Agrabad, Chowmuhuni and Patenga in the city, under a project titled 'Ctg Water Supply Improvement & Sanitation Project' financed by World Bank, the first such initiative in the country. CWasa sources said they would set up 200 more hydrants under phase-2 of Karnaphuli Water Supply Project (KWSP), financed by Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). The hydrants will be planted at different Karnaphuli Service Areas including Barek Building, Agrabad, New Market, Patharghata, Halishahar, Garibullah Shah, Lalkhan Bazar, Textile Intersection, Aturar Depot, Khatiber Haat and Arakan Byline. A letter mentioning the selected places was sent to the officials of Fire Service and Civil Defence department for recommendation, said Maksud

Alam, superintending engineer of the project, adding that the new hydrants would be implanted as soon as the notification from the fire department is received. "In recent times, we have seen several incidents of fire emergencies where water was unavailable during rescue operations. If adequate number of hydrants can be planted in major cities, such crises will not occur," said the engineer.

Robbed of a dream

Case filed against BCL men for barring candidate from attending teacher recruitment viva at CU

He dreamt of being a university teacher one day, and worked hard towards it. He secured the highest CGPA in his honours and masters exams, and published three research papers in international journals last year. Md Amdadul Haque was on the verge of realising his dreams when he set foot at Chittagong University -- his alma mater -- on March 27, ready to face the viva voce for the recruitment of lecturers at the zoology department. Little did he know that he would be robbed of a lifelong aspiration. Amdadul, a prime minister's gold medalist for his academic achievements, filed a case on Sunday with a Chattogram court, accusing seven activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League of criminal intimidation, kidnap, wrongful confinement, theft and attempt to murder. Taking the case into the cognizance, the court ordered Police Bureau of Investigation (PBI) to investigate and submit a report by April 30. Talking to The Daily Star yesterday, Amdadul said he went to the Registrar

Building at around 9am on March 27. "When I was waiting to enter the lift, former Assistant Secretary of BCL CU unit Sharif Uddin, and BCL activists Anowar Hossain, Asif Mahmud Shuvo, Moksed Ali alias Nilu Pramanik, Jahidul Hasan, Rafiqul Islam and Asir Uddin kidnapped me and took me to CU Central Field area," he said. "They demanded extortion from me." "As I did not comply with their demand, they beat me up. Later, they took me to CU Pagoda and beat me up again," he said, adding that they also took away his cell phones and Tk 5,000. "I always dreamed of becoming a university teacher. That is why I worked hard to do well in exams, and focused on research and publications to build my portfolio," Amdadul said. The BCL men allegedly confined him for around three hours till noon, and later handed him over to Hathazari Police Station, branding him as an Islamist Chhatra Shibir activist. Police released him in the afternoon as they did not get any proof of such allegations, but by then his viva was long over.

RCC to control auto-rickshaw movement to ease traffic

Rajshahi City Corporation (RCC) has decided to control movement of battery driven auto-rickshaws to ease the city's growing traffic. The auto-rickshaws will be divided into two colours and would move on the city streets in rotations. Both sets will be on the roads together at specified times and on Fridays. The decisions were taken at a joint meeting in Rajshahi Nagar Bhaban on Sunday. They will take effect from July 1, Rajshahi Mayor AHM Khairuzzaman Liton said yesterday. The auto-rickshaw owners and drivers sat with the corporation officials and agreed to follow the new policies.

Another nilgai found in Naogaon
Suspicion of smuggling arises

Locals yesterday found a third Nilgai, the largest antelope in Asia that was earlier believed to be extinct in the country, at Nimoi union of Naogaon's Patnitola upazila in a span of seven months -- making allegations of its "smuggling" rife. In the afternoon, wildlife conservation division of the forest department in Rajshahi assisted by the local administration rescued the nilgai and sent it to Ramsagar National Park in Dinajpur, Jahangir Kabir, an inspector of the division, said. In September last year, local administration rescued a female Nilgai from Thakurgaon's Ranisankoil upazila and in January, locals found a male nilgai at Jotbazar village of Naogaon's Manda upazila. The two nilgais were taken to Ramsagar National Park in Dinajpur for breeding, but the female died last month. "The newly found nilgai is a male and its skin colour is bluish grey," Kabir said, adding that they gave it medical attention before sending it to Dinajpur where the other nilgai is staying. Locals noticed the nilgai wandering in a mango orchard near Nimoi Union Parishad at around 7am and informed the Parishad chairman. The chairman then kept it on the premises. "It was terrified, witnessing the presence of a lot of people," UP Chairman Abul Kalam Azad said. "Locals found it wandering around," said Patnitola UNO Shariful Islam. He said no one has made any allegation of smuggling. The number of nilgais is increasing in India's Bihar,



forcing the authorities there to cull them often, said Zillur Rahman, Rajshahi divisional forest officer. "It might have fled to Naogaon," he said. But UP Chairman Azad suspected smuggling. "I suspect the animal escaped while being smuggled into the country," Azad said, adding that the Indian border is barely two kilometres away and is fenced with barbed wire, leaving no scope for the animal to enter into Bangladesh on its own. On January 22, a male nilgai jumped off a truck while being carried along with cattle and locals caught it at Jotbazar village of Naogaon's Manda upazila.
